Responsibility: It is the riders, or persons responsible, obligation to read and understand the conditions for this event as published in this schedule.

1. **ESNZ Registration for Graded Classes:** Entries will not be accepted without full ESNZ rider and horse registrations current to the 27th September 2026. Horses and Ponies must be registered, have a current dressage discipline start or use a flexi start option for open and amateur classes.
2. **ESNZ Registration for Non-Graded Classes:** All Riders must be a Full or Introductory ESNZ member current to the 27th of September 2026 or pay a Casual membership fee of \$16.30 per day. Horses may be registered or unregistered.
3. **Introductory Classes:** The introductory classes are for non-registered horses/ponies or horses that hold no dressage discipline start. These classes are designed to be an introduction to dressage for any age.. Riders are required to have a ESNZ rider membership – full, introductory or casual. If sufficient entries, horses and ponies may be judged separately.
4. **Grading Points:** No ESNZ grading points will be awarded for non-graded classes or to unregistered horses. Horses must gain over 57% to be eligible for ESNZ grading points.
5. **Rules:** This competition will be run under the current (2024) ESNZ GR's, VR's & ESNZ Rules for Dressage.
6. **Official start time:** The official event start time is 7am 26th September 2026. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules. Please note Dressage NZ articles 420 – 430 prohibited gear is not allowed from the time of arrival at the event.
7. **Official finish time:** The official finish time will be 60 minutes after the completion of the last class or 60 minutes after the completion of all presentations for the event whichever is later. Protests & Complaints: Protests and complaints may be considered by the Ground Jury at an event in accordance with Art 137 of the ESNZ General Regulations. As a guideline only, protests must be lodged within 60 minutes of the completion of the competition to which the protest relates, and a complaint within 60 minutes of the completion of the event. The Ground Jury is the sole judge of time in both cases. For complete rules and official documentation required, please refer <https://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/esnz/rules-regulations/>
8. **Dressage Top Ten Leagues:** Riders wishing to accrue points in any Dressage NZ Top 10 League must have registered online at www.equestrianentries.co.nz prior to 1st November 2026 for the 2026/2027 season.
9. **Dressage National Leagues & Series:** No points will be accrued for the Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyle Series, Prestige Futures Prize or Pony & Young Rider Performance Award at local events.
10. **Dressage Tests:** All tests are from DNZ Test book version 2023 or FEI Website
11. **Musical and alternative to musical classes:** Please choose either Musical Freestyle class or alternative – not both.

Event Conditions

1. **Amendments:** The organising committee reserves the right to refuse entries, cancel the event, alter the programme/schedule, and/or prize money within the ESNZ and DNZ Rules.
2. **Presentation of Prizes and Prize Money:** See DNZ Rule article 456.
 - a. All riders must attend advertised presentations, in the correct attire. The organising committee reserves the right to withhold prize monies should a place getter not attend an advertised prize giving.
 - b. All prize money will be paid by direct credit within 21 days of the event. Prize money is only paid on scores of 57% and above and at a ratio of 1:3. Please ensure your bank account details are loaded onto Evo Events, this is your responsibility as we will not be contacting you if you have not listed it.
 - c. **Prize giving's: Saturday - Unmounted for all classes. Sunday - Unmounted for all classes after arenas have been packed away. Champion and Reserve Champions MUST ATTEND.**
 - d. Riders must be respectful of others at prize giving, and any questioning of results must be made after the finish of prize giving.
3. **Equal Placings:** In the case of equality in any qualifying class, the higher collective marks will determine the higher placing. If the competitors are still equal, then the higher co-efficient marks will determine the placings. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing.
4. **Riders with more than 2 horses:** The OC will make every effort to ensure that riders have at least 60 minutes between rides. However, if this is not possible owing to the scheduling of classes, the maximum time possible between rides will be allocated.
5. **Maximum of 6 tests per rider per day. Maximum of 3 tests per horse/pony per day.** One rider per horse/pony.
6. **Hats:** ESNZ approved riding hats must always be worn when mounted.
7. **Non-Competing Horses:** All horses and ponies on the grounds after the official start time must pay Ground fee and applicable yard fee at the time of entry. They must display an ID tag and must not be ridden on grounds during competition hours.
8. Stallions must comply with ESNZ Article 133 and must always be housed in the stallion yards provided.
9. **Amateur Classes:** Please refer to 2023 Amateur rules regarding Bronze, Silver and Gold as outlined at end of class schedule.
10. **Draw:** If required, a revised draw and/or start times for the following day's competition will be available by Evo Events. It is the rider's responsibility to check any new times on Evo Events.
11. **Music for Freestyles:** Please ensure this is handed to the music caravan at least two hours prior to the start of your class. Music must be either be saved on a USB as either MP3 or video file
12. **Liability:**
 - a. Competitors and spectators attending this event do so at their own risk.
 - b. Marlborough Equestrian Park, ESNZ, Dressage NZ or Dressage Marlborough nor any representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse/pony/rider, spectators, land, vehicles or any personal property, whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way whatsoever.
 - c. Marlborough Equestrian Park, ESNZ, Dressage NZ, or Dressage Marlborough shall not be liable for the safety of any goods/equipment or the loss of, or damage to such, brought in/stored at the venue, during the event.
13. **Health & Safety:**
 - a. ESNZ, Dressage NZ, and Dressage Marlborough are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all participants, and to provide the information, training, and supervision needed to achieve this.
 - b. The competitor or Exhibitor must comply with all appropriate legislation and Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.
 - c. Each Competitor and/or exhibitor must always supervise and control their animals and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness, or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the Event.
 - d. All competitors and associated staff/visitors to the venue must abide by the ESNZ, Dressage NZ Rules, the Dressage Marlborough, and Marlborough Equestrian Park's Health & Safety Policy's.
 - e. Copies of the event Health & Safety policy can be found at the event office.
 - f. Any incident or near miss must be reported to the event office and an incident form completed.
 - g. Any hazards identified must be reported to the event office.
 - h. Competitors will always be responsible for their safety and must always observe safe practices and following event rules and officials' instructions, ensuring that others are not put a risk by their actions.
14. **ESNZ Concussion Policy:**
 - a. This event will be run under the ESNZ Concussion Policy Guidelines.
 - b. Dressage NZ policy requires all riders to report to Medical Officer or Steward following a fall.
 - c. Medical clearance must be obtained before remounting or competing.
15. **ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy:**

