Currently we are ministering in over eighty countries; many of which are closed to foreign missionaries. In other countries, work among the various tribal groups is restricted to national preachers only; thus they are open to us because of our unique method of missions.

We believe that the training and subsidizing of national preachers is the most efficient and effective method of global evangelism. We seek to raise prayer and financial support from believers in the West, for God's servants abroad, who are actively involved in church planting and discipleship.

Selection of those we sponsor is dependent upon their doctrinal beliefs, need, reputation and ministry experience. We support only those who are serving by faith, never those who are waiting for a salary in order to serve. Worldwide, the average preacher in a third-world country needs as little as \$25.00 - \$350.00 each month to support his family and ministry.

All those subsidized through this foundation are involved in church planting. Their various outreach ministries include: Bible translation and distribution, radio and television broadcasting, camps, Bible schools, outdoor and film evangelism, educational and health programs, handicap and leper ministries, orphan and children's ministries, etc. The Foundation receives its funding from individuals, churches, businesses, etc. who choose to support our preachers, projects, or desperate children under the Foundation's oversight; or give general donations allowing the funds to be used where needed.



Unfortunately, though, not all our news is good. There is no easy way to say it: the economy is killing us!

For only the third time in 39 years, we are experiencing a financial burden that we can not bear alone. Our resources usually increase yearly by 3% to 11%. Still, since August, our operating fund has had a monthly deficit of \$40,000, a result from smaller-than-usual donations.

As the chart below shows, funds for the preachers and children seem reasonably consistent in recent years. And though seemingly low, the Smugglers Fund (Bibles) has reliable pledges that should alleviate its deficit. The remainder of our resources are for special projects, such as Middle East needs, wells, motorcycles, etc., and the operating fund. Giving for all these is down over 50% evry month for nine months.

I asked for help a few weeks ago and received over \$29,341. In addition, our entire staff has taken pay cuts, but it is not enough. Please help us financially, and pray that the economy improves faster than anticipated. Our ministry exists to help others, and we rarely ask anything for ourselves, but now we are asking.

33-year-old Muslim Man Reads Bible and **Accepts Christ as His Savior**

reetings to all of you in the name of our Lord and Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. I would like to express my deepest gratitude to all of you for praying and supporting us through these hard years to fulfill our God's call in my life to reach our people for Christ, especially those who live in state of conflict between fear of the religious heritage they inherited through birth and the religious authority that controls and dominates people, and their questions that arise through their search for his fault or that Allah didn't want to answer the truth and God.

One of these people, a 33-year-old man from a devout Muslim family, learned from a young age to obey the Quran, the Islamic Hadiths, religious leaders, and the Islamic tradition of worship without any doubts or questions. The older he grew and the more he studied the Quran and the Hadith, the more questions accumulated in his mind about his religion. Whenever he tried to ask those questions to the religious men who taught him, he would be intimidated by the accusation that he was disbelieving in their religion's authority and would receive Allah's punishment. He was living in a state of confusion between his intense desire to obey Allah and his prophet Muhammad and the teachings, and intense fear that was planted within him of Allah's severe punishments, especially after death.

When he finished high school and entered university to complete his education, he realized that their cultural, social, political, and religious beliefs and lives were built on the same principles of religion, which is fear and punishment even from questioning. Then, he realized why the loved God. Still, he was terrified of him. authorities ruled them with an iron fist.

This realization only created more questions about the credibility of his denomination. After that, he began to compare the religious contradictions between his denomination and other Islamic denominations and noticed that all Islamic countries that claim Islam is the only source of laws in their countries rule their people with an iron fist. His question was, "What's wrong with our religion?" He tried to discover the correct measure of religion and Allah.

One day, he went to the Mosque, and after the prayer, he sat with the Imam and discussed some religious matters with him. (In Islam, Allah has 99 attributes such as Most Holy, Most Merciful, etc.) so the Imam advised him to repeat one of these attributes 500 times. He said, "Allah will send an angel to you to help you remove all your confusion

and questions." So, this young man decided to do it. Still, no angel visited him, and nothing happened to him. Then, he tried to obey all the teachings to get answers to his questions, but still, nothing happened to him. He concluded that the mistake was

Years have passed as he has been trying to understand who God is and that he wants to be worshipped. Meanwhile, our God has been working through all of us with your support to get the Word of God out so we can make it possible to give to those people who are seeking Him. We believe that "Faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God."

Indeed, Christianity was not the path he could think of taking to find God because of what he learned in his upbringing about Christianity. Still, when he met one of our church members, everything changed. We teach our members how to build a bridge between the people and us to present the Gospel to them and be protected.

When friendship began to develop between them, questions about God and who He is were the main subjects. Our church member laid down the foundation by talking about God in the Bible, and he started by asking him, "Where does a person learn to love, and how do we know we love God?" That person answered that he did not know if he

So, our church member started explaining to him how we can love God. Our church member noticed that the person was listening attentively and asked if he would like to meet with me to hear more about the love of God. The young man immediately replied, "Yes,

When we started to meet, he was ready to listen about God's love and how we could have a personal relationship with Him. When I offered him a Bible, he accepted it without hesitation, started to read it, and consistently had questions about it. The more he read the word of God, the more he would say, "You don't need anything more than this Book to understand why we need the Love of God." Shortly thereafter, he came to the knowledge of Salvation by accepting the Lord Jesus Christ

Tn a strategy as old as the book of Acts, missionaries are tasked by **⊥** Heaven to reach people who have not heard the gospel, establish a church among them, then move on to another area where Jesus is not known.

