STATE OF THE MARINA ADDRESS

Steuart Chaney wrapped up our HHSA organizational meeting on February 7, 1987 by delivering his annual "State of the Marina" address. Harking back to last year's slip fee wrangle, Steuart reviewed the charges at other marinas and happily reported that Herrington Harbour's fees are still substnatially less than Annapolis and environs but not quite as low as what can be found in Solomons. Steuart reported that the average increase in slip fees at Herrington Harbour were around 7%. He pointed out that this was an average and slipholders in the more desirable locations recieved increases in excess of this percentage.

Steuart went over the many improvements made during the past year and touched on plans for this season.. We can look forward to the rebuilding of the D Dock and a walkway for N Dock. The channel will be dredged this Spring. This year a dredger with a more reliable dredge will do the job. A fulltime groundskeeper/dockmaster has been hired. The gentleman has years of experience in the marina business and will be keeping a watchful eye over over marina operations. Improvements are being made to the water system to improve water pressure on all the docks and the West shore washrooms. Also, a standpipe system will be installed to provide water for firehoses at the docks. The parking lots will recieve a new crushed stone topping that should reduce dust. (Environmental; regulations prohibit paving the lot.) At Herrington North, the office and stockroom will be expanded and electrical extended to all piers.

Several suggestions were offered for other improvements by HHSA members. Steuart stressed that these suggestions were always welcome and invited any other slipholders to stop by the office any time with ideas or complaints. Steuart praised HHSA for the qualitiy of its programs and reconfirmed is support of our organization. He also assured us of his continuing efforts to make Herrington Harbour the finest Marina on the Bay.

THE OLD BOAT DOCTOR

DEAR BOAT DOCTOR:

This Spring we will be fitting WHITE GULL with a new genoa on a Harken roller furling rig. We've never sailed with roller furling before. Is there any trick to it or do we do anything differently than we have in the past?

DEAR LARRY:

The one thing you won't have to do is make those hairraising trips to the pointy end to hand in the genny and set the working jib. Now, snug and secure in the safety of your very own cockpit, all you have to do is haul in on the furling line to wrap that baby up. There are however, a couple of techniques and some equipment that you will find useful. One thing that I found greatly reduced the effort required to furl the headsail was the installation of some Schaeffer stanchion mounted ball bearing blocks. These little hummers were hard to find but they really cut down the amount of friction on the furling line. The next tip is to fall off when furling in any kind of breeze so that the jib is blanketed by the main. Just be careful you don't accidentally jibe. The last tip to pass on is to keep some minimal tension on the jib sheet while you are furling to keep the jib from flogging. This not only makes it easier to furl, but also gives you a neater looking wrap. You just pull in on the furling line while paying out on the jib sheet. If anybody else has any other roller furling tips, please pass them along. Good luck and smooth sailing.
