Friday, August 3, 10:30 am – 3:00 pm
Explorers Walk: East Boston & ICA’s Watershed



We’ll take the T to Maverick Square and walk along the harbor shoreline to the landscaped Piers Park, which overlooks downtown Boston. In the adjacent Marina

we’ll visit “Watershed,” the Institute of Contemporary Art’s newly opened art gallery housed in a former warehouse. After seeing their initial exhibit, we’ll go across the street to KO Pies, an Australian café, for a light lunch (pay on your own). Afterwards we’ll continue on the Harborwalk and share a water-taxi to cross the harbor to South Station. Meet downstairs at the main Harvard T ticketing machines at 10:30 am. Walking distance approx. 2.5 miles. Water taxi charge is \$12/each. Watershed Gallery admission is free.

Gropius House Tour and Lunch at deCordova



Walter Gropius, founder of the German design school known as Bauhaus, was one of the most influential architects of the 20th century. He designed Gropius House as his

family home when he came to teach architecture at Harvard’s Graduate School of Design. Built in 1938 and modest in scale, the house was revolutionary in impact, combining traditional elements of New England architecture – wood, brick, and fieldstone- with innovative material including glass block, acoustical plaster, chrome banisters, and the latest technology in fixtures.



After our hour-long guided tour, we will head over to the deCordova Museum for lunch in the café. We will explore the Sculpture Park before coming back to Cambridge. \$12/person in advance for guided tour of Gropius

House. \$12/person upon arrival at deCordova. Lunch is pay on your own. Meet at Apple Cinemas at 10 am to carpool to Lincoln. Open to members only.

Explorers Walk: Upper Charles River, Watertown



Unlike the lower Charles River basin in our backyard, with its formal riverbanks bracketed by parkways, the nearby Upper Charles River is a narrow winding

body of water running through rustic woodlands with ample wildlife including herons and ducks. We'll walk the shaded pathway from Watertown Square along the North bank of the river to Bridge Street. There we'll cross to the other bank and return to our starting point by crossing the newly reconstructed wood footbridge. Meet at the Watertown Square bus turnaround at 10:30 am. (Bus #71 which leaves Harvard Square at 10:10 am fits our schedule.) Walking distance approx. 2 miles.

Grill (pay on your own) before heading back. Some may choose to return by subway. Others may be happy to walk back the way we came. Meet in front of Bertucci's at Alewife at 10:30 am. Walking distance approx. 1.5 miles each way.

We'll discuss "The Peabody Sisters: Three Women Who Ignited American Romanticism," by Megan Marshall.

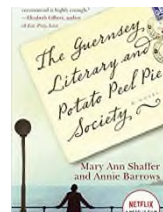
