Class 7 – Pony	60cm
Class 8 – Horse	60cm
Class 9 – Pony	70cm
Class 10 – Horse	70cm
Class 11 – Pony	80cm
Class 12 – Horse	80cm

Event Conditions

1. The Organising Committee reserves the right to refuse entries, alter the programme, combine classes, divide classes, or cancel the event if necessary.
2. Riders may enter multiple rounds, including multiple rounds at the same height.
3. Horses and ponies will be judged separately.
4. Approved riding helmets must be worn at all times when mounted.
7. Riders must report any falls to an event official before remounting.
8. Dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
9. Competitors are responsible for cleaning up around their float parking area before leaving.
10. The decision of the judges and organising committee is final.
12. The Organising Committee reserves the right to split, combine, or divide classes depending on entry numbers.
