Important Information

- 1) **ESNZ Registration for Graded Classes:** Entries will not be accepted without membership as follows to 1 December 2025.
 - Preliminary: Riders must have an ESNZ Introductory Child or Full Competitive membership.
 - Novice and Above: Riders must have an ESNZ Child or Full Competitive membership.
 - Horse and Ponies: Must have ESNZ Horse/pony registration. May compete on an Annual Dressage Start (purchased on Horse Reg) or use Flexi Start at \$5 per Test (payable with entries).
- 2) **ESNZ Registration for Non-Graded Classes:** All Riders must be a Child, Full or Introductory ESNZ member current to 1 December 2025 or pay a Casual membership fee of \$16.30 per event. Horses and Ponies may be registered or non-registered
- 3) **Annual Dressage Start** is required to enter all National Series, National Championships, Horse of the Year and international events. All other classes may be entered using a discipline Flexi start.
- 4) **Gold Silver Bronze, Amateur, Pony, Young Rider, Restricted & Non-Graded Classes** – These classes will **not** be offered at this show.
- 5) **Rules:** AMDG Premier League competitions will be run under the current ESNZ GR's, VR's & ESNZ Rules for Dressage/Para Equestrian.
- 6) **Official start time:** The official event start time is 12.00 pm Friday 28 November 2025. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules. Please note Dressage NZ Articles 420-430 prohibited gear is not allowed from the time of arrival at the event.
- 7) **Official finish time:** The official finish time will be 60 minutes after the completion of the last class or 60 minutes after the completion of all presentations for the event whichever is later.
- 8) **Protests & Complaints:** Protests and complaints may be considered by the Ground Jury at an event in accordance with Art 137 of the ESNZ General Regulations. As a guideline only, protests must be lodged within 60 minutes of the completion of the competition to which the protest relates, and a complaint within 60 minutes of the completion of the event. The Ground Jury is the sole judge of time in both cases. For complete rules and official documentation required, please refer to:

- 9) **Qualifiers:** Premier League Shows are qualifiers for Horse of the Year and Bates National Dressage Championships.
- 10) **Dressage NZ Leagues/Series:** Horses/Ponies must have an annual start for Dressage to gain points in any Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyle Series, Prestige Futures Prize, AMS Saddlery Pony, Young Rider & U25 Performance Leagues, or Top 10 League. Riders must register online at Evo Events prior to 1st December 2025 for inclusion in any Top 10 League, Prestige Dressage Futures Prize, AMS Saddlery Pony, Young Rider & U25 Performance Leagues. - 11) **Tests:** All tests from DNZ Test book version 2023 or FEI Website,

- 12) **Super 5 Tests:** Must be ridden from memory, no caller is permitted
- 13) **FEI Tests:** Must be ridden from memory, no caller is permitted



Event Conditions

- 1) **Amendments:** The organising committee reserves the right to refuse entries, cancel the event, alter the programme/schedule and/or prize money within the ESNZ and DNZ /Para Equestrian rules.
- 2) **Presentation of Special Awards, Prizes and Prize Money:** See DNZ Rule article 456.
 - a. All riders must attend advertised presentations. The organising committee (OC) reserves the right to withhold awards should a placegetter not attend an advertised prize giving.

- b. Awards must be collected on the day as will not be posted to recipients after the event.
- c. Riders who win Champion or Reserve Champion must be present at prize giving to receive their awards in support of sponsors.
- d. In lieu of prizemoney, the OC has reduced the show levy fee for each rider. *(This was the preferred option in responses to the rider survey 2023.)*

