

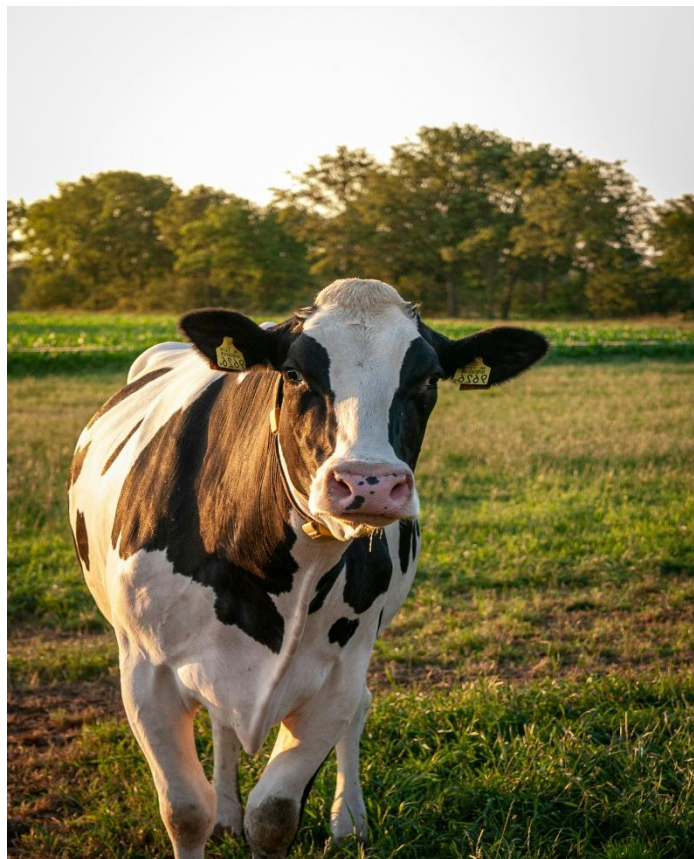

REGULATIONS

1. Gate Admission Charges: Adults \$10, Children 14 and under free.
2. All entries must be made in the name of the bonafide owner or manufacturer of exhibits.
3. All entries must be made in writing on the regulation form supplied in the schedule together with the entry fees. Events in which exhibit is shown must be stated, and signed by exhibitor or person authorised
4. **The receipts for entry money or tickets must be produced on demand to gatekeepers or exhibitor will not be admitted.**
5. All persons admitted to the grounds shall be subject to the Rules and Orders of the Committee.
6. The Judges are empowered to withhold any prize if they are of the opinion that insufficient merit does not exist to justify an award.
7. No animals, implements etc. will be allowed on the grounds, excepting those entered by permission of the Stewards.
All protests must be in writing, accompanied by a deposit of \$10, and lodged with the Secretary within thirty minutes of the award being made. In the event of any protest, the entry or entries concerned must not be removed from the grounds without permission of the Chief Steward. The Committee will decide all protests and there will be no appeal from the decision. In the event of the protest not being upheld, the deposit shall be forfeited to the Society.
8. **Should the receipts of the Society suffer severely owing to unforeseen circumstances the Committee reserves the right to reduce the prize money.**
9. The Committee reserves the right to substitute donations in cash or trophies or produce in equal value in place of advertised prizes.
10. No person other than officials shall be allowed to ride or drive in the grounds, except when leaving or entering.
11. The Society will not be responsible for any accident in competitions or that may occur from machinery or other exhibits or plants belonging to exhibitors, competitors or the Society and it is a condition of entry that such exhibitor or visitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings issuing from any accidents so caused.
12. **That any person or organisation anticipating raffle sales on the grounds notifies the Secretary 30 days prior to the show, in writing.**
13. That no person or animals shall cause damage to the grounds or trees.
14. No dogs allowed on the grounds unless on a leash.
15. **A FULL COPY OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE**
16. NO SMOKING OR VAPING on the grounds/venue.
17. Disclaimer: Katikati A&P Society has made every effort to ensure the information contained in this document is true and correct at the time of publication, however, Katikati A&P Society has the right to change any details deemed necessary for the good of the Show



HORSE REGULATIONS

ALL horses to enter through Crossley Street NOT Philip Walter Drive.

STALLIONS AND COLTS: Stallions or colts cannot compete at this show.

HEIGHT CERTIFICATE: A current RAS height certificate must accompany you the rider in all classes where height is a climate of eligibility. Please take them with you.

