If you're an iPhone or iPad user who wants to videochat with another iPhone/iPad user, you can use **Facetime**, the app built right into your device. Facetime is Apple's single platform app for video calling, and it's as easy as making a phone call.



Facetime is also an option for videochatting on Mac computers.

Rest assured that Facetime videochats are encrypted by Apple for security.