- 3) **Prize Givings:** Unmounted for all Champions & Reserves, Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyles and Para. All other classes collect rosettes from office at completion of the class.
- 4) **Draw:** If required, a revised draw and / or start times for the following day's competition will be available by 7.30 pm each evening prior on the results board and EvoEvents www.evoevents.co.nz. It is the rider's responsibility to check any new times posted - including potential arena changes.
- 5) All outstanding amounts from any previous Dressage NZ Events must be paid before entries will be confirmed.
- 6) **Scratchings during the Event** - Must be notified online via EvoEvents or by email to the Event Secretary (before 9pm). Refer to Withdrawals and Refunds Policy on page 7.
- 7) **Stabling Refunds:** Where stabling requests cannot be met, refunds will be made via internet banking after the show.
- 8) **Equal Placings:** In the case of equality in any qualifying class, the higher collective marks will determine the higher placing. If the competitors are still equal, then the higher coefficient marks will determine the placings. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing.
- 9) **Riders with more than 2 horses:** Maximum of two starts per day per horse/pony. Maximum of 6 tests per day per rider. The OC will make every effort to ensure that riders have at least 60 minutes between rides. However, if this is not possible owing to the scheduling of classes, maximum time possible between rides will be allocated.
- 10) **Helmets:** ESNZ tagged approved riding helmets must be worn at all times when mounted, at all levels during the competition.
- 11) **Non Competing Horses:** All horses and ponies on the grounds after the official start time must be entered at the event unless the organising committee gives permission otherwise.
- 12) **Media:** AMDG, Dressage NZ and ESNZ reserve the right to use event photographs for marketing, publicity, advertising, funding applications as they see fit. Competitors and/or participants will receive no remuneration for this. All images remain the property of AMDG.
- 13) **Musical Freestyles:** All riders must upload their music for their freestyle by Wednesday 26th November 2025. A wav. file is the preferred format (best quality) however an mp3 file is also acceptable.
Note: This upload is event specific so you will need to upload to this event even if you have uploaded to a previous event.

Procedure on EVOEVENTS

- a) Once you have entered the show go to My Entries.
- b) Click the 'More' button beside the show.
- c) Enter a description for the music.
- d) Select the file type called "Music for MFS".
- e) Select the class and horse
- f) Select the file to upload from your own computer.
- g) Press the 'Upload Your Document' button.



- 14) Stallions must comply with ESNZ Article 133 and must be housed in a stable at all times.
- 15) **Liability:**
 - a) Competitors and spectators attending this event do so at their own risk.
 - b) Clevedon A&P, Dressage NZ or AMDG nor any representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse/pony/rider, spectators, land, vehicles or any personal property whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way whatsoever.
 - c) Clevedon A&P, Dressage NZ or AMDG will not be liable for the safety or security of goods/equipment or the loss of, damage to such, brought in/stored at the venue, during the event.
- 16) **Health & Safety:**
 - a) Dressage NZ and AMDG are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all participants, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.
 - b) Competitors must comply with appropriate Legislation and Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.
 - c) Each Competitor and/or exhibitor must always supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the Event

- d) All competitors and associated staff/visitors to the venue must abide by the ESNZ/Dressage NZ Rules, AMDG and Clevedon A&P Health & Safety Policies.
- e) Copies of the event Health & Safety policy can be found at the event office.
- f) Any incident or near miss must be reported to event office and an incident form completed.
- g) Any hazards identified must be reported to event office.
- h) Competitors will be responsible for their safety at all times and must observe safe practices and following event rules and officials' instructions at all times, ensuring that others are not put at risk by their actions.

17) ESNZ Concussion Policy:

- b) Dressage NZ policy requires all riders to report to the Medical Officer or Steward following a fall.
- c) Medical clearance must be obtained before remounting, competing or leaving the grounds.

18) ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy - ESNZ reserve the right to drug or alcohol test any participant at the event under the ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy. This link will access the policy and frequently asked question.

19) Event Cancellation due to unforeseen circumstances

The OC will determine the amount of refund based on any committed payments incurred for the show. No refund of Show Levy or EvoEvent fees.

Entry Conditions

- 1) Entries Close **Sunday 9 November 2025**. Late fees will apply for all unpaid entries after this date.
- 2) Entry will not be accepted until payment is made. Combinations will only be entered in the competition draw once full payment of entry and other fees has been received and registrations are correct. Methods of payment on EvoEvents for AMDG are via Poli or Credit card only (STRIPE). Credit card payments will attract a card transaction fee.
- 3) Enter online at www.evoevents.co.nz. Emailed, text or phone entries will not be accepted.
- 4) Maximum of two starts per day per horse/pony. Maximum of 6 tests per day per rider
- 5) Scratchings - Must be notified online via EvoEvents or by email to the Event Secretary (before 9pm). Refer to Refunds and Scratchings Policy on page 7.
- 6) Late Entries – Please contact Event Secretary amdgsportmanager@gmail.com. Late entries may be waitlisted. There is a \$20.00 per class late entry fee and proof of payment and correct registration is required before the entry will be placed in the draw.
- 7) Problems - If access to enter the event has been closed on EvoEvents, or there are any problems, please email Event Secretary amdgsportmanager@gmail.com.
- 8) Changes after 17 November 2025 will incur a \$20 fee per class change and we will only be able to provide changes if possible. No changes after Friday 21 November 2025.
- 9) Draw will be available at www.evoevents.co.nz
- 10) HELD payments will incur a late penalty fee if unpaid at close of entries. If entry remains unpaid or withdrawn, compulsory fees will be debited to your account.
- 11) Waitlist entries – Class numbers will be limited to 30 and entries will be accepted in order of receipt of payment of entry fees. Where classes are oversubscribed, preference will be given to riders entering the tests required to contest a level championship, with others being waitlisted. Riders will be advised if they are waitlisted.

