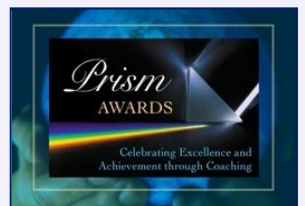

Update: Pro Bono Coaching for Conflict Resolution Specialists

Update on Pro Bono Coaching for Conflict Resolution Specialists

ICF colleague Cinnie Noble, PCC, is co-presenting a **day-long workshop on Wednesday, October 11, in Addison** for conflict resolution specialists. The workshop is part of a conference presented by The Association for Conflict Resolution (ACR), a nonprofit professional organization. It is titled "Professionalize Your Passion." Attendees will pay a fee that covers costs, but presenters receive no pay, similar to ICF-NT events.

Cinnie's workshop will help participants develop a vision and plan for their conflict resolution career. Her format includes bringing in ICF credentialed coaches to provide one hour of pro bono coaching to each of the 30 participants around enriching their vision to support the design stage. If she gets fewer than 30 volunteer coaches, she will place each coach with a small group.

The coaching piece is scheduled between 1:30 and 2:45 PM. Participating coaches are requested to arrive by 1:15 and are invited to spend the whole day at the event starting at 9:00 AM (lunch not included). Cinnie will ask for a short bio and picture that she will make available to the participants, some of whom may be interested in additional coaching.

Texas ICF Chapters Designing Coaches Retreat For 2018 Save the Date! April 6-8, 2018

ICF chapters from North Texas, Greater Austin, and Houston are collaborating to design a Coaches Retreat that will take place Friday afternoon through mid-day Sunday, April 6–8, in Burnet, outside of Austin. The retreat, in a natural setting with comfortable accommodations, will focus on the importance for coaches to “tune the instrument” through self-care, deepening self-awareness, and creating and strengthening connections with other coaches.

The event will include workshop experiences for CCEUs as well as open time to enjoy the activities available at the venue. Attendees will be guided in designing their individual and group experience for the weekend during the opening session by setting meaningful intentions. Some activities will be suggested for open times and attendees will be invited to co-create parts of the experience together.

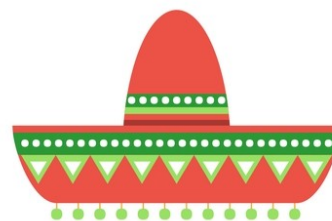

One resource that the larger community needs right now are volunteer 'grief counselors' who have a background in clinical psychology, counseling or social work and who have been specifically trained in working with people experiencing trauma. While most of our coach chapter members do not have this specific background and training, Cecilia thought we might know of other practitioners looking to help Houston. The ICF Houston chapter is often a referral resource.
