Through the funding of national and native preachers, we endeavor to effectively advance the Gospel where it has never been preached before.

The Progress Report is a free, quarterly publication of the **Final Frontiers Foundations, Inc.** Currently we are ministering in over eighty countries; many of which are closed to foreign missionaries. In other countries, work among the various tribal groups is restricted to national preachers only; thus they are open to us because of our unique method of missions.

We believe that the training and subsidizing of national preachers is the most efficient and effective method of global evangelism. We seek to raise prayer and financial support from believers in the West, for God's servants abroad, who are actively involved in church planting and discipleship.

Selection of those we sponsor is dependent upon their doctrinal beliefs, need, reputation and ministry experience. We support only those who are serving by faith, never those who are waiting for a salary in order to serve. Worldwide, the average preacher in a third-world country needs as little as \$25.00 - \$350.00 each month to support his family and ministry.

All those subsidized through this foundation are involved in church planting. Their various outreach ministries include: Bible translation and distribution, radio and television broadcasting, camps, Bible schools, outdoor and film evangelism, educational and health programs, handicap and leper ministries, orphan and children's ministries, etc. The Foundation receives its funding from individuals, churches, businesses, etc. who choose to support our preachers, projects, or desperate children under the Foundation's oversight; or give general donations allowing the funds to be used where needed.

A few thoughts from Jon Nelms

Thank You!

We are grateful to two friends in Florida who heard about a special need and addressed it before we could make the rest of you aware. Our main church in Cairo needed chairs so the people would not have to sit on the extremely cold cement floor. These ministry partners contributed an offering of over \$8,000. They purchased enough chairs to seat 120 members (the room can hold only 120 at a time). They are also used in the feeding program for children at our first Touch a Life Center in Cairo. By next year, we plan to offer Visionary Trips to Egypt.

On another subject, you are all aware that we continually have projects to fund, as well as special and sometimes urgent needs, globally. You may recall that our Pakistani team suffered an accident in which all the riders were injured to a degree, and one of our pastors was killed. The front of the vehicle was demolished and would be considered "totaled." Still, in other countries, they simply fabricate parts they cannot purchase and rebuild them. We were given an estimate of \$8,500, and enough of you responded to make it possible. The van is now at the workshop for under construction. We will keep you informed.

You also contributed enough to rebuild a staff member's house, which was destroyed by flooding. He is my dear brother, and we did not have the funds to help, but you did. Thank you so much. I am in your debt.

In the past month, Burnsvie Baptist in South Carolina has given \$25,000 to build a church/kitchen/feeding center in the small village of Plan Fresco. Their gift also covered the table, chairs, appliances, cups, spoons, etc. They also voted to fund the monthly budget to feed all 50 children, five days a week, for the first year. Construction has already begun!

They also included a surprise, which I will share in a month or so. They heard our vision and accepted it as their own. Together, we are about to jump light-years ahead in our ministry.

The enormous financial hurdles our national churches face are mere speed bumps to the American economy. We are thankful that in this, our 40th year of ministry, we have such a gigantic network of national preachers, over 29,000 of them. We vet their requests based on need and the benefit they will bring to advancing the Kingdom of our Lord. Then we pass them on to you, and one by one, the Lord touches your hearts to fulfill these needs.

As His Army moves forward to conquer new lands, where Jesus remains unnamed and unknown, we want to thank you for providing our valiant Gospel troops with the weapons, transportation, medicine, rations, uniforms, and boots to march ever onward.

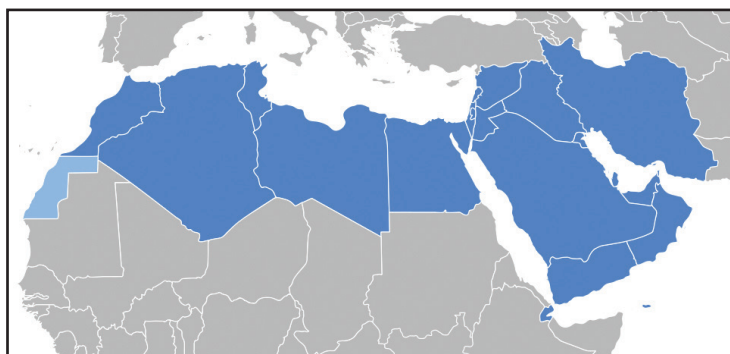

Our Smugglers Ministry is Expanding Rapidly

For years, it would seem we have emphasized only smuggling Bibles into the area formerly known as the NAME (North Africa and the Middle East). Today, that region is more commonly referred to as the MENA (Middle East and North Africa). I suppose it depends on your perspective. By the grace of God, we have successfully delivered over 600,000 copies of New Testaments and Bibles in the past twenty years. That seems appropriate, given that the Bible refers to Christ as the Name above all names.

