Selma moved to the Hammond Wood neighborhood in 1951. She has four grandkids, three of whom live nearby and one who lives in the San Francisco Bay area. She was a stay-at-home mom until her kids were grown, and was active in the Pleasant View, Newport, and Einstein PTAs as well as in Democratic politics. While her kids were still in school, she was the Office Manager for the County Council of PTAs. Later on, Selma became a potter and was a member of the Montgomery County Potters and the Ceramic Guild, which shows in the Torpedo Factory in Alexandria.

At 90+ years old, Selma was still driving. Then one stormy day, a neighbor's tree fell on her car; fortunately, Selma was not in it! But the car was a total loss and she decided that, rather than buy a new car, she would take this 'opportunity' to give up driving.

"Now that I am 95 and without [my own] wheels," Selma explained, "I mostly read, am interested in politics, and worry about the state of the country. When I can, I enjoy cooking and gardening." About Villages of Kensington, Selma says, "VoK has been a godsend for me. Besides helping me get to doctor appointments, I've met so many great and generous people."

Signing up last February to provide a ride to two VoK members proved to be a day of firsts for me:

- First VoK Volunteer driver to accept and fulfill VoK's first ride request
- First chance to drive a large wheelchair-accessible van
- First opportunity to meet these new VoK members, a couple from the Rock Creek Hills neighborhood....the best part of the day!

One spouse uses an electric wheelchair for mobility and the other was recovering from recent surgery and could not drive. They needed a driver to transport them roundtrip in their own wheelchair-

accessible van from their home to a concert at Strathmore Hall.

I must admit, I was a little nervous about driving a large vehicle that I'd never driven before. I arrived at their home a few minutes early, so we could get acquainted. They showed me the van's special features and were so helpful with advice (cont., p. 2) about driving their vehicle. My riders got the wheelchair up the electric ramp and secured in the van. It was a quick trip to Strathmore, where we pulled right up to the door and my passengers disembarked. Then I drove back to my home to complete some chores until it was time to return at the end of the concert to take them back home.

It was a delightful experience, made so because my passengers were such interesting and kind people. In addition to feeling so good about being able to help, I felt even better about making two new friends who needed just a little bit of assistance to keep to their regular schedule.

For me, this first experience illuminates the value of the Villages of Kensington for our members and our community.

I had a great first ride, too.
