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With frost starting to appear on the great pumpkins, it is time for a dish of hot "Crab au Gratin". Here is Gilley back from Newport with a great recipe for the HHSA crew:

#### "Crab au Gratin"

1 pound crab meat	salt to taste
2 tablespoons butter	1/4 cup grated parmesian cheese
1 tablespoon cornstarch	1/4 cup grated swiss cheese
1 cup half and half	paprika
1 egg yolk	

Saute crab meat in butter for 3 minutes. Mix cornstarch, half and half, egg yolk and salt; stir into crab until thickened.

Mix in cheese and pour into buttered 2-quart baking dish. Heat at 350° for 20 minutes. Serve over avocado, toast or into pastry cups. Sprinkle paprika on top for color.

Pop the cork on a bottle of white wine and enjoy.

OXFORD - A FANTASTIC CRUISE  
November 16-18, 1983

The gloom and doom weather forecast predicted for our cruise weekend seemed at first to have taken its toll as I stood alone by the flag pole last Friday evening at 1830 hours wondering if anyone would show up. Low and behold, within fifteen minutes we had seven boats agreeing to make the Friday night crossing to Oxford. The wind was 16-18 kts. out of the SW which made the Narrows a better plan than a beat around Blackwalnut Point. By 10:45 (2245 hours) two boats were safely at anchor, three were still making way through the Narrows (one slightly aground), one ended the night portion of the program at the entrance to Herrington Harbour (engine trouble) and one boat hadn't been heard from. By midnight, however, six of our seven were at anchor without a raft attempt as the wind was building and it was late. Saturday was spent in town and waiting for the rest of the fleet. The Halls (Sweet Harmony) and the Doyons (Circus) had prior arrangements at Crockett Bros. and moved their boats into the Marina. Bill Bickford (Lucky "7"), the Batts (Belfry) and myself (Tack It) attempted a raft which we finally broke up by early afternoon thanks to many, many passing boats. However, the raft took its toll. Joe started with the wax the hull routine, which prompted Bill to start with the teak. Funny how the fever spreads.

By Saturday evening the magic of HNSA cruises was doing its thing as 58 friends off 23 boats (11 rafted in Town Creek - more on this raft in a minute) gathered at Town Creek Restaurant for a very enjoyable evening. The HNSA burgee hung proudly on the wall and was left at the restaurant to join the many other association burgees owner Harold Williams adorns the bar wall with. Sunday morning, while preparing for the Tred Avon venture to Dennis Point, Jack Marquez (Free Bird) radioed to indicate that two of the 11 rafted boats were about to become permanent fixtures in the Town Creek mud. I honestly don't remember all the boats involved, but everyone would have been proud of the efforts to free the two boats (names withheld to protect ...); both successful. The afternoon sail back was in light airs with many of us motorsailing. Several boats also made side trips to the many coves along the Choptank.

"Crab au Gratin"

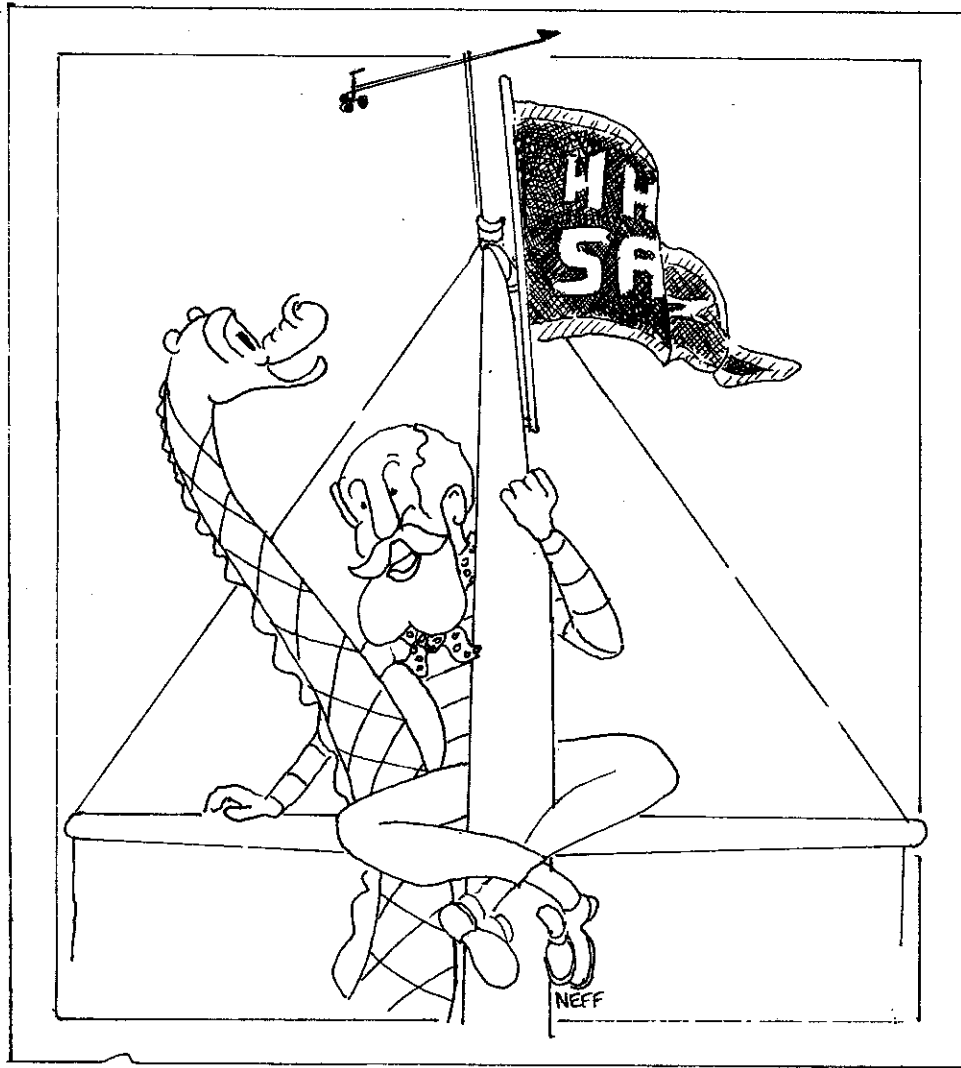
1 pound crab meat	salt to taste

## INSTRUCTIONS TO USE THE HNSA PROXY

### A. Completion

- (1) Print your name.
- (2) Print the name of the person you have appointed to vote for you.
- (3) Date the proxy.
- (4) Sign your name.

NOTE: The numbers appearing above in parentheses appear at the blanks in which the information is requested.

### B. Filing

- (1) Once completed, the proxy must be filed with the Association Secretary.
- (2) The proxy can be filed with the Secretary (a) by mail (using the Association address or the Secretary's address listed below), or (b) in person by either the member authorizing) the proxy or the individual appointed. In either situation, it is the sole responsibility of the member authorizing the proxy to have the proxy timely filed with the Association Secretary.
- (3) The proxy must be filed with the Secretary prior to the actual commencement of the Annual Meeting; (i.e., prior to the time the meeting is formally "called to order").

### C. Validity

- (1) In order for the proxy to be valid, the individual appointed must (a) be clearly stated on the proxy; (b) be present at the meeting; and (c) be a voting member of the Association in good standing.
- (2) Additionally, the proxy must be dated and signed. It must be complete as set forth in "A" above.
- (3) Solicitation of proxy votes by a member is unauthorized.
- (4) The proxy is to be used only for the Annual Meeting held on the date stated in the upper left hand corner of the proxy. Should you decide not to use the proxy, it should be destroyed.