Prizemoney – Our allocated prizemoney budget has been applied to each competitor to reduce show levy fees from \$65 to \$35.

Competition Arena Use & Familiarisation

- 1) All Competition Arenas are closed at all times except as stated below
- 2) Arena familiarisation is not intended to be used as a schooling session.
- 3) Companion horses may be led around the outside of the warmup area.
- 4) Riders need to be considerate of other riders wishing to familiarise their horses.
- 5) Lunging is not permitted on the all weather arenas – we will advise the lunging area in rider notes.
- 6) Horses may be hand walked or ridden at walking pace around the exterior of the competition arena unless advised otherwise by the Technical Delegate.
 - a. All horses being led must wear a bridle with a permitted bit. A newmarket lead may replace the reins for this purpose.
 - b. All handlers leading horses must wear a correctly fitting yellow tagged helmet irrespective of age.
 - c. Approved Dressage NZ Horse/Pony identification numbers must be worn on both sides at all times when warming up, competing and when being ridden or led in Arena Familiarisation.
- 7) Arena Familiarisation time, Friday 28 November 5-6pm. Saturday prior to first test - these times may be amended, please check times in rider notes provided with the draw.

Para Equestrian Championship (PE)

Entry Conditions – Refer to General Conditions for the event plus for Para Classes please note:

- 1) This event is run under ESNZ Para Equestrian Rules, ESNZ General Rules and regulations and ESNZ Dressage Rules where applicable.
- 2) All riders must be current full financial members of ESNZ at time of entry and current until at least 1 December 2025.
- 3) All horses must have ESNZ registration at time of entry and current until at least 1 December 2025.
- 4) **Annual Dressage Start or flexi start for each class entered is required.**
- 5) All PE riders must have a current FEI or ESNZ ID card, a copy of which must be carried at all times while riding.
- 6) ESNZ, Dressage NZ & ESNZ Para Equestrian rules apply from time of arrival where applicable.
- 7) All riders are to display the Official Orange Para Badge on each side of their saddle cloth at all times while schooling, hacking or competing as well as the horse's ESNZ registration number on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth.
- 8) All tests are the current versions that are on the ESNZ or FEI website.
- 9) A horse may not be shared by different riders between PE & able-bodied classes.
- 10) A horse may be shared by riders of different grades in PE classes as per Para-Equestrian Rules Article 166.
- 11) While every effort will be made to accommodate riders wishing to compete in both PE and AB classes and to accommodate PE riders with more than one horse, the smooth running of the event is paramount, and should there be excessive entries or timetabling issues, then riders may be asked to nominate which horse/discipline they want to compete in.
- 12) No more than two tests per day per horse/rider combination can be entered.
- 13) Depending on timetable requirements classes may be held in a different daily order.
- 14) All Para tests count toward the title for each grade. There will be one overall Champion. The rider who achieves the highest combined percentages in any grade, over all tests will be the Para-Equestrian Champion. Class rosettes will be awarded per grade.

15) Prizegiving times to be confirmed and will be announced during the event.

Withdrawals and Refunds

Auckland Manukau Dressage Championship Scratching Policy

- 1) There will be no refunds of any fees if withdrawal/scratching is not notified to the event secretary prior to the commencement of competition on the first day the horse or pony is scheduled to compete.
- 2) Applications for refund must be submitted in writing stating rider name, ESNZ registrations and horses name/s to Event Secretary amdgsportmanager@gmail.com. The date your email is received will be the date your refund is calculated from. Final date for refund applications – Sunday 14 December 2025.
- 3) Refunds will be processed as soon as possible after the show.