Dressage Marlborough Entry Conditions

1. Entries close 17th September 2026 at 9 pm.

3. Payment of entry fee is compulsory at the time of entries made online.
4. **Your entry will not be accepted unless paid in full, so please calculate correctly.**
Late entries accepted when slots available -fee \$10 per event.
5. Preference is POLI or direct deposit via internet banking to Dressage Marlborough 03-0599-03358180-00 with **name & rider ESNZ Registration number** as a reference.
6. The draw will be available at www.EvoEvents.co.nz
7. **Prize money** will only be paid out on scores 57% and above
8. **Amateur Classes:** These classes are eligible for the DNZ Amateur awards. Please enter these at www.EvoEvents.co.nz
9. **Withdrawals and Refunds:** Withdrawal form is available from the event secretary, refunds will only be refunded upon withdrawal form being filled out and accompanied by vets, farrier or doctors' certificate, and returned within 7 days of the event and calculated in accordance with our refund policy.
10. Any changes are to be done through the change request on Equestrian Entries.

Awards & Championships

Awards Eligibility

- a) Combinations are eligible for one level championship award only .
- b) Combinations must attend both days of the Patchett Ag-Air Summer League.
- c) Championship points are allocated to the top 10 place getters in each grade 10 for 1st, to 1 for 10th in all classes.
- d) **Champions and Reserves:** The horse with the highest aggregate allocated points from * specified classes will be the Championship winner. In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest aggregate average % will be the winner.

Competition Arena Use & Familiarisation

1. All competition arenas are closed at all times except as stated below.
2. These times may be amended please check times in rider notes provided with the draw.
3. Arena familiarisation is not intended to be used as a full schooling session.
4. Riders need to be considerate of other riders wishing to familiarise their horses.
5. Lunging to be in the lunging arena only, which is situated behind the parking and yards eastern end of grounds.
6. Horses may be hand walked or ridden at walking pace around the exterior of the competition arena unless advised otherwise by the Technical Delegate.
7. Familiarisation will include all competition arenas.
8. Familiarisation Times: Friday afternoon 4pm – 5pm. Arena set up is at 3pm, please help with arena set up to enable arena familiarisation.

Horse Identification, Venue, Stabling, Accommodation Conditions

1. Approved Dressage NZ Horse/Pony identification numbers or back numbers must be worn at all times when competing.
2. When not competing, it is compulsory that horses/ponies must be identified with ID tags also that include, name of the person responsible and mobile phone contact number.
3. All yards are to be left properly mucked out. If not a fee of \$50 will be charged.
4. Temporary yarding must comply with ESNZ rules.
5. Please keep wash down bays clean at all times.
6. Moving horses to unallocated yards is prohibited without the permission of the Yard Manager.
7. **No smoking at Marlborough Equestrian Park**
8. Damage to MEP facilities to be reported to the Event Office.

Dogs

1. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and must be kept at least ten metres away from a competition arena.
2. The owner of the dog will be responsible for the cost of any damage/harm caused by the dog at the competition.

Code of Conduct

Dressage Marlborough Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct is for all Dressage Marlborough competitors and their supporters, family, grooms, owners, etc.

1. To ensure at all times the safety of your horse.
2. To ensure your horse is fed and watered and covered appropriately for the duration of the event.
3. Anyone seen abusing their horse will be asked to leave the ground. Dressage Marlborough officials will use the notification of the official warning system enforced by Equestrian Sports NZ
4. To at all times show respect and be courteous to all members of the committee and other competitors and spectators.
5. We are a public group insofar that the public can and do attend our competitions. You are expected to not bring the Dressage Marlborough Committee into disrepute, by outward displays of verbal outcries/ abuse, disrespect to competitors, judges, officials, or spectators.
6. The use of social media is an area where we expect the same rules apply as above. Please see ESNZ guidelines for more information on social media use.

Riders have a responsibility to horses and humans to act in accordance with the above guidelines. The six main notifications which can denote an official warning are:

- ABUSE of Horse
- Safety to others
- Incorrect behaviour
- ABUSE disregard of officials
- Dangerous riding
- Non-compliance of rules - All ESNZ and DNZ rules apply at all times.



DRESSAGE MARLBOROUGH HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY
