INHAND CLASSES – 10.00am

Class 1:

MINI

For all equines up to 38 inches (10hh) (may be shown in a halter except if a stallion)

Class 2:

YOUNGSTOCK

For all equines up to 2years of age (may be shown in a halter except if a stallion)

Class 3:

PONY

For all equines above under 148cm (must be shown in a bit)

Class 4:

HACK

For all equines above 148cm (must be shown in a bit)

Events (the same for each inhand class)

1. Best presented
2. Best walk
3. Best trot
4. Best mare
5. Best gelding
6. Most suitable for dressage
7. Most suitable for jumping
8. Best handler
9. Champion and Reserve

FLAT CLASSES – 12.00pm:

Class 5:

LEAD REIN

(Any age rider, any sized mount). For riders solely reliant on a Lead Rein. Leader must be at the shoulder of the pony. Pony to stay in this ring all day and combination is not permitted to enter the show jumping.

Class 6:

IMPROVER

Walk and Trot only

(Any age rider, any sized mount). Combination not to have competed previously at a show in a class containing canter (ribbon day, gymkhana, Show Jumping/Hunter, dressage etc). Combination is not permitted to enter the show jumping.

Class 7:

NOVICE

(Any age rider, any sized mount). Combination not to have had **more than 8 wins** at any show, ribbon day etc)

Class 8:

OPEN

(Any age rider, any sized mount). For any combination not eligible for other rings.

Events (the same for each flat class)

1. Best cared for mane and tail
2. Best combination of pony & rider
3. Most promising rider
4. Mount most suitable for a learner
5. Best walk and trot (walk, trot and canter for Novice and Open rings)
6. Paced and mannered
7. Best pair
8. Judges' Choice

SHOW JUMPING PRACTICE – 1.00pm

A show jump course will be set up on the Riverside sand arena – numbered and with fill – course plan at the gate. No ribbons.

Show Jumping heights will be timetabled based on the number of entrants in each class/height. Please ensure you keep within the time frame for each height. This may mean missing a flat class if you enter both.

Class 9 – cross bars - 60cm

Class 10 – cross bars - 60cm second round

Class 11 – 60cm - 70cm

Class 12 – 60cm - 70cm second round

Class 13 – 70cm - 80cm

Class 14 – 70cm - 80cm second round

Class 15 – 80cm - 90cm

Class 16 – 80cm - 90cm second round

Class 17 – 90cm - 1.00m

Class 18 – 90cm - 1.00m second round

(max 3 rounds TOTAL per combination).

RULES AND CONDITIONS

- This is a fun day!
- Height Certificates for inhand classes not required, but please be honest.
- Combinations can enter inhand, flat and show jumping. Show jumping heights will be timetabled and will be adhered to. This may mean you miss a flat class if you enter both and you enter both understanding this.
- Any outstanding fees owed to WCEG/WECT will need to be paid before you enter this event.
- Yards are compulsory/will be allocated and must be used at all times when not riding.
- Stallions welcome, but must be as per Article 133 (attached).
- No non-competing horses – penalty of elimination.
- All people enter the grounds at their own risk. Children must be supervised at all times.
- Yellow tagged helmets to be worn at all times whilst mounted.
- WECT disclaims any responsibility in the event of an accident, injury or damage to a spectator, competitor, horse or property.
- Any rider entered on a lead rein, must stay on lead rein for the duration of the day and cannot jump.
- Classes may be divided into two divisions depending on entry numbers. Or rings may be combined.
- Any horse that kicks must wear a red ribbon attached to their tail.
- **The judge's decision is final.**
- Dogs must be on leads at all times and kept in the carpark. Must not come into competition area.
- Admin/EE fees are non-refundable.
- One rider per horse/pony.
- The WECT Board reserves the right to alter the programme without prior notice depending upon numbers.
- By entering the event you agree to the terms and conditions above.
- Rider may ride Hack or Pony unless otherwise specified on the class schedule.

Article 133:

ESNZ General Regulations

Article 133: Stallions at Events

1. Stallions must be identified with ESNZ approved 'Stallion Tags' at all times when at an event. These tags must be RED with a WHITE S. There must be a minimum of two tags, with one displayed on each side of the bridle, or saddle pad (when ridden), or halter.
2. Stallions, when led, must have a bridle/halter/headpiece and be controlled by a bit attached to a lead, or chain over the nose attached to a lead. An attendant must have suitable experience in handling stallions.
3. Stallions must not be tied to trucks or floats unless they are also within an approved solid framed portable yard that is attached to the outside of the truck or float. It is recommended that stallions be confined in stables or suitable yards.
4. Stallions may be confined on a truck or float during the day at an event. If the ramp is down they must be tied up within the vehicle and be behind a closed partition when confined in this manner.
5. When staying overnight at an event or show, stallions must be housed in appropriate stables or yards that have been allocated by the show organisers. Stallion owners must advise the show organisers when entering and booking horse accommodation that they are bringing a stallion.
6. A notice must be placed on the outside of the stable or yard clearly notifying others that the horse within is a stallion. It must also display the name and contact details (including cell phone number) for the rider or person responsible for the stallion during the event.
7. A discipline may require the rider or handler of a Stallion to wear an ESNZ approved stallion armband. The colour of the armband will be red with a white stripe.
8. A true Rig should be classified as a stallion when applying ESNZ rules.
9. The minimum age of the person responsible for stallions at Events will be 18 years of age.
