COMBATTING HUNGER

The County of Los Angeles is committed to feeding our most vulnerable communities during the Coronavirus pandemic. We are mobilizing public agencies, nonprofits, and volunteers to provide meals to anyone in need during the long months to come. Visit <https://covid19.lacounty.gov/food/> for more information.

- Continue to provide nutritious meals to all students at “Grab & Go Food Centers” at 63 locations from 8 a.m. -11 a.m.
- Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon.
- Completed over 106,166 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects.
- To date, the #LetsFeedLACounty initiative has held 9 drive-thru food distribution events, distributing 236 tons of food to 13,134 households.
- WDACS began contracting with restaurants to expand program. Expect to serve additional 1,000 seniors week of June 8 using restaurant prepared meals. Food box deliveries to the 5,600 seniors on the WDACS waiting list begins week of June 8. For this, we secured 6,000 20-lb boxes of shelf-stable food for distribution and engaged Amazon to deliver at no cost. Total meals served to since May 12: 110,400.
- DPSS reports a 130% increase in Cal Fresh applications since March
- PHFE reports a 20% increase in WIC applicants since March
- Distribution from the Food Bank’s two distribution centers has increased by 80% compared to the first two months of 2020, and this time last year. For more information [Click Here.](#)

Mental Health (DMH): DMH (Systemwide Mental Assessment Response Team (SMART) and other Mental Evaluation Teams (MET) teams remain non-operational today due to the ongoing protests. LASD MET and Psychiatric Emergency Response Teams (PMRT) teams are functioning as usual but are advised to exercise caution. DMH 24/7 Access Center helpline services call volume is stable. DMH Engagement Division continues to participate in a 100-day challenge to develop a transition plan for Project Room Key. Continuing plans to establish the Veteran's Peer Support Line on June 8, 2020. DMH continues to work on planning for recovery and reopening of DMH programs as part of the County Reconstitution efforts. Completing testing and staff planning today to bring up the Veteran's Peer Support Line today, June 8, 2020. 1 DMH clinic in Santa Clarita and 2 clinics in South Los Angeles closed early last week to ensure the safety of staff due to protest in the area. DMH continues to manage ongoing COVID-19 response activities and monitor the protests for impact to DMH building and services. STATE PARTNERS	<p>On June 3, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a proclamation declaring a statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, and signed an executive order. To curb the spread of COVID-19, the order ensures in-person voting opportunities are available in sufficient numbers to maintain physical distancing. It requires counties to provide 3 days of early voting, starting the Saturday before election day. The order also requires ballot drop-box locations be available between October 6, 2020, and November 3, 2020, while also allowing counties to consolidate voting locations, with at least one voting location per 10,000 registered voters.