This is, of course, a small percentage of what other Bible-printing ministries do in areas of reasonable safety. But in our areas, doing so carries an immediate death sentence. In fact, even to receive one carries the same judgment. We cannot take photos or speak openly about our teams, their vehicles, or their delivery methods. Nor can we publish their routes and methods.

Our teams cannot come to America to raise support; thus, we try to do so for them. Still, there is a logical hindrance to supporting a man you have never met, who speaks a different language, and for whom we must disguise the data we give you about him and his family. Their support depends on how much you trust us and our representatives here in America, who are raising funds on their behalf. Fortunately, and obviously, at \$6 per Bible, you must have a great deal of trust in us, and we strive never to fail you or them.

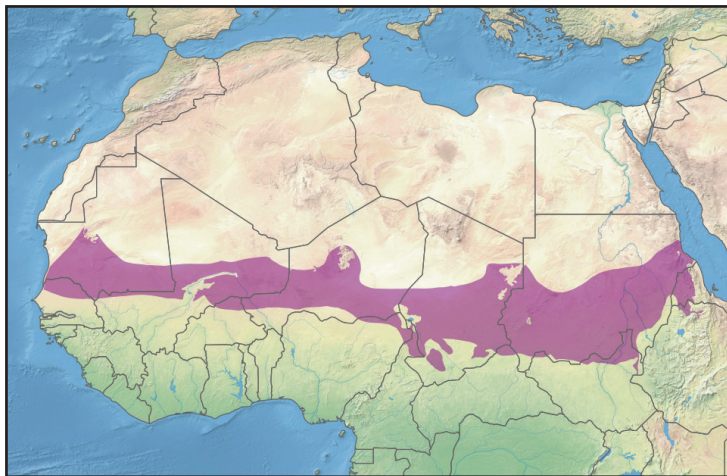
There are other men in America from the NAME who raise massive amounts of support because they can advertise themselves and their ministries without fear of repercussion. Why can they do so, but we can't? The answer is simple. Their ministries are based here and carried out by radio and the internet. Our ministries are there—boots on the ground. The enemy already knows who we are and has even been to our homes here in America. Still, we need not pour salt on their wounds by making a spectacle of the fact that they cannot stop us. They know if they cut off the head, another will grow in its place.

Now, the threat of persecution and martyrdom has moved south into the Sahel, the region just below the Sahara that was once partially green a hundred years ago but has now become a desert, as the Sahara moves southward. It extends southward to the Green Wall, the area south of the Sahel that remains green with foliage and vegetation. In many countries, like Senegal, Mauritania, Mali, Burkina Faso, Niger, Nigeria, Chad, Sudan, Eritrea, Cameroon, The Gambia, and Guinea, portions, up to half, are in the Sahel. The remainder is inside the Green Wall.

A simple rule of thumb is this: *where there is desert, there is Islam*. And it is ever encroaching southward with the intention of taking over all of Africa, as it is doing throughout Europe. In Hungary, for example, it has been reported that Christianity is dying. From 1992 to 2022, Christianity dropped from 92.9% to 42.5%. Throughout Europe and in the United States, immigrant Muslim women often have birthrates three times that of the citizens. Do the math. It's only a matter of time. Finally accepting this reality has prompted the governments of Europe to slow immigration to preserve their national languages, cultures, and legal systems.

Arab media reports that as many as 100 Muslim men each day are turning from the religion of their grandparents and believing in Jesus Christ. Another area of growing concern regarding persecution and opposition to God's Word is India. While there has always been a degree of persecution and Bible burnings, it is now increasing rapidly with direct funding from the national government.

From 2016-2019, persecution of Christians grew by 60%. From 330 incidents to 527.

In early 2022, there were more than 300 attacks from January to July alone.

In those same years, India grew from the 31st most persecuted country globally to the 15th. (data from Persecution Relief)

Still, Christian Solidarity International reports that in 2024 the country averaged more than two attacks per day, totaling 834 documented incidents. In just ten years, from 2014 (127 incidents) to 2024 (834 incidents), persecution increased by 555%. The most severe persecution is in the northern state of Uttar Pradesh and the eastern state of Chhattisgarh. Christians are often denied medical care and admittance to hospitals, as well as being denied burial rites.

Some Indian states have laws that prohibit conversions, and there are currently more than 100 believers in prison for evangelizing or the distribution of Bibles. Typically, they are denied bail. Most of the persecution is directed towards the *Dalit caste*

(called untouchables) and the *Scheduled Tribes*. (A scheduled tribe is one that the government has recognized. They are also called *Adivasis*, which means "indigenous peoples.") Other tribes do not receive recognition or benefits from the government. They are the *Unscheduled Tribes*. These tribes are nomadic or semi-nomadic and were classified as "criminals" by the British in 1895, during their rule. Much of Final Frontiers' outreach is among these Scheduled and non-Scheduled tribes.

