Did you feel the earthquake this month? Lately we've had many national and local reminders of the importance of emergency preparedness, with horrendous fires, floods, mudslides, and the resulting loss of power.

How we can support one another in an emergency?

In December, Grieg Rose, an emergency preparedness trainer, taught Village participants some of the ins and outs of emergency preparedness. We're gearing up to share what we learned with all of our members.

As a project of the linkAges Santa Cruz Village private group, three of us are planning a Disaster Preparedness Work Party Group. A Work Party can consist of five or six members, preferably living in the same area, to reduce travel. We will work together to insure each individual Work Party member is better prepared for an emergency. Possibilities include:

- change batteries & check smoke/CO detectors
- locate water & gas shut-off valves
- clean cooling fins on back of refrigerator
- help build emergency preparedness kit including File-of-Life
- help problem-solve individual roadblocks to emergency preparedness.
