Welcome to the Illinois Bicycle Safety Quiz Challenge! Quiz from League of Illinois Bicyclists (LIB)



Grace Doyle, member of both <u>League of Illinois Bicyclists</u> (LIB) and EBC, was in attendance at the April EBC Club meeting to promote LIB's Bicycle Safety Quiz. There are actually 3 quizzes: Child Bicyclist, Adult Bicyclist, and Motorist. Here's a description from the LIB website:

This quiz website is provided by the League of Illinois Bicyclists, a statewide non-profit organization, as a convenient, interactive way rists to learn more about safely sharing our roads. The Secretary of

for bicyclists and motorists to learn more about safely sharing our roads. The Secretary of State is one of our project partners.

The Adult Bicyclist quiz has 33 multiple-choice questions divided into Bronze (10 questions), Silver (11), and Gold (12) levels. The questions cover on-road and off-road situations, skills and techniques, common mistakes, and relevant laws.

You'll likely find many questions challenging. That's OK! The feedback provided to your answers is meant to be the teaching method. We will re-ask those questions you miss - you get up to three chances to correctly answer each question. Once you answer each question in one level correctly, you may move up to the next level. The highest priority questions are in Bronze but see if you can get the Gold!

You may print or e-mail a "certificate of completion" if you successfully complete at least one level. If needed, you may "Exit Quiz" - but you would have to start from the beginning if you came back to the site later. You're invited to also try the Motorist quiz later.

Elmhurst Installs New Bicycle Fix-it Station Near Metra Train Stop by Chuck Dean

Most of us recognize that Elmhurst is pretty progressive when it comes to bicycling. So you are probably not surprised to learn about the bicycle repair station that was recently installed near the Elmhurst train station (south side of the tracks, a little east of York road). Our list server reported this matter back in March, but I didn't get this news into the newsletter until now. Late in April, I rode my bike into Elmhurst to find and utilize the repair

station. I'm pleased to report that repair station was all you could expect to be. It properly supported my bike, the tools

were in great shape, and the tire pump was perfectly functional. While it has hardly been little more than a month that this repair station has been available, I could tell that the pump has been getting use, and that its heavy-duty nature is likely to insure that it remains in working condition for the foreseeable future.

Also of interest given that so many of you carry smart phones, you can receive video instructions by scanning one of those QR codes (kind of bar code) or browsing http://www.dero.com/bike-repair/

Giving credit where credit is due, I borrowed the title of this article and the first picture from Graydon Megan's fine <u>Chicago Tribune article</u>. That article says it all, so please take a look. And it is worth reiterating that the repair station was donated by <u>Elmhurst Master's Competition Cycling</u>.

So, if your tires need a top-off, or your bike needs practically any adjustment, ride over to the repair station in Elmhurst. You can fix it there.





Google Maps by Nancy Shack



This is general information that I just discovered last week concerning Google Maps and anyone who uses the service for any route planning, be it biking or driving, might find it of interest.

A year or two ago Google offered a new format for maps but I didn't care for it and stuck with Classic Maps. Last week I was startled to find that when I tried to access Classic maps it was no longer available. The choices are now Lite or Full Maps. However, depending on the version of your browser, you may find that you can't get Full Maps, only Lite.

There is an icon that looks like lightning at the bottom right hand corner of the map. If the icon is in parenthesis then you can click on it and switch to Lite maps. If there is no parenthesis then clicking on it will bring up a dialog box that tells you that your browser version may not support Full maps.

The reason that I am bringing this to everyone's attention is first of all, so that you don't think you are going nuts, as I did for awhile! And secondly, when I look at either driving directions or bike route directions I make heavy use of the drag to change route feature. What I have discovered from online research is that the drag feature is not offered in the Lite Maps version. For me, this is a huge disadvantage and therefore I will not use my older browser version for Google Maps. I do have several browsers that meet the requirements

for the Full map and I'll use one of those browsers when I want to play with routing.

