OFFICIAL START TIME

The official event start time is 12pm Friday 3rd October 2025. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations, & Veterinary Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules. Please note Dressage NZ rule 420-430, prohibited gear is not allowed from the time of arrival at the event.

Gate 2 off Kawakawa Rd, Feilding.

STABLE & YARDING

Moving horses to unallocated yards or stables is prohibited.

The Stable Manager only may authorise stabling and yarding changes.

Do not put shavings or any type of bedding in the Covered or open yards.

Please make sure horse poo goes in skips provided and other rubbish goes in rubbish bins.

Wash down bays - Adjacent to work in area, please keep.

All yards and stables are to be left properly mucked out. If not a fee of \$50 will be charged.

TRUCK PARKING

If the ground in the stable compound is too wet there will be no vehicle access.

No vehicle access to Stable compound via Gate A.

If you have not booked power, please be courteous and do not park close to the power boxes.

All visitors are to park in the public car park off South Street.

If grass is too wet to park on you may park in the car park at the back of the stadium but no horses are allowed.

ALCOHOL

The consumption of alcohol is limited to the truck park. No alcohol is to be consumed, or open containers carried around the competition areas and buildings.

Horse/Pony ID Numbers (DR Art 429): From time of arrival on the grounds, approved Horse/Pony official identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse/pony at all times during warm up and competition, and when being ridden or led in arena familiarization. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact must be worn in or out of the stable/yard at all other times.

1. Dogs must be kept in the truck park at all times
2. No dogs are allowed in any stable or yarding areas, warm up, competition areas or buildings
3. Dogs may be exercised on the Manfeild Park Oval which is a designated dog exercise area.
4. Failure to adhere to these rulings will result in a complete dog ban.
5. The dog must be on a lead at all times
6. The owner of the dog will be responsible for the cost of any damage/harm caused by the dog at the competition.
7. Failure to comply with the above rulings will result in a \$100 fine which much be paid for by the dog owner
8. This owner must pay this fine to be allowed to continue riding in the competition

There will be an unmounted prizegiving Saturday evening for the Zilco and Super 5 classes held that day. See the notice board for more details.

Sunday prizegiving will be unmounted and will be advertised on the notice board.

- All Competition Arenas are closed at all times other than designated below. Times are planned to provide equal opportunity for all riders, to ensure that all areas can be stewarded, to maintain the surface as the best competition surface possible and provide adequate preparation time. Please note times below may be adjusted by the Organising Committee if circumstances deem it necessary.
- Once competition arenas have been put up no horse may work inside them without permission from the Technical Delegate.
- **Lunging is not permitted on any part of all-weather surface**
- Arena familiarization is not intended to be used as a full schooling session. Riders need to be considerate of other riders wishing to familiarize their horses.
- Horses may be hand walked or ridden at walking pace only around the exterior of the arenas unless advised otherwise by the Technical Delegate.
- Any person leading a horse in an arena familiarisation, must be wearing a correctly fitting yellow tagged helmet. All horses being lead must be wearing a bridle with a permitted bit, and with two bridle numbers. A newmarket lead may replace the reins for this purpose.
- If the use of the full arena is allowed, then riders may not hand lead their horse inside the arena or lead another horse.

Equine Therapists and Treatment

- Equine therapists or practitioners who are not veterinarians and intend to provide therapeutic treatment to equines at the event must register their attendance with the Organising Committee / FEI Vet Delegate prior to any treatment to the event.
- Only permitted Equine Therapist are permitted to carry out restricted therapies, must be appropriately qualified in the field they are offering services and should be able to provide verification to OC/stewards if requested.
- Athletes, Persons responsible and their support team (other persons responsible) are permitted to carry out non-restricted therapies with their own their equipment (e.g. Equissage, Cyclossage or similar) if and are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems and carry out other non-restricted at the event.