AGE RESTRICTIONS: Age of Riders and Horse/Ponies are as at **1 August 2025**
Horses/Ponies 3 years and under must not be ridden

WHISKER AND EAR TRIMMING: Whisker and Ear trimming requirement (for more information see: [ht/www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/](http://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/))

HELMETS: HELMETS MUST BE TAGGED, YELLOW TAG TO BE SHOWN. Tags available on show day. (www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/)

PROTESTS: All protests must be in writing, accompanied by a deposit of ten dollars (\$10) and lodged with the Chief Steward within THIRTY MINUTES of the award being made. In the event of any protest, the entry or entries concerned must not be removed from the grounds without the permission of the Chief Steward. The committee will decide all protests and there will be no appeal relating to their decision. In the event of the protest not being upheld, the deposit shall be forfeited to the Society. Videos will be permitted evidence during the Committee's deliberations.

CLEAN SPORT: The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Clean Sport Judicial Committee (CSJC) procedures and rules.

RAS IN LINE RESOLUTION PROCESS POLICY. The Katikati A & P Show will be operating under the RAS RESOLUTION POLICY. Any abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour towards judges, officials, other competitors or the public may result in the president and officials issuing a Yellow or Red Card and subsequent action via the RAS.

HEALTH & SAFETY: All entrants must comply with the Katikati A & P Society's Health and Safety policies.

SEPARATE RINGS WILL OPERATE FOR HORSES AND PONIES SIMULTANEOUSLY.

KATIKATI A&P SOCIETY CONCUSSION STATEMENT AND PROCEDURE

INTRODUCTION

Over recent years there has been elevated public awareness of sport-related concussion and increased focus on the importance of diagnosing and managing the condition promptly, safely and appropriately.

"Falling from horse" are one of the biggest hazards; falls also represent a large percentage of the 350 cases of head injuries reported to ACC last year in relation to horse riding. It is also suspected that only about half of concussion cases are reported and with the potentially serious and long-term consequences of concussion, it is imperative that we take some action.

CONSEQUENCES OF CONCUSSION

A rider must not be allowed to remount after a fall on the day of the show. Irrespective of the wishes of their parents/guardian or coach.

DEFINITION

Concussion is a type of brain injury, induced by a force to the head or anywhere on the body, which transmits an impulsive force to the head. It commonly causes short-lived neurological impairment and the symptoms may evolve over the hours and days following the injury.

Short term

Short term consequences can include physical, physiological and mental issues. Patients with a concussion can have headaches, poor cognition, poor coordination, reduced physical performance and alteration of mood (more specifically depression). People who have had a concussion in other sports are 8 times as likely to suffer a significant musculoskeletal injury within that game if they continue to play, and over the next six months have a 40% increased risk of musculoskeletal injury compared to a non-concussed cohort.

Long term

There is no direct evidence of long term deficits following exposure to concussion in cricket. However, recent research into the long term consequence of Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) has suggested that profound neurodegenerative changes may be a consequence of repeated moderate TBI such as those seen in boxing and traumatic / contact sports including Rugby, often referred to as Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy

WHY WE NEED CONCUSSION GUIDELINES

- Concussion is a serious injury that occurs frequently and can have serious both short and long term consequences
- Estimated 35,000 head injuries in New Zealand per year
- 21% (7,350 injuries per year) of all head injuries in New Zealand are sustained through sport related activity. ACC only receive claims for 6,250 of those sports related concussion injuries suggesting that 1,100 currently go untreated.
- 2009-2013 sports related concussion claims cost ACC \$76 million.
- 46% (3,381 injuries per year) of sports head injuries are classified as 'mild with a high risk of complications'. Injuries are most frequently sustained during rugby, cycling and equestrian activities.
- 11% of sports related concussion claimants had multiple concussions within a 2-year period (2009-2013).

- Evidence shows that with repeat concussions people may experience a decline in general health and quality of life up to 10 years following injury.

AIM

The welfare of riders at shows is of the upmost importance to us. We want to ensure that all head knocks received at A & P shows are treated in a knowledgeable way to reduce the incidents of a serious brain injury being missed.

RECOGNITION OF CONCUSSION

Recognising concussion is crucial for the correct management and prevention of further injury. It can present with a range of signs and/or symptoms that may or may not include loss of consciousness

It is important to remember that not every sign and symptom will be present in every case and signs and symptoms may have delayed onset.

Physical Signs (what you see) If any of the following symptoms appear, concussion may be present

- Loss of consciousness or non-responsive
- Loss of balance/coordination
- Disorientation/
- Vomiting
- Lying on the ground not moving or slow to get up
- Visible injury to face or head (especially in combination with any other signs)
- Seizure or convulsion

Clinical signs (What they feel) If any of the following symptoms appear, concussion may be present

- Blurred vision
- Neck pain
- Nausea
- Dizziness
- Confusion
- Headache/pressure in the head
- Sensitivity to light &/or noise
- Generally feeling “not quite right”
- Fatigue
- More emotional
- Irritability
- Problems with memory
- Reduced ability to think/concentration

Memory (what they say) Failure to answer any of these questions correctly may suggest a concussion

- What venue are we at today?
- What activity where you doing?
- Is it before or after lunch?
- When was your last competition?
- What is your horse’s name?
- What month of the year are we in?

