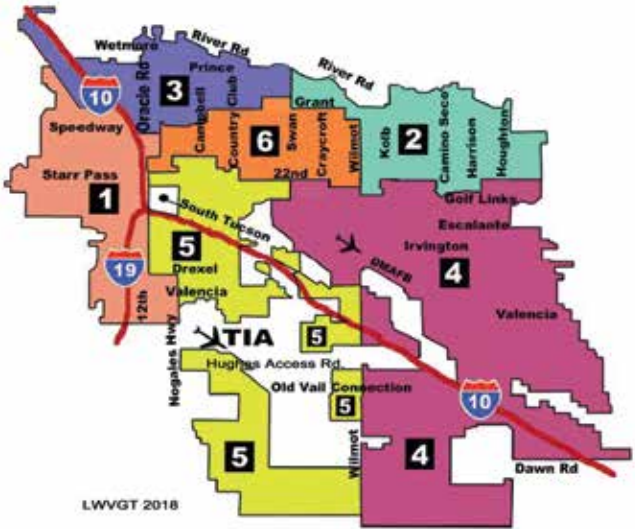

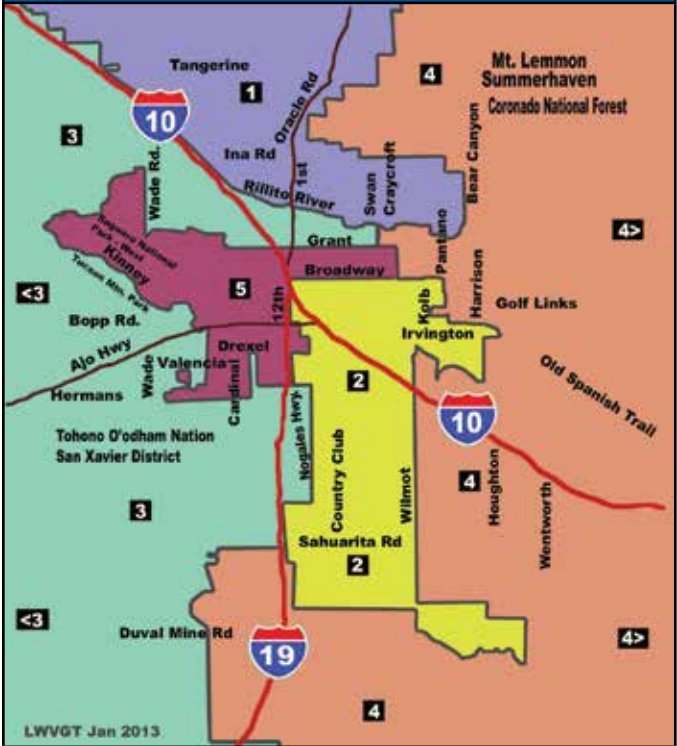

ARIZONA STATE COURTS

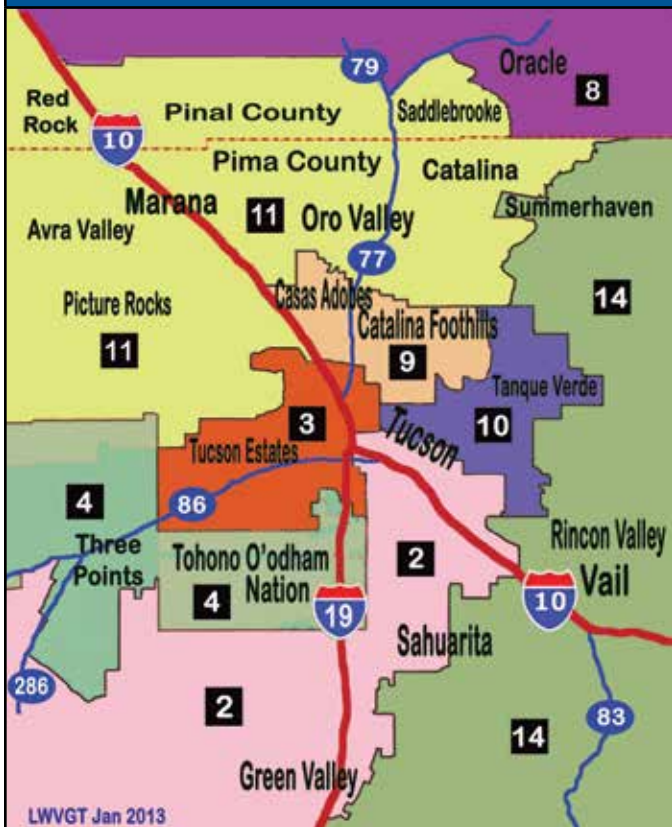
Judges of the Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals, and of the Superior Court in Maricopa, Pima, Coconino, and Pinal counties are appointed to office by the governor upon recommendation of a bipartisan commission. The term of office of a Supreme or an Appellate Court judge is six years and of a Superior Court judge four years. At the expiration of their terms, appointed judges wishing to remain in office have their names placed upon the ballot. The electorate then votes to retain or reject them. The Clerk of the Pima County Superior Court is an elective office with a 4-year term.

