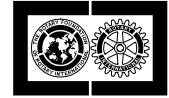

Group Study Exchange

The Group Study Exchange Program is an educational program that promotes international understanding through organized travel and personal contact. The program provides travel grants for teams of young professional men and women to exchange visits between paired areas in different countries. A GSE team consists of four non-Rotarian business or professional people and a Rotarian team leader. For four to six weeks, team members study the host country's institutions and culture, observe their own professions as practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

Ambassadorial Scholarships

Ambassadorial Scholarships were designed to further international understanding and goodwill and provide for study abroad in countries where Rotary clubs are located. During their studies abroad, Ambassadorial Scholars acted as “ambassadors of goodwill.” Through appearances before Rotary clubs and districts, schools, civic organizations and other forums, the scholars represented their homelands and work to further international understanding.

The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships program was the world’s largest privately sponsored international scholarship program. Focused on humanitarian service, personal diplomacy, and academic excellence, the program has sponsored Rotary Scholars abroad since it began in 1947. The program was terminated at the end of Rotary Year 2012-2013.

Grants are for a minimum of \$30,000 (\$15,000 from the District/Club/private and \$15,000 from Rotary International.) The program promotes Rotary's goal of world peace, goodwill, and understanding through graduate study in another country based on academic performance in one or more of the following areas of study:

1. Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
2. Disease prevention and treatment
3. Water and sanitation
4. Maternal and child health
5. Basic education and literacy
6. Economic and community development

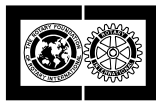
World Peace Fellowships

The **Peace Fellowship Program** promotes Rotary's goal of world peace, goodwill, and understanding. In these uncertain times, there is a growing demand for well-trained international leaders. The challenges of the 21st century require people skilled in the art of diplomacy, mediation and conflict resolution. Rotary International developed the World Peace Fellowship program to meet this need.

Rotary seeks non-Rotarian professionals interested in expanding their knowledge of peace building, conflict resolution, and mediation. Each year, Rotary selects up to 50 Fellows to study for a master's degree and up to 50 Fellows for the short-term certificate program at one of six Rotary Centers located at prestigious universities around the world.

Participants in the master's degree program gain access to:

- Rotary-funded graduate study toward a master's degree
- Training in the root causes of conflict, theories of international relations, and effective models of cooperation, conflict resolution, and negotiation

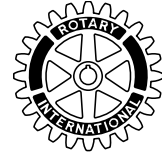

There are several important awards with which Rotary International recognizes extraordinary service. The RI **Service Above Self Award** was created by the RI Board of Directors to recognize exemplary humanitarian Rotary service in any form at any level. The RI **Service Above Self Award** is a way to recognize those who might otherwise go unrecognized, those who are living examples of *Service Above Self*.

Any Rotarian in good standing may be nominated for this award, except the following:

- District Governor
- District Governor-Elect
- Immediate Past District Governor
- RI Director
- RI Director-Elect
- Past RI Director

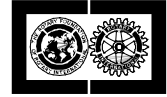

Nominees must have demonstrated exemplary *humanitarian* service, in any form and at any level, with an emphasis on *personal* volunteer efforts and *active* involvement in helping others through Rotary. The Rotary Foundation Awards



The Rotary Foundation *Citation for Meritorious Service* and *Distinguished Service Award* each recognize Rotarians for outstanding service through The Rotary Foundation. To be eligible for the *Citation for Meritorious Service Award*, one must have demonstrated active service to Rotary's Foundation over a period of more than one year.

Four years after receiving this award, a Rotarian becomes eligible for the *Distinguished Service Award*. This is the Foundation's highest service recognition and therefore a Rotarian's exemplary service to the Foundation must extend beyond the district level or over an extended period of time. The Trustees approve only 50 Distinguished Service Awards worldwide each year.