Conditions of withdrawal received before or on the date of close of entries (Sunday 9 November 2025)

All fees refunded 100% excluding rider show levy fee and EvoEvent Fees.

Conditions of withdrawal received after close of entries (Monday 10 November 2025)

- Camping fees will be 100% refunded in all cases.
- Yard or stabling fees will be refunded 100%
- EvoEvent and show levy fees will not be refunded.
- If a doctor or vet certificate is provided the horse facility fee, class entry fees, late entry (if applicable) will be refunded less 20%.
- Competitors unable to provide a vet or doctors certificate will receive no horse facility fee, class entry fees, late entry (if applicable).
- If vet certificate provided, only the horse to which the certificate applies will receive a refund.
- If doctors certificate provided fees for all horses for that rider will be refunded.
- Special applications for refunds can be presented to the OC for consideration.
- If event cancelled due to Covid-19, OC will refund riders an amount excluding Show Event Levy, Booking Fees and committed payments for the show to date.



Championship Eligibility Points

Preliminary – Grand Prix & Pony Preliminary - Elementary

- 1) Combinations are eligible for one level of Championship only and must compete in all qualifying classes.
- 2) Championship points are allocated 20 for 1st, to 1 for 20th. Points will not be awarded on scores less than 57%.
- 3) Champions and Reserves: The horse with the highest aggregate allocated points from specified classes within the level will be the Championship winner. In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest place in the Super 5 test is the winner. If there is still a tie, the combination with the highest aggregate collective marks in the Super 5 test will be the winner. If there is a further tie, the combination with the highest average % in overall tests combined will be the winner.

High Performance DNZ Youth Classic Series Entry Conditions 2025-26

To promote FEI level participation in FEI Pony, Junior, Young Rider & 16 -25GP tests.

All FEI tests are the current versions on the FEI Website, please check for updates that may be applicable after 1 January 2026. Copies of the FEI tests can be downloaded from

Eligibility

Combinations may only enter one section at each event

Riders on ponies may enter the Junior Section at events until 28th February 2026 but not in the CDI-J at Bates National Championships or HOY.

1) Pony Riders: All qualifying competitions will be run under ESNZ/DNZ rules, refer DNZ Article 403

National Competitions: October 2025 – February 2026. Qualifying Competitions Until 28 February 2026 – Under ESNZ/DNZ Rules

2) Junior: Riders must turn at least 14yrs during 2025 and be 18yrs or under at 28th February 2026

3) Young Rider: Riders must turn at least 16yrs during 2025 and be 21yrs or under at 28th February 2026

4) 16-25 Grand Prix: Riders must turn at least 16yrs during 2025 and be 25yrs or under at 31st January 2026

Competitions under FEI Rules National Championships & Horse of the Year

5) For CDI-J, CDI-Y, U25GP events at Bates National Championships and HOY, FEI rules will apply. See Appendix A of FEI General Regulations.

ESNZ and FEI Horse Registration Requirements for Series

- All participating horses and ponies must be ESNZ registered and have an Annual Dressage Start.
- For CDI-J, YR, U25 events at Bates National Champs and Horse of the Year, Horse and Rider registration is required. 2026 FEI horse and Rider registrations will be open on HorseReg in December 2025

- Note new FEI registrations may take up to 3 weeks to process, please ensure these are actioned by the 1st February 2026.

High Performance DNZ Youth Classic Series Points

1) Points are attributed to combination not the horse.

2) Points will be allocated as follows

- Scores of 70 plus % - gain 10 points
- Scores of 65 – 69.999% gain 7 points
- Scores of 60 – 64.999% gain 5 points
- Scores of 57 – 59.99% gain 3 points.

3) The winner in each section will be determined by the combinations Top 5 EVENT scores i.e Combinations may compete in more than five EVENTS and points will be recorded, but when the winners are determined, only the scores from the BEST 5 EVENTS will count

4) In the event of a tie the average percentage from the combination's top 3 scores from Horse of Year will count

Presentations

1) Series class rosettes provided for 1st – 3rd place in each level at qualifying events.

2) The following national presentations will be made at the Dressage NZ Awards Dinner

- Series Champions and reserves in all four divisions will be awarded Sashes and a presentation rug. The combination with the highest points will be deemed the winner.

