“FIELD TRIP” to Washington DC by Megabus Saturday, June 3rd 7:15 a.m.

Beginning at Paoli Station

On this day trip, we will take the **Megabus** from 30th Street Station to Washington DC, eat lunch at the Native American Museum, then take a tour at that Museum. Afterwards, you will be free to visit other museums in walking distance. We return by Megabus to 30th Street Station, and then back out to Paoli for a long but very interesting and rewarding day!!

We will meet on Saturday, June 3rd at the Paoli Train Station, 13 N. Valley Rd., at 7:15 am. Parking at Paoli Station is free on Saturday. At the Paoli Train Station purchase 2 tickets to take the train to, and return from, 30th Street Station. For Seniors over age 65, the cost is \$1 each way. You can also buy the ticket on the train. The train leaves Paoli at 7:24 am and arrives at 30th Street Station at 8:05 am. In 30th Street Station, we will walk to board the Megabus. We must be at the Megabus stop at least 15 minutes before departure. The Megabus leaves 30th Street Station at 8:30 am and arrives at Union Station in Washington DC at 11:20 am (you can nap during the trip!). If you prefer to meet us at 30th Street Station instead of Paoli, please let us know. Just arrive 15 minutes before the 8:30 am departure time.

IMPORTANT: You must buy your own round trip tickets for the Megabus online. Go to www.Megabus.com. Put in June 3 for the departure and return dates. Also enter Philadelphia and Washington DC as the origin and destination. Select 8:30 am as the departure time and 5:45 pm as the return time. The cost starts at \$24.00 for the round trip. If you have already purchased your return ticket for 6:20 pm, try to cancel that and purchase a return ticket for 5:45 pm.

PLEASE NOTE: The cost goes up, the longer that you wait to make reservations. We will be glad to help you reserve the tickets.

After arriving at Union Station, we will walk to the Native American Museum. It is about a 15 minute walk (you can also take a taxi!). The tour starts at 1:30 pm. and lasts about 45 minutes. The tour guides are Native Americans and are absolutely fabulous.

Before the tour, we will eat lunch at the cafeteria in the Native American Museum. The food is gourmet and thoroughly enjoyable.

After the tour, you have your choice of museums. We suggest the following: Air & Space Museum, *The Newseum*, and/or the World War II Memorial, all of

which are in walking distance of the Native American Museum. The Air & Space Museum is almost next door to the Native American Museum. The Newseum (history of newspapers and other media – it’s truly awesome!) is about two blocks from the Native American Museum. The World War II Memorial is outdoors and is also close to the Native American Museum. We will help anyone that needs directions.

We will meet again at Union Station at 5 pm to catch the Megabus for home. Buy food for dinner there to eat on the bus on the way to 30th Street Station. The Megabus leaves Union Station at 5:45 pm and arrives at 30th Street at 9:05 p.m. The Paoli Train leaves 30th Street Station at 10:09 pm, arriving at Paoli at 10:50 pm.

Wear good walking shoes since we will be walking from the train station to the various museums. Also, in case of rain, please bring a small umbrella. Please be aware that security is very tight at these museums so bring as few items as possible. All the museums have free admission except *The Newseum* which is not a government facility.

The River Trail on the OTHER side of the river in Valley Forge Park is a delightful walk/stroll any time of year and early June is no exception! What better way to enjoy beautiful scenery and glorious weather!! There are NO hills on this trail, just a wide gravel path and views of the river!



You can elect to do TWO, FOUR, or SIX (the entire length and back) miles and these checkpoints are well-marked en route. In addition, after our hike, we'll we'll go for lunch at a nearby eatery.

We start at the Betzwood Bridge parking lot area. Take the Rt. 363 exit from Route 422 which is immediately after you cross the Schuylkill River. Stay in the left hand lane of the exit ramp and turn LEFT at the top of the ramp. You will cross over Rt. 422, make another left, and head towards the river. Turn RIGHT into the park after a short downhill and **go to the END of the road** past the bathrooms on your left and park as close to the start of the River Trail as possible.

Laurel Hill Cemetery Tour and BYOB Dinner at "Fig"

On Sunday June 25 Philip Harvey will be hosting a tour of the marvelous Laurel Hill Cemetery to be followed by an excellent BYOB dinner at "Fig" restaurant. Laurel Hill is the second oldest "rural cemetery" in the United States (Boston has the oldest). It has extensive acreage overlooking the Schuylkill River and Fairmount Park and is one of the most beautiful locations in the City of Philadelphia. It is a burial who's who of prominent Philadelphians in

banking, politics, industry, military (31 Civil War general officers), athletics and the arts. It is also an instructive museum of different burial practices and monument types as they evolved over the years. It is located about three miles north of the Philadelphia Museum of Art on the East River (Kelly) Drive. For an overview, check www.thelaurehillcemetery.org.

The "tour du jour" for June 25 is "Engines of Creation" which covers Philadelphia architects, inventors and scientists who have made significant contributions. The tour starts at 1:00PM and runs to about 2:45PM. I would suggest arriving around 12:30PM as it takes a while to make payment and get signed up for the tour. The cost is \$13 for seniors (65 plus) and \$15 for others. "Fig" is cash only and BYOB and will not give individual bills. Please bring enough cash and diverse bills (including lots of ones) to simplify settling the Laurel Hill charges and "Fig" dinners. If you join us for dinner you would be done by 6:00PM at the latest.





Over 100 of Andrew Wyeth's paintings will be on display this summer, viewed in chronological order, at the Brandywine River Museum on Route 1 in Chadds Ford. The only other venue for this exhibit will be Seattle so be sure not to miss this once-in-a-lifetime

opportunity! The museum opens at 9:30 a.m. and the cost is \$15 for adults, \$10 for seniors. They recommend getting there as early as possible though they say that everyone will definitely get in! We're saying 10:30 to 11:00 to arrive, though you can also come earlier.

Directions to Ralph's, 138 Orchard Way, Berwyn 19312:

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From Rt. 30/Lancaster Pike, At the Berwyn traffic light go over the bridge to Old Lancaster Pike/Bridge Rd. Go around the curve and make the first right at the stop sign onto Howellville Road. In just 0.2 miles, there is a traffic light at Conestoga Rd., with T.E. Middle School on your left. Orchard Way is dead ahead, just slightly to the right. It is **ONE WAY**.

Ralph's house is the THIRD house on the left, a gray trimmed saltbox. There is room for only a few cars in the driveway and there is limited parking on Orchard Way. It is recommended to park at the Middle School (turn left at the light onto Conestoga, then a left into the parking lot. Go down the concrete steps at the intersection and cross the street for the short walk to Orchard Way and Ralph's house.) If a driver drops people off at Ralph's driveway on Orchard Way, follow Orchard Way to dead end on Bair, turn right, then turn right again on Conestoga to get back to the intersection -- continue through intersection a short distance and turn left into school parking lot.

From KOP - Rt. 202 south: Take the Rt. 252 South/Paoli exit and turn left at the FIRST light onto Cassatt Road. Follow Cassatt up to the Conestoga Road intersection above and make a sharp left to Orchard Way OR turn right onto Conestoga, then go left to park in the Middle School parking lot.
