RE: Project No. P-2833 Cowlitz Falls Project Copper Canyon Facility, **Complaint** of non-compliance regarding Copper Canyon as-built drawing 20221202-5031

Dear Secretary Bose,

The simplified procedure for complaints involving small controversies is available to complainants if the amount in controversy is less than \$100,000 and the impact on other entities is de minimis.

I support the Licensee's Copper Canyon Facility. I note based on the Licensee's March 6, 2023 filing and contrary to the Licensee's December 2, 2022 filing there is a <u>Gravel Trail to River and Creek</u>. On May 16, 2022 the correct location of the <u>Gravel Trail to River and Creek</u> as it existed was provided to the Licensee; but, in violation of FERC's orders, the Licensee did not address the concerns and comments provided to them.




Figure 1 – Existing Gravel Trail to River and Creek in May 2022

I further note that as discussed at the May 23, 2022 meeting the Licensee stated they would remove the boulders from the boat ramp, and are providing around the loop-road non-handicapped parking servicing the picnic shelter. I further note that in early October 2022 the Licensee ordered 4 non-ADA compliant picnic tables, 2 ADA compliant picnic tables, as well as two trash receptacles for the Copper Canyon picnic shelter. Those picnic tables and trash receptacles have been installed.

A complaint filed under this simplified procedure must contain:

1. The name of the complainant;

2. The name of the respondent;

Lewis County Public Utility District #1 (Licensee)

3. A description of the relationship to the respondent;

I am a user of the Licensee's recreational facilities.

4. The amount in controversy;

Less than \$100,000.

5. A statement why the complaint will have a de minimis impact on other entities;

The facilities are as-built facilities, as approved by the Commission, and currently exist.

6. The facts and circumstances surrounding the complaint, including the legal or regulatory obligation breached by the respondent;

Paragraph (D) of FERC's 11/17/2020 order states "(D) Within 90 days from the individual completion date for the Copper Canyon Creek Take-Out Site improvements, Project Laydown Area, and North Boat Launch Site, as identified in ordering paragraph (B) above, the licensee must file as-built site plan drawings for each completed take-out site showing **the type and location of all improvements** (*emphasis added*) provided at each site, including all associated access road improvements. The filings must also include photographs of each sign/kiosk installed at each take-out site showing their message/contents."

The Licensee's submitted as-built drawing 20221202-5031 falsely locates the Gravel Trail to River and Creek. The true location of the <u>Gravel Trail to River and Creek</u> had been provided to the Licensee as part of comments on their progress reports.

The Licensee's as-built drawing does not show the location of Licensee's improved loop-road parking spots serving the picnic shelter. The 4 non-ADA compliant picnic tables, 2 ADA compliant picnic tables, and trash receptacle improvements are not shown. All improvements should be accurately shown and documented as required in paragraph D for FERC's approval.

7. The requested relief;

a. The Licensee should file a complete as-built drawing including all of the Copper Canyon improvements:

- i. The boat ramp without boulders blocking it.
- ii. The accurate location of the full Gravel Trail to River and Creek
- iii. The non-ADA loop-road parking spots serving the picnic shelter as stated in the May 23, 2022 meeting.
- iv. 4 non-ADA picnic tables
- v. 2 ADA picnic tables
- vi. 2 trash receptacles
- b. FERC, as a facilitator, attend the April 24, 2023 meeting being hosted by the Licensee. The Licensee is neither reporting or addressing comments and concerns as required by FERC order.
- 8. A complainant filing under this simplified procedure is required to simultaneously serve the complaint on the respondent and any other entity referenced in the complaint.