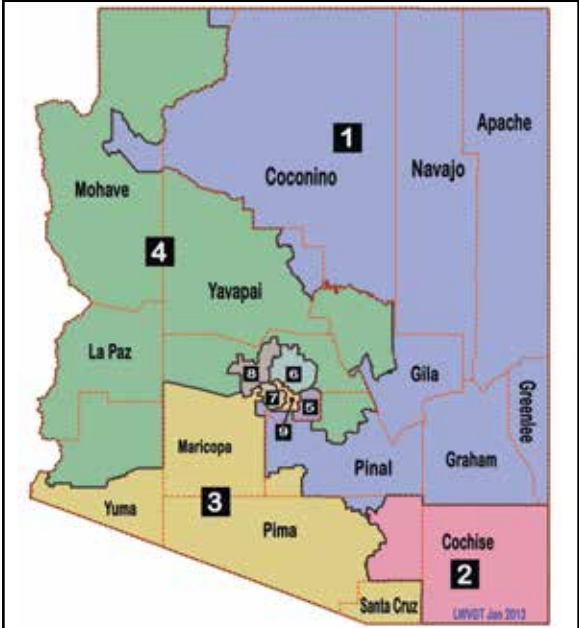

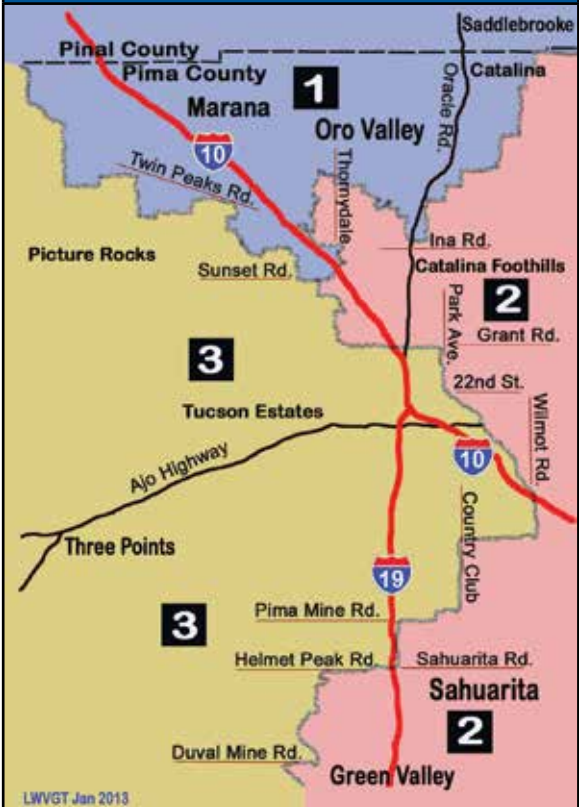

WHO CAN REGISTER TO VOTE?

- To register to vote in any Arizona county, you must be a U.S. citizen, 18 or older by the next statewide regular General Election, and a resident of the county.
- You cannot register to vote in Arizona if you have been convicted of a felony and you have not yet had your civil rights restored. For assistance, call the Pima County Public Defender's Office at 520-724-6800.
- If a judge has ruled that a person is incapacitated and their voting rights are revoked, they cannot register to vote.

HOW DO YOU REGISTER TO VOTE?

- If you have an Arizona Driver's License or Non-operating License (Arizona ID), you can register and update your information online at ServiceArizona.com.
- Otherwise, fill out and send in an *Arizona Voter Registration Form*. Forms are available at post offices, libraries, and on your County Recorder's Office website.

