



All of us are now required by our County government to have a carbon monoxide alarm/detector installed in our home. Some alarms/detectors are combined fire and carbon Most of these alarms/detectors are now good for 10 years and have a lithium battery. So when it is no longer working, you will need to recycle and purchase a new one. Once you've removed all batteries and recyclable casings, you can safely discard the carbon monoxide detector with your normal trash.

One of our members shared there are three different beeping signals from the carbon monoxide detector and each one is specific. Who knew!

3 beeps = smoke in the home

4 beeps = Exit home; there is a Carbon Monoxide leak

5 beeps = battery needs changing

If the alarm/detector is going off and you don't know what to do, and you live in a city, call the non-emergency number for the Fire Dept. and they will come and check it out. If you live in an unincorporated area, call 911 if you can't find the phone number to the closest fire station. This happened to me and the 911 people were very understanding and directed my call without criticism.

If the price of these alarms are a hardship, contact the Volunteer Center 831-427-5070 and see if you are eligible for their Helping Hands program.
