## Member Profile: Judy Judd-Price

Judy Judd-Price has lived in 13 states and traveled to 13 countries, and she has family in Kentucky, West Virginia, Florida, and New York. But when the time came to retire in 2016, she chose Southwest.

After working at the Association of International Educators (NAFSA) in D.C. and living in Ballston, Virginia, for 12 years, she felt that the neighborhood was getting too busy and loud. As her retirement date drew near, she immediately thought of Southwest, after having lived at Tiber Island briefly when she first came to Washington.

For Judy, the fact that the neighborhood is walkable, with a wide range of public transportation options, was critical. She inherited a progressive eye condition, drusen of the optic nerve, that reduces her peripheral vision in both eyes. She stopped driving as the condition progressed, and she wanted to retain the independence that she had cultivated throughout her life. But it was also important that she knew people in the neighborhood and that there were plenty of opportunities for her to continue her life-long passion for volunteering.