OTHER RULES ABOUT REGISTERING TO VOTE

- You can register at any time, but it must be at least 29 days before an election if you plan to vote.
- You must update your registration if you change your name, address (even apartment number), or political party. The Arizona Motor Vehicle Division will update your voter address when you update your driver's license unless you opt out.
- In order to vote for candidates for state and local offices, and ballot measures, you must provide proof of U.S. citizenship. If you do not provide that proof, you will only be permitted to vote for candidates for U.S. President, U.S. Senate, and U.S. House of Representatives. You must prove that you are a U.S. citizen the first time you register to vote in Arizona or if your Arizona voter registration has been cancelled. Enter a valid Arizona Driver's License or Non-operating License (Arizona ID). Numbers issued after 1996, or a Tribal ID number, or an Alien Registration Number on the voter registration form.

POLITICAL PARTY AND PRIMARY ELECTIONS

- If you do not list a recognized political party on your voter registration form, or you list "Independent," you will have to choose which party's ballot you want to vote for every primary election.
- However, to vote in the Presidential Preference Election (primary election for U.S. President), you will have to register as one of the recognized political parties before the deadline.

To find forms, check your voter registration, find out where to vote, or get other answers, call your County Recorder's Office or go to their website. In Pima County, call 520-724-4330 or go to recorder.pima.gov.

For information about elections and election procedures, call your County Elections Department or go to their website. In Pima County, call 520-724-6830 or search "Pima County Elections Department" to find the website.

For information about candidates and ballot issues, check with the League of Women Voters of Greater Tucson, www.lwvtucson.org, or the Arizona Clean Elections Commission, www.azcleelections.gov.

ABOUT VOTING

For most elections, there are three ways you can cast your one vote: Rules might be different for some local elections.

1. Vote early by mail: If you check “Permanent Early Voting List” on the voter registration form (or online at voter registration at ServiceArizona.com) you will get your ballot in the mail for every election. You can mail your completed ballot, take it to any Early Voting Site, or take it to any Polling Location on Election Day. Call the Recorder’s Office (520-724-4350) if you need help with you ballot or if you will be gone and you want you ballot mailed elsewhere

2. Vote early in person: There are several Early Voting Sites in Pima County where you can vote before Election Day. Locations and dates are listed on the Pima County Recorder’s website (recorder.pima.gov) or call the Recorder’s Office (520-724-4350).

3. Vote in person on Election Day at the Polling Location for your home address. If you aren’t sure where you vote, call the Recorder’s Office or got to their website and click on “Polling Locations”.

PROPER ID FOR VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

To vote in person at an Early Voting Site or at your Polling Location on Election Day, you must present identification.

- A valid Arizona Driver’s License or ID issued by the Arizona Motor Vehicle Division, government photo ID, or Tribal photo ID, with your name and current address (that matches the poll roster); OR
- One of the above IDs with an old address (that does not match the poll roster), or a valid military ID or U.S. Passport, combined with one proof of current address from the list below; OR
- Two IDs/documents without your photo, but with your name and current address (that matches the poll roster), such as:
 - a recent utility, cell phone or cable TV bill
 - a recent bank or credit union statement
 - a valid Arizona vehicle registration or vehicle insurance card
 - a property tax statement for your house
 - a voter card or sample ballot showing your name and address
 - an Indian census card or tribal ID without a photo
 - a valid government ID without a photo

Taking Action - Your Voice Can Be Heard

Elected officials want to hear from their constituents, and you can communicate in a variety of ways. The Legislature’s website (www.azleg.gov) provides each legislator’s contact information, committee assignments and other useful information.

- You can meet elected officials in person by attending government meetings, town halls, hearings and public events. You may also request an appointment.
- By phone: Use the official phone number listed for their office.
- By mail or email: On the subject line, identify the name or number of the bill, and your position: in favor or opposed. Put comments/reasons in the content of the letter. Be brief.
- To record your approval or disapproval (and to comment) on any bill scheduled for committee consideration as part of the public record, register in advance with the Legislature’s Request To Speak (RTS) System, which is accessible at www.azleg.gov. For information on registering for your free RTS account, email Legislative Coordinator Cynthia Patchen at cpatchen@azleg.gov. RTS office hours are suspended until further notice.
