Fees and Levies:

All horses and riders are required to be registered with ESNZ if entering series and age group classes

Casual Memberships will be accepted for open classes as per the ESNZ levy table.

ESNZ LEVIES

Show Levies:

Group Levy - \$30.00 Per Horse

Medic Levy - \$30.00 Per Rider

Admin fee - \$10.00 Per Rider

Camping:

Powered camping sites are \$50.00 for the show (these are limited)

Yarding:

Open yards - \$30.00 Per Horse for the duration of the show

Covered yards/Stables - \$60.00 Per Horse for the duration of the show

Premier Stables - \$180.00 Per Horse for the duration of the show

(Limited and therefore allocated on a performance basis/teams)

All yarded and stabled equines must have a name tag visible with contact details as per the ESNZ Jumping rules.

All stallions on the grounds including day trippers must be in a stallion box when not competing. Strict adherence to stallion handling rules will apply.

All horses on the grounds must be supervised by someone.

Other

The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Committee reserves the right to evict and eliminate anyone who is acting in an unacceptable manner. Security may be patrolling the grounds.

All classes run under current ESNZ rules. For rules specific to Young Horse Jumping Championships, please refer to Annex 8.C

The young Horse Ring 1 and Ring 2 will be run in draw order. The Young Horse Ring 1 takes priority.

The Committee reserves the right to alter the programme, the prize money and any other items.

Prize money for non-series classes will be paid out on 1:7 ratio of starters

All entry fees and prize money are GST Inclusive

Formal attire is to be worn in the Young Horse Ring and Ring Two

All riders must have the correctly tagged helmet as per ESNZ rules

If you are expecting to be arriving early, can you please let us know.

Push bikes only with a helmet that is secured.

It is the responsibility of the registered truck and float owners to ensure that their vehicles are compliant with all the current laws

If a truck or float are being slept in, it is the responsibility of the registered vehicle owner to ensure there is a fire extinguisher on board.

No bareback riding at any time on the grounds over the duration of the show.

Parking - Due to new requirements of the Tomoana Show Grounds, truck and floats are to be parked 3.5m apart

Media: By entering or attending this competition, you accept that you may appear within differing media streams that are on location covering the event. Your behaviour at the event and within the competition arena is at your discretion and is your responsibility. Please note that there may be live streaming at the event.

No Dogs allowed on the grounds - this is a condition of the grounds.

No smoking or vaping on the grounds

No Unauthorised vehicles are allowed on the arena

Stallions - Persons over 18 years old and with experience with stallions may only be responsible for stallions.

Competitions

4 Year Old Jumping Championship

The horses in this class will be given arena familiarization prior to the start of the competition. Time to be advised. Up to 5 in the arena at once and only walk and trot. Please show respect for fellow competitors.

TIES Jumping Futurity Series

Entry criteria – horse to be in its first or second consecutive season in ESNZ competition.

They must be registered with ESNZ for the first time from 1 April 2024 onwards.

Special Awards

Scoring is calculated on the horses placed in the top 6 in the final of each age group show jumping title class.

These being the 4, 5, 6 and 7 year old finals

First place receives 6 points and 6th place receives 1 point

The awards are for:

- Leading Stallion
- Leading Breeder
- Leading Rider (Trevor Gregory Cup)
The Best Performed Mare will be the highest placed mare in the Grand Prix. In the event of no mares competing in the Grand Prix, then it will be the highest placed mare in the FEI 1* class.

Main Events 1.10 Series Competition

This show is part of the Main-Events 1.10m Series. Placing's in 1.10m classes may contribute towards end-of-season jackpot prize draws.

Health and Safety

This event is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this. We will take all practicable steps by:

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment, and proper materials.
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of eliminate, isolate, or minimise.
- Insisting upon establishment of safe methods and best practices.
- Complying with all H&S legislation, regulations, and codes of practice.

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy. EVERY PERSON involved in our show is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Ensuring safe and proper use of equipment.
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Not tying horses to floats or trucks on the grounds unless day trippers
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- Ensuring ALL accidents and incidents are reported to a Health & Safety Officer at the Office.
- Helping new employees, trainees, and visitors to understand the safety procedures and why they exist.
- Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and falls.
- NO prams or children in the warm up areas

COMPETITORS are responsible for themselves at ALL times and must observe the safe practices and the rules/instructions relating to their competition. In case of a fall of an athlete and/or horse at any time in the competition arena, in the practice arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the events medical service and the check recorded on your event medical check card before you are permitted to take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). The card must remain in your pocket and be presented to the gate steward or ground committee before continuing to compete. The horse must be cleared by the Veterinarian or President of the Ground Jury and one other official if the Veterinarian is not available, before the equine is permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). Northern Hawkes Bay Jumping Group complies with the ESNZ concussion policy.

ESNZ's Blue Card process has been developed to keep riders safe and to support officials in their duty of care.

Officials can exclude a rider from participating in a competition or entire event by issuing a Blue Card because the rider has received a concussion or suspected concussion.

If a rider issued with a Blue Card at an event refuses to withdraw from the event, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations

The Blue Card notice is logged on a rider's profile on ESNZ's database.

A Blue Card means that a rider is stood down from all riding activities until clearance from a registered GP or registered medical specialist can be obtained.

If a rider who has been issued with a Blue Card competes without first providing medical clearance, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the ESNZ disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
