Dear CC:

While there, as you know, are many ways to warm the crew, follow the recipe below and those suffering from frost bite will be few. Serve generously with margaritas, tequilla stingers, bloody sizzlers, horny bulls, or aztec punch.

"WARM - YOUR - FREEZING - BUNS - CHILI"

- 4 pounds of course ground chuck
- 2 med. onions (chopped)
- 1 bell pepper (diced)
- 1 celery stalk (diced)
- 2 Jalapeno peppers (chopped)
- 2 garlic cloves (crushed)
- 2 (10 oz.) cans of "tomatoes & green chilies"
- 1 (8 oz.) tomato sauce
- 3 1/2 tablespoons of chili powder
- 1 1/4 tablespoons of brown sugar
- 1 1/2 tablespoons of salt
- 1/2 tablespoon of cumin
- 1 teaspoon of oregano
- 1 Bay leaf
- 2 bullion cubes
- 2 shots tequilla
- 1/2 bottle of beer
- 1 tablespoon of Masa Harina mixed with a little water to thicken

Sautee first six items, stir in the rest and simmer for one hour. Serve with hot tortillas, chips, or cornbread; and for hors d'oeuvres, serve easy but excellent chili con queso !!!!!

Combine 1 10 oz. can of Ro-Tel tomatoes (at Safeway) with 1 lb. of Velveta cheese (cook in double boiler).

CAUTION: While the above dishes are great after coming into port, refrain from sailing in choppy seas for two days after eating.