We now receive frequent reports of persecution from our preachers, even in central and southern India. Reports of church buildings and pastors' homes burned, church members being gunned down or beaten with bamboo or metal rods, dismemberments, beheadings, crucifixions, and being burned alive. They are often forced to flee into the jungles to save their lives. Still, they must survive having no food, clothing, or shelter, and are at the prey of Hindu radicals and man-eating beasts.

In decades past, many people made shallow conversions during crusades when asked to accept Jesus. Visiting evangelists from abroad, seeking photos of thousands of hands raised for salvation, did not emphasize that Jesus is not just another god to be added to their pantheon of lesser gods; rather, He is the only true and living Savior and God for all mankind. They were not told that accepting



the One means denying all the other gods and lords.

In 2019, a month before the COVID outbreak, Nolin and I were in India. I read an article in The Times of India that the Roman Catholic Cardinal of India had now approved Hindus to continue worshipping their goddess, provided they would agree to refer to her as Mary. These marginal believers, faced with persecution, gladly denounce Christ and cling to their millions of gods and goddesses. By publicly admitting that they were deceived, forsook the gods of their fathers, and followed a foreign prosperity theology to free them from the caste system, they are welcomed back into Hinduism with open arms and rewards. But those whose faith is sincere are now targeted and face annihilation.

Recently, I heard from another of our leaders in another state. His ministry is also growing exponentially, and he, too, has requested more Bibles and shared that persecution is now increasing in his state, both in frequency and in severity. For several years, unable to buy land and build, they have rented a large hall to hold their meetings. Year by year, the rent has increased. The owner, threatened by the local business community, has persuaded him not to renew the church's lease. Being cast out, they assembled in the empty lot next door, but the police were called and disrupted them.

On my last trip to India with my wife, Nolin, and my neurologist and friend, Dr. Igor Stojanov, I was asked to speak at a rural church on a Sunday morning. As a foreigner, I knew it was illegal to "preach" and that I could be arrested and exiled from India, never to return. So rather than preach, I introduced myself as a professor who teaches the Bible and asked if anyone had questions about our American culture. In the rest of the world, culture cannot be separated from faith, so immediately, key church members began asking me their assigned questions. Answering questions is not preaching.

From the small platform where I stood, I could see men, twenty yards away, outside the front door. The pastor had intentionally opened all doors and windows so the people gathering outside could hear and perhaps be influenced by God's love and His Son's sacrifice. Nolin and Igor had their backs to the growing crowd. Still, as I answered the questions, their numbers grew, then I began to see some with bamboo rods in one hand, beating them against the other hand as if it were a policeman's Billy Club being used to threaten a delinquent, and still others brandished machetes. I quietly told our host that if the men rushed in, to quickly get Nolin and Igor out the side door and to the van where our driver waited with the door open and engine running.

When the service concluded, we left and, using our interpreter, I approached the men outside and, politely, India-style, thanked them for listening so intently and asked if any of them had a question. Some seemed to, but were rebuked by others who had rather aggravated looks on their faces. The pastor approached us and said the police had been called, that we must quickly get into the vehicle and leave, so we did. I found out the next day that after we left, they had beaten him badly and arrested him. After a few days, we were able to arrange his release.



We don't just smuggle Bibles in the Middle East. In this photo, one of our dedicated church planters risks his freedom to smuggle Bibles to new converts in two southern Indian states. Sometimes they are hidden in burlap bags to look like rice, other times in product bags like this one to disguise the contents. If caught, he will be imprisoned, beaten, and possibly killed, their home and farm will be confiscated, and their family cast out of the village with no possessions.

If you follow our ministry, you will begin to read increasingly about the persecution in India. And just as we have not abandoned our brothers in North Africa and the Middle East or in the SAHEL, we will not abandon our Indian preachers either. I can only hope that, if any have grown weary of reading such stories, they will ask for God's forgiveness and for a burden to help. All we have to do is spend the time it takes to read an article and maybe say a prayer or send a gift to help.

They risk their lives day after day for the sake of the NAME. If the danger doesn't come from radical Hindus, it comes from sickness or nature. Typhoid, malaria, dengue, water poisoning,

food poisoning, snake bites, and elephant attacks (nearly 600 annually) are among their dangers. The claws of a bear account for nearly 500 deaths annually, and Bengal tigers kill up to 125 annually. Death can even come from a vicious attack from packs of wild monkeys that are too numerous to tabulate. They maim, kill, and spread diseases like rabies, and over 1,000 reported attacks are occurring daily—in one city alone.

In one of the southern States of India, we have nearly 130 directors (Paul's) and as many, or more, Timothys, plus the Timothys of the Timothys, for up to ten generations or more, causing both our growth and the need for more Bibles to be exponential. We have always been able to deliver Bibles openly to their new converts. Now, they are having to smuggle them under the threat of prison, torture, confiscation of property, and death. Still, if that is what it takes, that is what they will do, as our Smugglers credo states: **"God's Word for all people, in all lands, by all means."**

New Christians wait a very long time for our pastors to deliver their first Bible. When they arrive, you can see the joy on their faces. Their pastor has one, which he uses when reading and preaching, but they have never had one of their own to take home and study.