Board Minutes April 9, 2015

- President: The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. at the Community Bank of Elmhurst.
 - Confidentiality of emails to the Board: It was reconfirmed that emails from members to the EBC Board will remain confidential when confidentiality is appropriate.
 - · Incident Report on file along with a copy of the sign-in sheet. - Many are not aware of the need to fill out an Incident Report, should there be an accident. After discussion, mailing the Incident Report and Ride Sheet to the Safety Chairman, or to one of the Board Members will be required if there is an accident. It can also be brought to the club meeting, and turned in at the meeting. Riders should be reminded to fill out the Ride Sheets with current In Case of Emergency (ICE) information. If Road ID is checked "yes," know where this Road ID can be found: some are on the wrist, or inside the helmet, or in a bike bag. The need for a Ride Leader Training was mentioned and will be further developed for a later date to include new policies and procedures. The Safety Chairman Baltimore Ortega will be contacted to assist in updating this training program. This subject will receive further discussion at the May Board meeting.
 - BananaMan: Judy is in the process of researching information on the origin of the BananaMan. Several club members from years ago have been contacted.
 - Hank Niedballa: a card will be sent to his family, including the tribute emails from club members.
 - Awards Night: At the time of this meeting, awards night will need to be postponed till June, due to a failure of the T-shirt Company. However shortly after the meeting, a new vendor will supply T-Shirts.

- President: The General Meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. at the Community Bank of Elmhurst. A moment of silence was held for Hank Niedballa, who passed away April 2. A few Hank memories were shared, reflecting on what a great person he was. - Secretary: March minutes are posted in the monthly newsletter, which can be found on the EBC website.
- 3. Membership Coordinator:

4. VP/Ride Captain:

- The Cal Sag Trail is having events to celebrate opening of the trail June 6. A ride to this ride / event will be posted.
- For March there were 96 bike rides/ 3 hikes / 1 snow shoe / 3 other events / 1 club meeting. Year to date totals: 189 bike rides/ 7 mountain bike rides / 39 hikes / 20 snow shoe / 9 cross country ski / 3 other events / 3 club meetings.
- Many are not aware of the need to fill out an Incident Report, should there be an accident on a ride. More details on the procedures are being worked out, but in the meantime keep in mind Ride leaders need to make sure *everyone* on the ride signs the ride sheet, and provides an emergency contact. This ICE contact should have legal responsibilities to make decisions on behalf of rider's welfare. The need for a Ride Leader Training was mentioned and will be further developed for a later date to include new policies and procedures. The Safety Chairman Baltimore Ortega will be contacted to assist in updating this training program.
- 5. **Treasurer:** The Treasurer reported: Monthly Banking Summary (dated 3/12/2015 4/9/2015); Listed income was \$721.14; expenses were \$2,250.50; Total Banking balance at this time: \$16,529.17

6. Advocacy:

- Bob Hoel is in need of EBC members to handle the bike parking during the Elmhurst Cycling Classic July 24 (Friday). He will not be in town this year during the Classic, and will need someone to take the lead, and several volunteers to run the bike parking program.
- Grace Doyle, League of Illinois Bicyclists and EBC member is here to promote the LIB Bike Safety Quiz, which is taken online. We are trying to involve the mayors of all the towns to participate in the Mayors Bicycle Safety Challenge. - Safety Chairman: Baltimore Ortega Remember to check your helmets for proper fit and worthiness. Tires - check for wear, cracks, proper tire pressure. Emergency Contact updates - ICE correct numbers, name of contact, and location where this information is.
- Awards and Attire: EBC bike jerseys have been ordered for those who have placed their orders and will be arriving in May. A vendor is being searched to provide t-shirts for the awards meeting.
- 9. Mountain Bike Coordinator: George Pastorino
 Full day Ride Leader Training on May 30. The first part will be a group session at the Pastorino home, and cover many subjects including learning the Palos Trail system, what to carry, radios, assigning a sweep, judging trail conditions, regrouping, judging rider ability and conditions, MTB safety and trail etiquette, responding to an accident, basic first aid, and more. This will be followed by lunch. Part 2 will be trail based with hands on practice. June 2nd is the rain date.


