### **Killington/Pico new bulk ticket procedure**

- New this season, clubs will order vouchers as usual, however they will not be Direct to Lift vouchers.
- Club members will purchase Killington or Pico vouchers through the CSC to be redeemed at a ticket window.
- The first time skiing or boarding, the member will be required to purchase a One Pass Card for \$5.00.
- This card is a one-time purchase per individual member and must be presented at the ticket window with a voucher, CSC sticker and photo ID each time the member skis/boards at Killington or Pico.
- The One Pass Card will be validated for one day of skiing or boarding at the mountain.
- At the end of the season, clubs will return unused vouchers for acceptable credit for next season and should keep the One Pass Card for use next season, as before.
- COST: Killington Adult \$70, Youth \$54 / Pico Adult \$42, Youth \$35

### **Sugarbush bulk ticket procedure**

- As in the past clubs will order Sugarbush vouchers through the CSC which may be redeemed by the member at the ticket window by presenting CSC member club card and a photo ID.
- The first time member uses his Sugarbush vouchers, a Sugarbush Xpress Card must be purchased at the ticket window for \$5.
- The voucher will be exchanged for a RFID card – the Sugar Xpress Card. It should be placed in a ski coat pocket and will be scanned before getting on the lift for a day of skiing or boarding.
- Member should keep the Sugar Xpress Card; it will be validated the each time the member visits Sugarbush following the instructions noted above.
- The process remains the same throughout the season. Present the Sugarbush voucher at the ticket window with CSC member card and photo ID and the Sugarbush Xpress Card will be validated for another day of skiing or boarding.
- The Sugar Xpress Card may be presented at a ticket window on Awareness Days to purchase ticket and validation of the RFID card for a day of skiing/boarding. Be sure to present the CSC member sticker and photo ID at the time of purchase.

## **Bromley program remains the same**

- Minimum order of 1,000 by CSC. (a combination of adult and youth vouchers).
- COST: \$57 Adult, Youth \$46

## **Stratton program remains the same**

- COST: \$63 Adult 18+, \$52 Young Adult 17-(and under)

## **Mount Snow bulk tickets procedure**

- Mount Snow has changed their bulk ticket sales method for 2018-2019. The CSC will no longer be able to buy bulk tickets/vouchers in advance as a group, as in the past. All lift tickets will be purchased by individuals on line through the Mount Snow website – details are attached.
- The ONLY tickets CSC will purchase through the “old” method will be the re-ordering of vouchers returned for credit last season. Individuals will order vouchers against their credit through their club ticket coordinator just as they did in the past. For each ticket ordered against the credit, individuals must pay \$2.00 due to the increase in ticket pricing from last season to this coming season. These tickets are non-refundable and cannot be returned for credit. Member will pay the club coordinator of at the time purchase and club will in turn pay the council at the same time orders will be placed with other resorts (Okemo, Sugarbush, Stratton, etc.)
- COST: \$68

Please note:

- Bulk tickets cannot be used at the OnSnow Winter Carnival. Special prices will be in effect for the OnSnow weekend.
- The new process does not affect the Awareness Days program. It will be the same as last season.
- Mount Snow will offer the Everyday Benefit Online Program again this season. Refer to their website for details.
