

2018 CSDEA Year-End Eventing Awards

***NOTE TO COMPETITORS:** Please review your Division carefully.

For All Divisions

- Sign the horse up once for the applicable general eventing award (Eventing Award – Senior Rider or Eventing Award – Junior Rider) using the online awards registration system at www.csdea.org, pay the flat rate fee of \$25, and then you are eligible for all the eventing awards for which you qualify. Owner and rider are responsible for reading, understanding, and adhering to the Year-End Awards rules.
- Points are earned only after all membership, registration, and financial requirements are met. Registration of horse and/or rider must be made by the owner or rider at www.csdea.org.
- Rider and owner must be CSDEA members in good standing. If horse is leased under a signed lease agreement, lessee is considered owner for purposes of showing.
- Eligibility for the Junior division is as defined by USEA rules: Open to competitors through the end of the calendar year of their 18th birthday.
- The horse must complete cross-country to be eligible for awards at that level. Only completing a combined test will not make you eligible for an award.
- All USEA recognized shows within the CSDEA geographical area of Minnesota and surrounding states (Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Wisconsin) count toward year-end awards. Points are awarded according to either the Point Scoring or Point Handicapping system, as noted for each particular award.
- CSDEA affiliated shows count for double points toward year-end awards (i.e. take the final result from the Point Scoring or Point Handicapping system as appropriate, then multiply it by 2). To be CSDEA affiliated, a show must be a USEA recognized show within the CSDEA geographical area of Minnesota and surrounding states (Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Wisconsin), and the show organizer must pay the CSDEA affiliation fee of \$50 no later than 60 days prior to the show date. Refer to the annual Omnibus or www.csdea.org for a list of CSDEA affiliated shows.
- Championship classes do not count toward year-end awards.
- All horses are required to have USEA horse ID numbers. All USEA horse ID numbers must be reported during the awards registration process at www.csdea.org.
- The award year runs from November 1 to October 31.

High Point Horse Award

- Awards are given in the following divisions:
 - Junior Beginner Novice
 - Senior Beginner Novice
 - Junior Novice
 - Senior Novice
 - Junior Training
 - Senior Training
 - Preliminary
 - Intermediate
 - Advanced
- The horse must be registered, the rider need not be.
- Points are earned according to the Point Scoring System outlined below.

Special Awards

- There is no additional fee for special awards, but unless otherwise noted award registrations must be completed on the website.
- Horse and rider must be named.
- If applicable, proof of qualification must be submitted upon registration for the award. **Send proof to Heather Salden at sly_h_s@yahoo.com.**
- Only points earned AFTER registration has been made will be recorded for each award.
- All levels and divisions will be pinned together, unless otherwise specified.
- A minimum of 5 participants must be registered for the award in order for the award to be presented at the end of the year.

The CSDEA "Triple Challenge" Award

\$500 prize awarded to winner

- The CSDEA Triple Challenge Perpetual Trophy recognizes a horse & rider pair with superior performance in all three phases of a single event. The trophy is awarded to the pair who earns the best (lowest) score of the season while jumping double-clear in both cross country and stadium.
- Scores are considered from all USEA recognized shows within the CSDEA geographical area of Minnesota and surrounding states (Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Wisconsin).
- There is no separate registration requirement for this award; all competitors registered for a general eventing award will be considered.

Locally Bred Eventer Award

Sponsored by Safe and Sound Saddle Fit

- This award is open to any horse of any breed that was bred in the CSDEA area (MN, WI, IA, ND or SD). Proof of breed/papers must be available for verification of breeding location.
- Points from any level BN-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

The Movin' On Up Award

- The award will be presented to the horse/rider combination that has moved up during the season from Beginner Novice or higher to a level not previously shown.
- Junior and Senior awards will be given.
- The pair must go cross country and earn points at both levels to be eligible.
- Points earned in each level will be combined. Points are awarded based on Point Scoring System, but number of starters is not factored into total points.

Morgan Award

Sponsored by Do or Do Knot Rope Halters

- Horse must be a registered Morgan Horse.
- Points from any level BN-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

Pony Award

Sponsored by Heather Salden Training

- Pony must be no taller than 148 cms without shoes and 149 cms with shoes (14.2 hands and under).

- Proof of height must be sent upon registration. Proof includes: USEF pony card, photo submission of pony and measuring device, breed papers, vet certificate, etc. Or the pony must be personally measured by an award committee staff member.
- Points from any level ST-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

“Show Me Some ID” Irish Award

- Horses can be imported or domestic but must have Irish Draught in the breeding, as determined by pedigree, registry, or DNA. Purebreds and partbreds are both eligible. ID, IDSH, or ISH (with confirmed Irish Draught Blood).
- Points from any level BN-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

Silks Award

- Open to all Off the Track Thoroughbreds. Proof of race record or tattoo number must be provided.
- Points from any level BN-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

Starter Novice Award

- Only points from Starter level (Starter USEA Recognized Test) count toward this award.
- Points are earned according to the Point Scoring System.

Vintage Horse Award

- Horse must be aged 15 years or older at the time points are earned. Proof of age required.
- Points from any level BN-A are eligible. The Points Handicapping System will be used to determine the final placings.

Point Scoring System

Points are awarded according to type of competition. For Movin' On Up, number of starters is not factored into total points.

Long format Training Level 3 day event or ½* competition will be calculated using the CCI point system.

Completion points: 15 points will be given to competitors who complete a long format ½* or 1* event but finish out of the placings.

1/2 equivalent Horse Trial points for the level

1st place @ BN = 5 points, 5th place @ N = 4 points, etc.

CIC*, CIC**, CIC***

2x equivalent Horse Trial points for the level

CIC* = 2x prelim points, CIC** = 2x intermediate points, CIC*** = 2x advanced points

T3D, P3D, CCI*, CCI**, CCI***, CCI****

3x equivalent Horse Trial points for the level

T3D = 3x training points, P3D/CCI* = 3x prelim points, CCI** = 3x intermediate points, CCI***/** = 3x advanced points

Split Levels (Training/Preliminary, Preliminary/Intermediate or Intermediate/Advanced)

Add 1 point to the lower level: 2nd @ training/prelim = 14 points, 3rd @ prelim/intermediate = 15 points, etc.
