- The Los Angeles Regional Food is taking necessary precautions to make sure that food and product remain safe, and that distributions and volunteer activities can continue. For more information [Click Here.](#)
- As of 7/10/20, Access Services has completed over 197,241 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects.
- This week, #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting 2 drive-thru food distribution events in El Monte and Long Beach.
- To date, #LetsFeedLACounty has now exceeded 1 million pounds of food distributed and the equivalent of 1 million meals (1.2 million pounds). Drive-thru food distribution events have been extended through the end of August.
- Total distributed to date at 17 events is 897 tons of food provided to 29,004 household.
- Drive-thru food distribution events held in Covina and Lennox served 1,964 and 1,897 households, respectively, were each provided 60 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, frozen meat, and fresh produce.
- Total distributed to date at 17 events is 897 tons of food provided to 29,004 households.
- The LAUSD “Grab & Go” Food Centers are open, Monday through Friday from 8-11a.m. through August 14, 2020. As of Monday, June 22, 2020, the “Grab & Go Food Center” at Verdugo Hills High School moved to Mount Gleason Middle School.
- Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon.
- Great Plates Delivered has a current service population of 3,307 seniors (100% increase since beginning of June) with a total of 324,747 meals served.
- Great Plates Program has been extended until August 10, 2020.
- Elder Nutrition Program has a current service current population of 18,152 seniors.
