The Bash agenda was emailed to registrants a few days before the event so participants could pick and choose segments of interest or they could settle in for a full day of viewing. NCM staff displayed a complete team effort and really stepped up to make the best of the situation.

When you are traveling to unfamiliar areas of this country, have you ever wished that you had a local contact who could provide information on such things as hotels, restaurants and attractions. Well, look no further than the NCM's website and check out the NCM Ambassador database. The database contains a list of all Corvette clubs across the country which have NCM Ambassadors. Information is included for the club and contact information for each Ambassador is given. The other very interesting display is the original entombed 1954 Corvette. It is displayed in a nearly authentic manner as the car was stored for 27 years. Country music artist Brad Paisley picked up his new Long Beach Red C8 at the NCM on June 29<sup>th</sup>. This was his first experience with the Museum delivery option. # RECIPE(S) OF THE MONTH!

## Pizza Sauce & Crust-less Pizza



Lucky you! This month you get a 2-fer here in Recipe Land: pizza sauce, and crust-less pizza. Each can stand on its own – you can use the pizza sauce on a “normal” pizza, and you can make a crust-less pizza with store-bought sauce. But the truth is, they are each so easy and so quick to make, they deserve to be together!

Bonus – when your gluten-free friend drops in, you have an easy option in your recipe file! Now, let’s get our *Pizza* on!



### Pizza Sauce

#### Ingredients:

- 14.5 oz canned diced tomatoes undrained
- 6 oz canned tomato paste
- 1 Tablespoon olive oil
- 2 teaspoons granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons dried basil
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 teaspoon finely ground sea salt
- ¾ teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes optional
- 2 Tablespoons sugar

#### Directions:

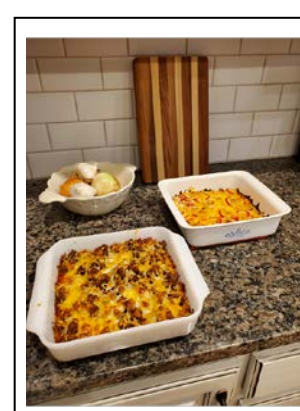
- Combine all ingredients in food processor or blender.
- Pulse 15 times or until mixture is smooth.
- Use immediately or store in an airtight container to use later.



### Crust-less Pizza

#### Directions:

- Use any oven-safe pan or dish of your choice. I use 8” glass pans.
- Build your pizza, putting sauce on the bottom – it will not stick or allow your ingredients to stick.
- Once you have all your favorite toppings and cheese on, bake at 425 for 12-15 minutes, depending on the thickness of your pizza.
- Enjoy directly from the pan! It is not sliceable or scoopable, so get a hot pad and a fork and enjoy!
