ADVANCED NOTICE—PROPOSED NEW WEBSITE

During the recent February RHYC Board meeting, a motion was approved to develop a proposal, for consideration by the membership, to update our club's web site and social media capabilities. The goals of this proposal will be to increase member to member communications and provide an online platform for integrated and more efficient club administration.

The proposal for a new RHYC website platform is based on commercially available software that has many powerful features to support a club like RHYC. Listed below are a few of the integrated feature sets that can be made available to our club:

Online Membership Database – The Cub website could include a full online member management system to allow the board to move from an offline database system to an integrated online system. This system could allow for a full lifecycle of Club memberships with online signups and automatic membership renewals as well as expirations with integrated email reminders.

Member Profile – Every membership would have their own username and password to login and view member-only content. The Profile allows members to update their personal information, bio and photo, and to view a complete transaction and payment history (if this option is selected.) The member profile would become the basis for the member directory which would become the single location for contact information about the RHYC membership.

Event Calendar - The website feature includes a powerful event calendar with online registration and optional payment, as well as attendance tracking. This would provide for easier signup and cruise captain management of RHYC events. The calendar supports single-activity or multi-activity events, multiple pricing options, the ability to add companions to an event registration, and event-specific questions.

Photo Pages – The platform would allow the club to upload as many digital photos as desired, organize them by tags and place them on specially designed photo

pages. The system stores each photo in different resolutions and optionally allows users to download photos from the website. While only approved administrators in the club would be able to upload and administer, it would provide a location to store all of the photos taken at an event instead of just those that are in the Anchor Watch. It also provides a location for the general public to check out and see how much fun we have as a club.

Document Library – The website platform would allow us to create an online library of club documents, organized into any number of folders and sub-folders, with full control over visibility. We would be able to track how often each document is downloaded, and even allow members to upload and comment on documents. While this proposal would not replace the RHYC handbook, it would be an online repository of the information.

Public and Private web pages - The website supports full control over web pages, navigational menus, photos, documents and more so that only the information that the club wishes to display to a public viewer of the site would be available. Member information would only be available to authorized members. Changes to the site can be made at any time by any authorized user; changes would not require a programmer to update the website.

The website platform contains many other features that the club could optionally use in the future to support club activities and communications. It needs to be said that the system under consideration would not replace any of the other communications sent out by the club such as event notifications, Anchor Watch, and yearly printed club handbook. For those members that do not have Internet access, the club would still mail club communications.

In addition to the Website which would be the formal face for our club, we could create a Facebook Group to facilitate informal communication and sharing between members. This group would allow Facebook users in the club to share photos, ideas, comments and suggestions. While available for viewing by any Facebook user, the group would only allow posting of information by invited individual members. The RHYC Group news feed could be integrated with the Club's website to provide an efficient source of updated news.

The Board will provide more information about this website proposal, including cost implications, in forthcoming newsletter articles.

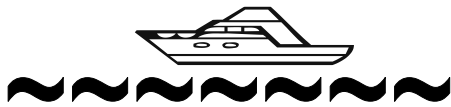