RED FLAGS (WHAT REQUIRES HOSPITALISATION)

If no qualified medical professional is available, consider transporting by ambulance for urgent medical assessment.

- Rider complains of neck pain
- Increasing confusion or irritability
- Repeated vomiting
- Seizure or convulsion
- Weakness or tingling/burning in arms or legs
- Deteriorating conscious state
- Severe or increasing headache
- Double vision
- Unusual behaviour change

**A rider must not be allowed to remount after a fall on the day of the show.
Irrespective of the wishes of their parents/guardian or coach.**

Ensure they are monitored and have a 'buddy' who will make sure they are not left alone or drive for four hours post incident and to assist them home safely for family to monitor. Within the first 24hrs any concussed rider must get urgent medical treatment if they show signs of:

- Worsening headache.
- Increased drowsiness or can't be woken up.
- Vomiting
- Increased confusion or agitation
- Weakness in any limbs
- Slurred speech
- Loss of consciousness or seizure

PROCEDURE:

If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury they should be removed from the activity and assessed by a qualified person

Recognise: Both the immediate and delayed presentation of concussion can be difficult to assess and symptoms can be subtle, so a conservative approach should be taken.

If any one of the physical or clinical signs are present, if they get one of the memory questions incorrect or a Red Flag, then the rider must be removed from the activity.

Resuscitate: Any red flags or immediate concerns regarding the level of consciousness and/or severity of injury, demands immediate resuscitation with appropriate first aid, emergency care and request for assistance. Remember in all cases, the basic principles of first aid (danger, response, airway, breathing, circulation) should be followed. Do not attempt to move the rider (other than required for airway support) unless trained to do so and do not remove helmet unless trained to do so.

A rider is not to be left alone for four hours post incident; a buddy must be found to stay with them until a parent/guardian found.

Replace: Any fall that sustains a head injury or concussion requires the riders helmet to be replaced.

Responsibilities:

Coaches/First Aiders: Understand the concussion procedure

Riders/caregivers: If you have received a head knock it is your responsibility to let officials know. It is in your best interest and your responsibility to seek medical clearance.

"Maddocks score" is a set of questions that are widely recognised as a reliable side-line diagnosis of concussion.

“Maddock questions” (modified for equestrian) have been used for the memory part of the recognising concussion.

PLEASURE HORSE/PONY SHOWING RULES

NOT HOY QUALIFIER

Pleasure Horse/Pony means those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse/Pony. We welcome any breed (e.g. Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Standardbreds, Clyde X) and colour. They should be an uncomplicated and genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners. A “pleasure mount” is NOT an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring.

GENERAL RULES

1. From 1 August 2025 for a horse/pony to meet the annual title show qualification requirements they must be registered with NZEPS at time of qualification (qualification cannot be counted pre membership and registration)
2. Horses/ponies must never have been placed first in an open show ring class including working hunter. However, members may apply for dispensation to NZEPS. Please note - open show ring includes wins in novice classes in a ring defined open i.e. saddle hunter, park hack etc this also includes NZ Show Council and Showing Championships. Height certificates are not required. Hunter Jumping is allowed. ESNZ classes are allowed
3. Riders may be registered with other bodies.
4. Riders may compete outside the Pleasure Horse/pony section.
5. Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of rider's age may be requested). Age is taken as of 1st August.
6. Children riding hacks must compete in the Horse Classes.
7. Adults may ride ponies in Horse Classes without prejudice.
8. Pleasure mounts may compete in recognised breed and colour classes ie Welsh and Pinto classes but should not compete in the RAS in hand classes ie Sport horse, TB or in hand pony sections. Note: regardless of a mount's performance history, they cannot compete in a novice or open showing class (see definition note 2 above for what is classed as open showing) and a Pleasure class at the same show.
9. Stallions may compete in this section however it is up to the discretion of each show committee as to whether they choose to allow stallions
10. A rider with a disability can apply for dispensation to use gear which is not normally allowed. They will be issued with a card stating the dispensation and must carry it at shows.

EQUIPMENT

11. BITS: Ordinary snaffle bit as per Dressage NZ definition only, no poll action. No bit guards, shadow rolls, ear plugs muffs or bonnets, martingales (breast plates are allowed) or tie downs, grass reins or balance reins.

12. BITLESS BRIDLES are only permitted in Recreational pleasure classes.

13. CAVESSON NOSEBANDS: Only cavesson nosebands are permitted no strapping below the bit.

14. WHIPS may be carried but must not exceed 76cms in length. Spurs are not allowed.

15. All riders must wear a helmet which meets the current RAS and ESNZ standards. (Must be Yellow Tagged)