Long-time believers are equally eager to finally have a Bible and are so grateful. In one region, our team delivered 500 Bibles in one afternoon. The same day, the pastor sent word to us that it was not enough and said he needed 1,500 more. **And this is a house church!** This hunger, according to him, is from new believers of non-Christian backgrounds who are also seeking Bibles, and their numbers are growing day by day. **It is as if Pentecost is happening again!**

But this, too, is not without suffering. In one place, a Christian farmer allowed us to use his home to distribute Bibles to believers in his village. The crowd was so large that the non-believers grew irritated and called the police. You see, the new law prohibits poor farm laborers from receiving a Bible. Currently, the government is organizing individuals and groups in every city, town, and village to look for Christians, record their activities and personal information, and then turn it over to the government. It is much like the tactics of the Gestapo, the Stasi, or the Khmer Rouge, which more successfully wiped out their citizens. The days of random persecution are over. Now it is an organized effort to rid India of all who do not adhere to Hinduism. In fact, the country's motto has become, "India for Indians," which in their tongue is translated, "Hindustan, for Hindus."

If we have time and breath, we will continue to fund the efforts of the directors, pastors, and churches, supply their Bibles, and feed their orphans and widows, until someday, hopefully before the Rapture, the motto of India becomes, "India for the Kingdom of Christ."



The following are testimonies of two Muslim young ladies, in their own words, who live in a Hindu land and now follow Christ and have received Bibles of their own.

Bhanubi Shaik

"I come from a Muslim background. My parents are staunch religious fanatics who do not allow me to attend church services, but I do so secretly.

From the time I got saved, one mode of learning was through verbal teaching by the pastor, but I felt bad that I had no Bible or any scripture for reference.

For three years, I have been praying in secret that I would somehow get a copy, and today my dream came true. A person came to my doorstep and gave me the Bible, which I am reading now. One blessing that also came with the Bible is that my parents are not objecting to my reading it."

REQUEST

Solomon wrote that some of their Indian friends in less restrictive states are donating Kannada-language Bibles. Still, he continued, "We need Telugu Bibles in the thousands for the Telugu-speaking Christians in a neighboring state, where Final Frontiers began in India in 1994. Please provide us with what our new converts need, because the freedom of expression is in danger in South India." Telugu Bibles currently cost \$5.06 (each). The cost for 5,000 Bibles is \$25,300. Kakinada Bibles currently cost the same.

"I am from the Islamic religion, I grew up in a spiritual atmosphere and would practice praying five times a day, giving alms, and lead a very submissive life to my husband.

One day, I attended a Tailoring Institute, where, for the first time, a pastor came and shared the gospel with all of us and prayed that the Lord Jesus would give us wisdom and the skills we needed to earn a good living.

After classes, I went to my house and shared with my mom that a Christian preacher prayed, not for himself, nor for Christians, but he prayed for the Muslim women like me. This I could not believe, because in our religion we only pray for ourselves.

It was there, listening to his preaching, that I came to know Jesus as my Lord and Savior and began my Christian journey with happiness, knowing my sins had been forgiven. But in the depths of my heart, I was not satisfied with my Christian life because I wanted to know more about Jesus. I began asking for a Bible, but nobody could give me one because they didn't have one. I was so desperate that I even cried, and the preacher told me he would bring some the next month, but it didn't materialize.

This setback caused me to pray even more, and I began to search, but there are no Christian book stalls (stores) anywhere to buy a Bible. Then, after some time, he bought me one. I thanked him and told him I was so grateful for the difference he had made in my life. Now, I am slowly ministering in secret throughout the week to over 46 women and young girls in our Muslim community."

It is interesting to note that as she began to read, she would find Proverbs 13, which specifically addressed her situation. Verse 12 states: "Hope deferred maketh the heart sick: but when the desire cometh, it is a tree of life." Verse 19 states, "The desire accomplished is sweet to the soul."

This is Pastor Raju Hullur, handing a Bible to a new convert from Islam. He risks his freedom just by handing a Bible to a believer who has been praying for one for many years. Some have suggested that they are not truly Christian because they still live in Muslim homes. However, they do not participate in Islamic ceremonies or attend the mosque. Our pastors refer to I Kings 19:18, where God told Elijah that he was not alone, but that 7,000 others were living in secret who had not bowed their knees to Baal, nor had their mouths kissed his idol.

In 2025, this one team, by God's goodness and your generosity, distributed 7,436 Bibles to Kannada-speaking Christians. However, we still need thousands more, because day by day souls are being added to His Kingdom. You have been the channel of His blessing to us for thirty years. We have grown from a small handful of preachers and churches to several thousand house churches, some even with their own facilities. It is getting difficult for us, but this is not the time to slack off. Please don't forget us. Please help us. We need more Bibles.