Horse Identification, Venue, Stabling, Accommodation Conditions

- 1) Horse/Pony ID Numbers (DR Art 429): Approved Horse/Pony official identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse/pony at all times during warm up and competition, and when being ridden or led in arena familiarization. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact must be worn in or out of the stable/yard at all other times.
- 2) All yards and stables are to be left properly mucked out. If not a fee of \$50 will be charged.
- 3) Temporary yarding must comply with ESNZ rules.
- 4) Stallions must comply with ESNZ Article 133 and must be housed in a stable at all times.
- 5) Please keep wash down bays clean at all times.
- 6) Moving horses to unallocated yards or stables is prohibited without permission of the Stable Manager.
- 7) Please use the separate skips provided for horse waste. Skips bins in front of yards for horse manure ONLY. No dumping of horse manure around plants (Council regulation). Do not put rubbish in these bins and no manure above top edge of bin.
- 8) Rubbish – Please take your rubbish home with you. There will be no rubbish bins on site.
- 9) Truck entry off 107 Monument Road, Gate 6. Please ensure tape gate across bridge is shut **AT ALL TIMES**
- 10) Damage to Clevedon A&P Showground facilities must be reported to the AMDG Event Office and may incur

charges.

- 11) **Riders Leaving the Grounds** - Any rider who leaves the grounds for ANY amount of time over the weekend must nominate a person to be responsible for their horse(s) in their absence. Form available at office to be completed by both the rider and the new person responsible prior to the rider leaving the grounds. Anyone found to be in breach of this rule will be eliminated from the event.
- 12) If yard bookings exceed availability, there will be a waiting list and competitors will be advised by email when a yard becomes available. Stables, CY and open yards will be allocated in the following order of preference; Stallions, distance, higher level horses. There will be no allocation for local riders. Offsite yarding may be available.
- 13) No smoking or vaping in any buildings or stable areas.

Dogs

- 1) Dogs must be kept in the truck park at all times and on a lead at all times.
- 2) No dogs are allowed in any stable or yarding areas, warm up, competition areas or buildings
- 3) The owner of the dog will be responsible for the cost of any damage/harm caused by the dog at the competition.
- 4) These rules will be enforced by event elimination of the rider associated with the offending dog.

Camping & Parking

- 1) Parking and camping areas may be defined. Some areas will be restricted to on site camping/parking only.
- 2) Day competitors must park in designated day parking areas
- 3) Please be tidy and take all your rubbish home with you. No rubbish bins on site.
- 4) Please do not dump any waste / gray water.
- 5) Please be considerate to others around you and minimise noise after 10pm.

Vehicles & Access

- 1) Access to venue is only available from Gate 6, 107 Monument Road. Speed limit for all vehicles 15 kph.
- 2) Motorbikes must not be used after 8.30 pm and must be used in accordance with normal road rules.
- 3) Persons under 16 yrs may not use motorbikes.
- 4) Approved safety helmets must be worn when riding motorbikes at all times.
- 5) Joy riding on any part of the grounds at any time will not be tolerated
- 6) Any competitor contravening these rules will be immediately eliminated from any further participation in the event.
- 7) Bicycle helmets must be worn in accordance with NZ road rules.
- 8) Electric bikes & scooters must be used with extreme caution near horses. Must be ridden on driveways only.



Professional Services

1) Equine Therapists and Treatment

- a) Any equine therapists or practitioners who are not veterinarians and intend to provide therapeutic treatment to equines in any capacity at this event on a private or commercial basis must register their attendance with the Organising Committee prior to any treatment at the event.
- b) Only permitted Equine Therapists are permitted to carry out restricted therapies, must be appropriately qualified in the field they are offering services and should be able to provide verification to OC/stewards if requested.
- c) Athletes, Persons responsible and their support team (other persons responsible) are permitted to carry out non-restricted therapies with their own their equipment (e.g. Equissage, Cyclossage or similar) if and are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems and carry out other non-restricted at the event.
- d) Any practitioner receiving financial or other gain from providing therapies at the event will be required to pay a trade exhibitor fee at the discretion of the Organising Committee.

2) Other Professionals including freelance grooms & photographers

Any other party intending on providing services or trade at this event must obtain prior agreement from the Organising Committee – this excludes professional Dressage Coaches assisting in the warmup of competitors and

grooms that are in part or full time employment of a competitor.
