Important Information

Responsibility: It is the rider, or person responsible, obligation to read and understand the conditions for this event as published in this schedule.

All entries must be paid in full before accepted. Late fees apply after closing date.

- ESNZ Registration for Graded Classes:** Entries will not be accepted without membership as follows for the day of competition.
 - Preliminary: Riders must have an ESNZ Introductory, Child or Full Competitive membership.
 - Novice and Above: Riders must have an ESNZ Child or Full Competitive membership.
 - Horse and Ponies: Must have ESNZ Horse/pony registration. You may compete on an Annual Dressage Start (purchased on Horse Reg) or use Flexi Start at \$5 per test (payable with entries).
- ESNZ Registration for Non Graded Classes:** All Riders must be a Child, Full or Introductory ESNZ member or pay a day Casual membership of \$16.30 per rider. Horses and Ponies may be registered or non registered.
- Grading Points:** No ESNZ grading points will be awarded for Non-graded classes or to unregistered horses.
- Rules:** This competition will be run under the current ESNZ GR's, VR's & ESNZ Rules for Dressage
- Official start time:** The official event start time is one hour prior to the first rider competing. The specific time will be advised in your rider notes sent out prior to the event. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules. Please note Dressage NZ rule 477 prohibited gear is not allowed from the time of arrival at the event.
- Official finish time:** The official finish time will be one hour after the completion of the last class or 60 minutes after the completion of all presentations for the event are completed whichever is the latter.

7. **Protests & Complaints:** Protests and complaints may be considered by the Ground Jury at an event in accordance with Art 137 of the ESNZ General Regulations. As a guideline only, protests must be lodged within 60 minutes of the completion of the competition to which the protest relates, and a complaint within 60 minutes of the completion of the event. 8. **Dressage Series Points:** Riders wishing to accrue points in any Dressage NZ Series must have registered online at www.evoevents.co.nz prior to 1st December 2025 for the 2025/2026 season.
9. **Dressage National Leagues & Series:** No points will be accrued for the Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyle Series, Prestige Futures Prize or Pony & Young Rider Performance Award at this event.
10. **Dressage Tests:** All tests are from current DNZ Test book or FEI Website.

11. All non FEI tests can be called.

EVENT CONDITIONS

1. **Amendments:** The organising committee reserves the right to refuse entries, cancel the event, alter the programme/schedule and/or prize money within the ESNZ and DNZ Rules.
2. **Presentation of Prizes and Prizes:** See DNZ Rule article 485. Rosettes only to 6th place. No prize money. Rosettes can be picked up from the office once final results are published.
3. **Equal Placings:** In the case of equality in any qualifying class, the higher collective marks will determine the higher placing. If the competitors are still equal, then the higher coefficient marks will determine the placings. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing.
4. **Riders with more than 2 horses:** The OC will make every effort to ensure that riders have at least 60 minutes between rides. However, if this is not possible owing to the scheduling of classes, the maximum time possible between rides will be allocated.
5. **Maximum entries:** 6 tests per rider per day and 2 tests per horse/pony. Exception for Para Equestrian Competitors:
 - a. Para Riders are restricted to 2 tests per horse as per Article 162 6.1 (Para rules)
 - b. Para Riders are restricted to riding a maximum of 2 horses per day as per Article 162 / 6.3 (Para rules)
6. **Pony Classes:** restricted to riders aged 16yrs or under as at 1st of August 2025. Older riders riding ponies must enter the appropriate level non pony class.
7. **Helmet:** ESNZ approved and tagged riding helmet must be worn at all times, at all levels, during the competition.
8. **Non Competing Horses:** All horses and ponies on the grounds after the official start time must be entered at the event unless the organising committee gives permission otherwise.
9. Stallions must comply with ESNZ Article 133 and must be housed in a stable at all times.
10. **Liability:**
 - a. Competitors and spectators attending this event do so at their own risk.
 - b. Clevedon Showgrounds, ESNZ, Dressage NZ and/or Auckland Manukau Dressage Group nor any representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse/pony/rider, spectators, land, vehicles or any personal property whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way what so ever.
 - c. Clevedon Showgrounds, ESNZ, Dressage NZ and/or Auckland Manukau Dressage Group shall not be liable for the safety of any goods/equipment or the loss of, or damage to such, brought in/stored at the venue, during the event.
11. **Health & Safety:**
 - a. ESNZ, Dressage NZ and Auckland Manukau Dressage Group is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all participants, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.

- b. Competitor or Exhibitor must comply with the appropriate Legislation and Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.
 - c. Each Competitor and/or exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the Event.
 - d. All competitors and associated staff/visitors to the venue must abide by the ESNZ, Dressage NZ Rules, the Auckland Manukau Dressage Group and Clevedon Showgrounds Health & Safety Policies.
 - e. Copies of the event Health & Safety policy can be found at the event office.
 - f. Any incident or near miss must be reported to the event office and an incident form completed.
 - g. Any hazards identified must be reported to the event office.
 - h. Competitors will be responsible for their safety at all times and must observe safe practices and following event rules and officials' instructions at all times, ensuring that others are not put at risk by their actions.
12. **ESNZ Concussion Policy:**
- a. This event will be run under the ESNZ Concussion Policy Guidelines.
 - b. Dressage NZ policy requires all riders to report to the Medical Officer or Steward following a fall.
 - c. Medical clearance must be obtained before remounting or competing.
13. **ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy**
- ESNZ reserve the right to drug or alcohol test any participant at the event under the ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy. This link will access the policy and frequently asked questions.