There is no doubt that the Bible itself is the strongest witness for Christ. He is, after all, the Word of God, and it is alive, and powerful and sharp! Often, Americans make the mistake of thinking it is only for the poor and weak, those oppressed by their governments. Still, I have known princes and kings, chiefs and lords, who, while reading the outlawed Word of God, met face to face with Him, on their own road to Emmaus. His words burned within them as well. At times, we have the families of Imams convert, and sometimes the Imam himself, as in the following story, sent to us by Pastor Samuel in India.

Gousiya B. is 52 years old and came to us from a Muslim background. Her husband serves as an Imam (spiritual leader) in the local mosque. Six months ago, Preacher Samuel was evangelising publicly by preaching in the open-air where there happened to be a mosque among the other buildings. Gousiya lives with her husband in the mosque and listened from her window as he preached. When he was finished and had left, she went to bed but could not sleep. The words "Jesus loves you, and He forgives the sins of all those who seek Him" echoed in her mind all night long.

The next morning, she came to the church building and introduced herself as the wife of an Imam. This was frightening to our preacher, so he sought the Lord before speaking to her. In their conversation, she seemed to focus on one primary question: "Will the Lord Jesus forgive me for being the wife of a Muslim Imam?" Samuel then took his Bible and read John 3:16, and as he read, tears began to stream from her eyes. At that moment, she decided to seek the Lord Jesus.

The following Sunday, she attended church and continued to attend without any break for six months. Then she bravely and openly obeyed the Lord in water baptism—with the consent of her husband, who never hindered her from attending our services. He, in fact, had met with Samuel secretly (just like Nicodemus) by coming to the pastor's house to seek clarification on his numerous questions, and departed with a request to pray for him regularly.

Gousiya is not shy in her witness but quietly and with discretion ministers to around 40 Muslim ladies who have also followed Christ and are secretly living a

Christian life amid the Muslim congregation in their community. Her eyes are open to the suppression and violence that many women like her silently endure in the Name of Jesus.

A truly inspiring aspect of her journey is that every morning and every night before bed, she reads the Bible and prays for her entire family. Her husband, too, is slowly beginning to understand the truth.

Are there any other Children's Churches or Sunday Schools that would like to take up the challenge? Imagine what the children can do together.

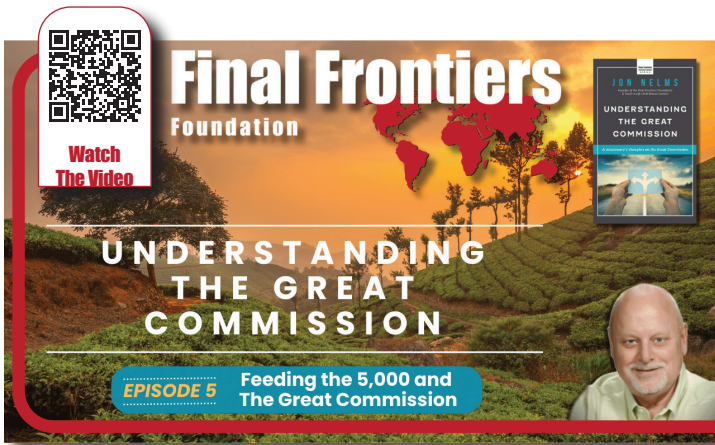


PS – If other projects are better suited to your kids, consider helping with our TOUCH A LIFE feeding centers funds. We can share photos and stories about some of the children they will be helping. Last year, I reported to you about the Children's Church class at Pleasant Beach Baptist in Elizabethton, Tennessee. Pastor Mark Fowler and his associate, Markus Seacrist, have led their church to be 100% on board with us. Even bringing a group to Honduras.

This past year, Brother Tommy Vaughn led his children's church to get personally involved in missions by asking each kid to bring 35¢ every Sunday to help us print and smuggle Bibles, specifically in the Middle East and North Africa. (They are \$6 each.) While they hoped to purchase up to 100 Bibles by the end of the year, they had collected enough to purchase 380! That's \$2,280 of pocket change. These First-through-Third graders were evidently not satisfied to be limited to their personal wealth and did all they could to raise more. And as you can see, they didn't even waste money on an expensive piggybank. (Way to go, Tommy!)

Feeding the 5000 and The Great Commission

Jesus once preached to an outdoor assembly of 5,000 men, along with women and children. If 5,000 men would forfeit their wages by walking off their job for an entire day, one can only imagine how the crowd must have increased with the addition of the homebound women, children, and servants.

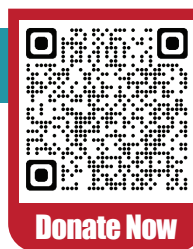
After teaching for hours, our Lord paused to feed the crowd. Since his team had not brought food, they followed his command to search for whatever was available in the crowd. They found a young boy whose mother had provided him with five pieces of what was probably flatbread and two small fish, most likely roasted or grilled.

