May Business Meeting Minutes

Greg Hester, President, called the business meeting of the Lone Star Corvette Club to order. There were approximately 100 members in attendance. Greg thanked Shrimpers of Fort Worth for providing the food for the meeting. Greg announced that the deadline for submitting articles for the June newsletter will be extended to May 27 to include news about the Classic. He then introduced the 2006 Club officers. Sandy Conwell asked for a motion to approve the April minutes as published in the May newsletter; the motion was approved.

Mr. Hester welcomed new members/guests. Terry Garrett asked for a motion to approve new members who signed up in April; the motion was approved. He also stated that the new directory will be published in July; if any members have changes in their information, get in touch with him.

Tim Dowding presented the April financial statement. Beginning balance was \$29,793.46 with deposits of \$29,338.05 and expenses of \$8,123.59, leaving a balance of \$51,007.92 as of April 30, 2006. Tim stated that the majority of deposits represent Classic monies. He then asked for a motion to approve the financial statement as presented; the motion was approved. Lou Opipare announced that as of today's meeting there are 381 registrants for the Classic totaling \$35,700. Although last year at this time there were 410 registrants, we are currently higher in monies received. Greg asked the Classic Coordinators to come forward and introduce themselves and state what area they were responsible for and if they needed additional volunteers. Greg mentioned that the Texas Motor Speedway has declared that no alcohol is allowed on premises during any Classic activity. He asked Lou to put a notice of this mandate in registration packets.

Greg mentioned that Charlie Magill is again hosting a Summer Bash picnic at his home on June 24. Charlie will put an article with all details and directions in the June newsletter.

Greg Hester adjourned the business meeting.

The street numbers will be seen on a brick column at the entranceway. The house sits back about 300 feet from the street and has lots of trees in the yard. A pond is in front of the house. The security gate will be open for this day for the ease of entering and leaving. There will be plenty of parking down back of the house in the pasture if need be. 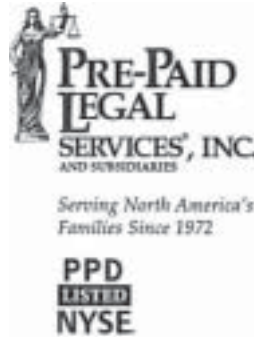

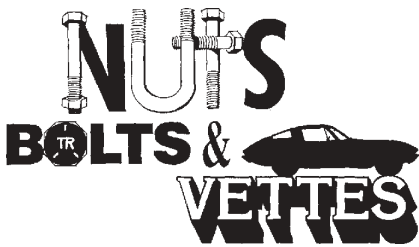