Entry Conditions

- 1. Entries Close as per the date on page 1 showing schedule of classes
- 2. Enter online at www.evoevents.co.nz and look for "AMDG Autumn Dressage Series 2026"
- 3. Late Entries & Changes email amdgsportmanager@gmail.com
- 4. Change of class fees \$10 per class.
- 5. Late penalty fee \$25 per rider.
- 6. Payment must be made at time of entry through POLI (internet banking) or Stripe (credit card payment facility). No exceptions. Entry is considered to be held until payment is received in full. Late entry fees will be added to any unpaid entries after the close of entry date.
- 7. Draw will be available at www.evoevents.co.nz
- 8. **Amateur Classes** - Riders in Level 1 must be category CN – C2, and in level 2 CN – C3.
- 9. **Scratchings** – please make any scratching through www.evoevents.co.nz.
- 10. **REFUNDS** - before close of entry date – full refund less compulsory fees. After that date, refund, if scratching accompanied by a vet, doctor or farrier certificate within 14 days of the competition will be less 20% of remaining fees. Compulsory fees are not refundable. Request refund by emailing amdgsportmanager@gmail.com
- 11. All poo and hay to be cleaned up and taken home. Rubbish needs to be taken home.
- 12. Withdrawals and Refunds – No class changes or scratchings will be accepted via Facebook, email or text.
- 13. Event Cancellation - If event is cancelled after closing date, AMDG will in good faith determine an equitable refund depending on what facilities and third party supplier costs have been charged.

Yards must be booked at time of entry. We do our utmost to allocate yards with safety in mind. DO NOT put your horse in a yard that you have not been allocated. We give consideration to yarding of mares and difficult horses. If you arrive and want a yard please contact the office

Reception Opening Hours

Our office is open from the official start time (approximately and usually 60 mins prior to the first horse competing and 60 mins after the last rider has completed his/her test).

Competition Arena Use

1. All Competition Arenas are closed to riders the day prior to the event for preparation of arenas.
2. On competition day, warmup areas (excluding competition arenas) open 7am-7pm. Riders ride at own risk.
3. No leading in hand or lunging of horses on arena surfaces. Horses may be lunged on grass area beside top arenas only (near cross country jumps).
4. There is no arena familiarisation offered at these Autumn Series events.

Awards & Championships

Individuals accumulator

Riders must have competed in at least two of the three days to qualify for any awards.

Day 3 - only the "B" tests per level / division, Advanced class 27, Small Tour Class 29, Medium Tour class 31, Big Tour Class 33 and Para class 35 will count for accumulator

TROPHIES FOR HIGHEST PLACED AMDG MEMBER IN EACH SERIES

Points based on 10 points for 1st place, 8 points for 2nd place, 6 points for 3rd place, 4 points for 4th place, 2 points for 5th place, and 1 point for 6th place. Combinations must receive over 57% to be eligible to gain points. **TOC* and non-registered classes do not count towards individual series accumulator**

Horse Identification, Venue, Vehicles, Camping Conditions

Approved Dressage NZ Horse/Pony identification numbers must be worn at all times when competing.

1. ALL horses on the ground must be identifiable by a tag, affixed to the head collar or rug, with name and owner contact details, at all times outside of the competition area.
2. Registered horses/ponies: approved Dressage NZ Horse/Pony identification numbers must be worn on both sides (bridle or saddle blanket) at all times when warming up, competing and when being ridden or led in Arena Familiarisation. Any person leading a horse in an arena familiarisation, must be wearing a correctly fitting yellow tagged helmet. All horses being led must be wearing a bridle with a permitted bit, and with two bridle numbers. A newmarket lead may replace the reins for this purpose. It is the riders responsibility to ensure their horse is correctly identified.
3. Un-registered horses/ponies: allocated draw number must be worn on both sides (bridle or saddle blanket) at all times when warming up, competing and when being ridden or led in Arena Familiarisation. It is the riders responsibility to ensure their horse is correctly identified.
4. Temporary yarding must comply with ESNZ rules.
5. No smoking or vaping in any buildings or stable areas.
6. Dogs are permitted but must be on a lead at all times and preferably kept at the truck parking for the safety of horses and riders not used to dogs.
7. Speed limit for all vehicles is 15 kmph
8. Trucks and Campervans requesting power must have a valid electrical certificate and under no circumstances will allow other vehicles to connect to their vehicle via extension cords.
9. Motorbikes, electric bikes/scooters must not be used after 8.30 pm and must be used in accordance with NZroad rules on driveway areas only.
10. Persons under 16 yrs may not use motorbikes.
11. Bicycle helmets must be worn in accordance with NZ road rules
12. Anyone riding an e-bike or e-scooter must keep to paths and driveways only and use extreme caution near horses and pedestrians as approach is silent and can easily cause accidents.

The following table sets out the ESNZ Dressage Rider Categories:

Category N	(CN) Newcomers. For riders who have never earned grading points at any Level
Category 1	(C1) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Preliminary (Level 1)
Category 2	(C2) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Novice (Level 2)
Category 3	(C3) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Elementary (Level 3)
Category 4	(C4) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Medium (Level 4)
Category 5	(C5) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Advanced Medium (Level 5)
Category 6	(C6) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Advanced (Level 6)
Category 7	(C7) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Small Tour (Level 7)
Category 8	(C8) For riders who have never earned 15 or more grading points at any level above Intermediate Tour (Level 8)
Category 9	(C9) For riders who have earned 15 or more grading points at Big Tour (Level 9) (Int II- GP-GPS- GPFS)
Category M (Masters)	(CM) Masters. For Riders 50yrs & over (age from the beginning of the calendar year that the rider turns 50)
Category Am (Amateur)	(CAm) Any rider C5 or below is a CAm rider. A CAm rider may compete in Amateur competitions at any level not more than two levels below that rider's rider category. Examples: A C5 rider may compete in any CAm competition or series at levels 3,4 and 5. A C4 rider may compete in any CAm competition or series at levels 2,3 and 4.