Jesus prayed to His Father, who multiplied the boy's lunch, providing enough for everyone to eat. He then told His disciples to pass out the food. Imagine how long such a task would take and how repetitively tedious it would have been for the disciples. But what if the disciples had misunderstood His command, thinking **our Lord's intention** was simply to distribute the food rather than to provide portions for ALL the people present? What if the disciples had then logically passed out the first portions to those who sat nearest the Lord, gathered more, and went back to distribute more food to the same people again and again until it was all gone? Those fortunate few in the front would have been gluttonous, eating more than they needed and hoarding what they did not. Their misunderstanding would have given those nearest the Lord a sufficiently bountiful surplus to open their own bakeries and fish restaurants. Still, thousands of others would have gone away hungry and empty-handed. So, we see that understanding the Lord's intention was vital to fulfilling **His purpose!**

Speaking of intent and purpose, our Lord encourages us to give to support His work (**His intent**), but did you know, according to American mission surveys, that of every \$100 given to churches across our land, only one dollar goes to missions? We spend the \$99 on ourselves, then, hoarding the abundance, we pray with our hands up, not out, asking for more for ourselves. We commandeer the abundance God meant for helping and evangelizing others, and consume it for our own desires. And what of the \$1 that does go to missions? Incredibly, 90¢ of the remaining \$1 is used to support our foreign missionaries serving in areas already saturated with the gospel. Only 10¢ of every \$100 go to help give the Bread of Life to those who have never heard His name. (**His purpose**) When Christ gave us the Great Commission, He did not have in mind distributing bread to the front row of a hungry crowd, but the Bread of Life to all the world—even to those sitting way in the back.

Points to Ponder

- Considering we have yet to obey His command, do you suppose the front rows may be overweight with gospel consumption while others starve without it?
- What can you do to deliver the Bread of Life to those who only see it from a distance and hunger for a taste?
- While some today disagree with using food, health care, etc., as a tool to present the gospel in an embracing way, Jesus did so all the time. Was He wrong? How do His actions influence your view of helping as well as preaching?
- When it comes to giving, what is your intent and purpose? Does it match with His?

Still, after one week of training with our coaches, the following season, they lost first place in Florida by a penalty kick in overtime. Second place may be the "first place loser," but it beats being the last place loser!

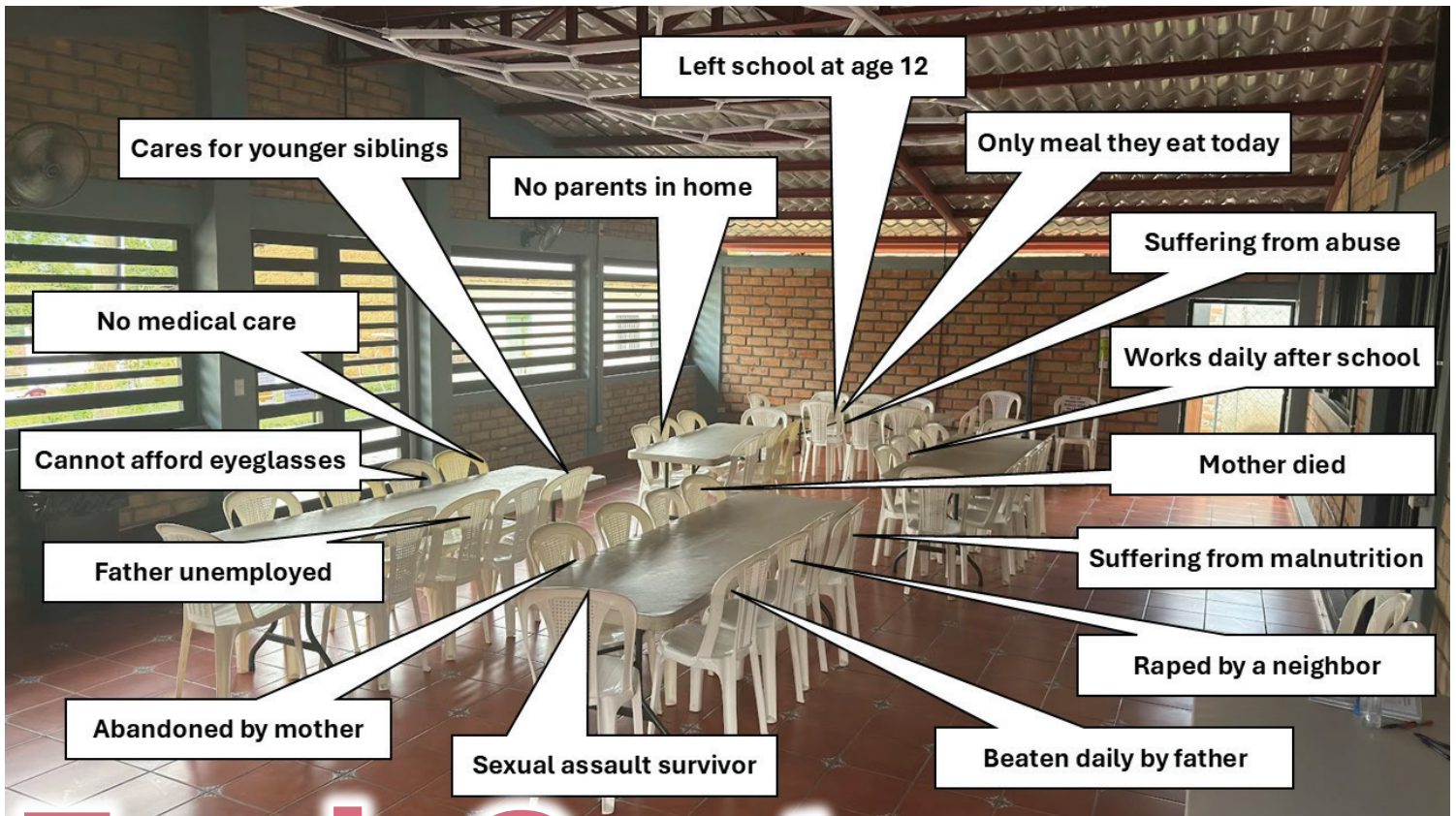

Each Seat Tells a Story

This is our first feeding center, founded in Cantarranas (Honduras) in 2005. We started in an old house, but within several months, we had outgrown it. Then a team from the First Missionary Baptist Church in Justice, West Virginia, visited and saw our need for more space. They purchased a 5,000-square-meter (5,382-square-foot) property on the town's main road for us, and we began raising funds to construct the facility. Since that time, we have continued to buy, build, and expand our ministry outreach into additional locations and countries.

One of our most noticeable changes was converting our concrete front patio into a beautiful, tiled, and protected seating area (see photo) that now serves as the feeding center. Each day we serve 60 or more unsupported children, and their numbers continue to grow. As you know, we no longer sponsor individual children (except the few still grandfathered in), as this method left many others unable to eat. We now use the funds donated to Touch a Life to feed large groups rather

than individuals. As we open new centers, ten so far in Honduras, every child in the village is allowed to "come and dine."

But there are villages pleading for help. We want to nourish them all with the Bread of Life as they come into a clean, safe, and comfortable place to eat, sing, watch Bible stories and cartoons, and fill their little stomachs. There are no other places like it in their towns. And even though all seems well, you never know the condition of their lives, their sorrows and burdens, until you get to know them personally. Each child has a story to tell, and many are heart-wrenching, but you can give their stories a happy ending.

Thank you for being our partner with TOUCH A LIFE and for allowing us to get to know and feed thousands of children in ten countries. Imagine what more we can do together.

Here are a few photos from some of our other feeding centers around the world. They are all based out of one of our churches in their village.



Kenya

One of eight Feeding Centers in Kenya. All these children sleep on dirt floors, have only one change of clothes, no running water, and many lack electricity. Ladies in the church cook, feed, and teach these children as volunteers. (Unfortunately, the girls are seated outside the photo frame.) Their parents are share-croppers or raise a few cows for milk. Jesus loves them!

India

One of five Feeding Centers in India. These are the children of lepers. We have three centers just for leper children. They are not allowed to mingle with other children. Many will contract leprosy as teenagers. They will beg for food to eat each day and wear discarded clothing. But Jesus loves them!



Egypt

These are the children at our feeding center in Cairo, Egypt. They are descended from Mizraim, the son of Ham, and grandson of Noah. Day by day, their numbers grow. The servants of Islam don't feed them; the servants of Jesus do. Why? Because Jesus loves them too!

Jon Nelms is the founder of Final Frontiers. Called to missions at the age of eleven, he has been winning souls since he was twelve. Jon was a street preacher, pastor, church planter, and missionary before founding Final Frontiers in 1986 at the age of 30.

When most people think of estate planning, they think of something rich families do to handle big houses, land, and investments. But estate planning is for everyone. It's about deciding what happens to what God has given you — your time, your money, and your treasures — after you're gone.

For believers, estate planning is about much more than money. It's a way to show faith and purpose that can live on after we leave this world. And one of the most powerful ways to do that is by supporting missions giving — helping the gospel go out to the ends of the earth, just as Jesus commanded.

“Go ye therefore, and teach all nations...”

— Matthew 28:19 (KJV)

Estate planning gives strength and structure to our giving. It takes the hope in our hearts and turns it into a lasting plan that blesses others long after we're gone. Let's explore how estate planning can become a powerful mission field in itself.

Understanding What Estate Planning Really Means

Estate planning simply means making decisions now about what happens later. It includes things like:

- Writing a will that directs who receives your things.
- Setting up a trust to manage your money with purpose and protection.
- Naming beneficiaries for your accounts or life insurance. Make a

simple beneficiary change and make a missions gift of a portion of your life insurance benefit.

Planning for charitable gifts that support the ministries and missions you love

Too often, people delay these decisions, thinking they'll handle them “someday.” But none of us knows what tomorrow will bring.

*“Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow.
For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth
for a little time, and then vanisheth away.”*

— James 4:14 (KJV)

Making a plan today is not just wise — it's biblical. God calls His people to be stewards, which means we manage His blessings faithfully. Estate planning allows us to do that carefully and intentionally, instead of leaving it to chance or the courts.

God's View of Stewardship

Everything we have — every dollar, every home, every heartbeat — truly belongs to God. We are only caretakers for a little while. The Bible reminds us:

*“The earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof;
the world, and they that dwell therein.”*

— Psalm 24:1 (KJV)

If God owns it all, then our role is to manage it according to His will. Estate planning puts that truth into action. It's an act of obedience and

worship, not fear or pride. When we draft a will or set up a charitable trust, we are saying, “Lord, I want my life, even after my death, to honor You.” That’s a beautiful testimony of faith.

Turning Faith into a Legacy

A legacy is what you leave behind — not just in money, but in ministry, love, and example. Estate planning can make that legacy last for generations. Imagine this: A family decides to give 10% of their estate to missions through their church or a Christian organization. They already tithe faithfully during their lives, but they want God’s work to continue even after they’re gone.

Decades later, their gift might still be helping missionaries share the gospel in new nations, start churches, or support Bible translation projects. They may be gone, but their influence keeps sending light into the darkness. That’s the power of legacy giving — it multiplies your faith.

“Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven...”

— Matthew 6:19-20 (KJV)

When we invest in eternal causes, we move our treasure — and our hearts — into heaven.

Examples of Faithful Planning

Let’s look at a few simple examples that show how estate planning can bless missions for years to come.

A Farmer’s Harvest Gift:

Tom was a farmer who loved his local church and helped support a missionary in Kenya. Before he passed away, he put part of his farmland into a charitable trust that would sell crops each year and send the profits to missions. That land still provides food — both for the body and the soul — in more ways than one.

A Teacher’s Example:

Mary was a schoolteacher who had a modest life but a big heart. She had no children of her own, so she left part of her estate to support Bible schools in South America. Today, her legacy helps young pastors learn the Word and reach their nations for Christ.

A Family Foundation:

The Johnson family decided to form a family foundation that gives to missions each year. They use their estate plan to fund it, and now their children and grandchildren gather annually to decide which ministries to support. It’s become a family mission that keeps their faith alive across generations. Each of these people made choices that carried the love of Jesus farther than they ever could alone.

How to Include Missions in Your Plan

Building missions giving into your estate plan is easier than you might think. Here are some simple ways to begin:

Talk with God first.

Spend time in prayer. Ask, “Lord, how can my life’s resources bring the gospel to others after I’m gone?”

While They Wait...

Dr. Nanco is a Filipina doctor who is a member of the church of Pastor Gelladula, here in Lemery. Dr. Nanco dedicates 3 days a week for medical services to the people in this area for free. Her clinic opens at 7 am and goes until 7 pm. She has no nurses to help her.

She invites Pastor Gelladula, his wife, or other soulwinners from the church to come to the clinic and preach to the 100 or so people waiting in line.

I’ve seen medical missions where doctors come into an area for a couple weeks and then go home, but this dear lady does this exhausting every week.

There were around 20 of those waiting who acknowledged their need for Jesus to be their Savior when I preached there yesterday.

Estate planning is not just about money—it's about legacy. Share your heart with your loved ones so they understand your desire to support missions. This conversation can inspire them to continue your example of generosity.

Faith Over Fear

Some people hesitate to make an estate plan because they feel uncomfortable talking about death or afraid of making mistakes. But for a believer, planning for eternity is not something to fear — it's something to celebrate! Estate planning gives you more control over the future.

The Bible gives hope for those who trust in Christ:

“To be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.”

— 2 Corinthians 5:8 (KJV)

Planning ahead doesn't shorten life; it strengthens the time we have left. It frees us to focus on what truly matters — serving, giving, and loving.

When you put your affairs in order, you gain peace of mind and a sense of purpose. You also protect your family from confusion and conflict, leaving them with clarity and the comfort of your faith.

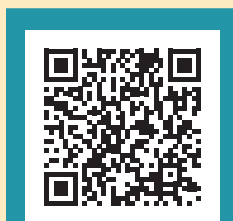

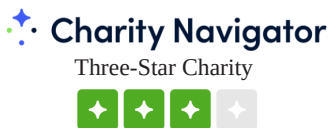