God laid out the pattern for missions in the New Testament through the ministry of Paul, who preached the Gospel, baptized the converts, and planted new churches.

Paul understood that these converts were more influential among their own people than any outsider could be, so he raised up pastors a pastor to come and take the little flock and from within the community of believers to shepherd these flocks. Eager to share the Good News with family and friends in nearby towns and villages, these churches became launching pads for the gospel.

In today's lingo, these local pastors are referred to as national preachers who, by definition, serve their own people. Unlike their foreign counterparts, national preachers share the same language and culture, making them uniquely able to reach their own people.

Winning Souls

We must never stop sending faithful productive missionaries, but we must increase our funding for the nationals who are already there serving through the funding of national preachers.

Final Frontiers' **Great Commission Fund** provides funding for national preachers who are proven church planters working primarily in regions where Christ is both unnamed and unknown. These are doctrinally sound, morally pure men who have come by strong recommendation, completed lengthy applications, and have verifiable ministry experience.

They win souls by witnessing one-on-one, door-to-door, and with

street preaching until a nucleus of newly saved and baptized believers has been developed.

The church planter begins meeting with the new congregation weekly or even more often to teach them God's Word, train them to witness to their families and friends, and begin to mature the body. If the man is a pastor, he stays; if he is a missionary, he finds mature it.



Planting Churches


Meanwhile, the national preacher selects two or three men from the tiny congregation to move forward with him to the next village. They receive on-the-job training from him as he goes to a new

This scenario repeats over and over again, and this is how we fulfill the Great Commission: by working in teams, as our Lord and the Apostle Paul taught us. These teams abound in energy and effort but lack the provision of food and supplies. Support from our Great Commission Fund dramatically accelerates their efforts.

The **Great Commission Fund** supports national preachers and preachers in training. Your gifts help us fund entire teams. Without our assistance, they are severely handicapped.

Through the funding of national preachers, we endeavor to effectively advance the gospel where it has never been preached before. We have thousands of dedicated, proven church planters in our ministry. They all have needs that, if met, would help them produce more churches and more church planters.

Late last year, yet another trial came down the pipe. His home and

all his possessions were burned by unknown arsonists. He was able to escape safely with his family, but everything inside their home was lost. Although local officials have not yet proven the identity of the culprits, they suspect Muslim extremists.

Why don't you allow us to lead a peaceful life as Hindus?" I told her that I don't force anybody, nor do I want to convert people.

Then another woman asked me to pray for her family. I prayed and was about to proceed. Just then the wife of the man who threatened me came to me and said, "I feel you are man

of God. Could you also pray for me and my husband? We have no children." I wholeheartedly prayed, then visited a few men who were waiting for me, and returned home.

After two months, I received a call from the woman, stating that she was pregnant and inviting me to her house to once again to pray for her. Accordingly, I went. The man who threatened me now bowed his head and sought forgiveness. Later, I shared the gospel. He, along with five families, have come to the Lord. Thank you



Will You Help Us Reach Teenagers In Honduras?

When I was in Bible College, our team had a youth ministry that God blessed. We started with less than twenty, and eighteen months later, we were ministering to over 350 teenagers from Chicago every Sunday.

Their lives changed so that siblings and parents began to attend our teenage church. We even had our own nursery and adult classes. All this to say, I know how to work with youth and their potential as a mighty force for the Gospel.


For the past two summers, we have conducted a one-day youth camp at our facility in Honduras. In 2023, after evangelizing at the local high school, we invited the youth to our facility for activities and food. I expected ten percent of the youth to come, but I was shocked when the entire student body arrived - more than three hundred teenagers! What's more, the entire teaching and administrative staff also came. They marched up together as if in a parade, and when our automatic gate opened, they flooded in. The principal, for a moment,

stood in awe, then said to my wife, Nolin, "I never knew such a paradise existed here in our town." We've worked hard to make our campus a beautiful place for the community and provide space for all sorts of activities.

Last summer, we did it again, and their numbers grew. This time, Pastor Steve Ware of the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Orlando and his team came prepared with colossal soccer balls (about five feet high), volleyballs, nets, egg tosses, basketballs, water balloons, and more. (And they left them behind for our continual use.) They also provided lunch with drinks for all the teens and a Bible lesson. Some stood while others sat on our porches and in the shade under the mango trees to respectfully listen to the Word of God and His offer of salvation. Later, we awarded prizes and gave every student a \$10 food bag to take home. (About one-third of all the youth are listed as undernourished or malnourished by the Honduran government.)

No matter what improvements we make at our facility, I always have evangelism in mind, as well as being a benefit to the community. 2025 will be no exception.

Such activities are not free or cheap, but they are far less expensive than equivalent activities here in America and likely far more productive. These youth are not accustomed to activities provided for their entertainment and spiritual enlightenment. What we would consider a mediocre activity for American youth is mind-blowing to them. So, this summer, I want to target the entire student body from







several high schools, including their teachers and administrators. There will be around 350-400 people, and many will be malnourished.

If youth ministry is important to you, please consider sponsoring a teenager to attend this year. They will receive a Gospel witness and a New Testament to take home (as long as the last), lunch, a snack, cool drinks, multiple activities, and a \$10 food bag for their family. We also plan to provide a weekly youth Bible study for those hungry to know more about our Lord, and the administrator has also opened the door for us to have weekly Bible classes at the school.

What "an effectual door of opportunity" has been opened to us. But I need your help. My spirit is willing, and our staff is eager, but my wallet is weak.

A suggested sponsorship for one teenager to attend the multi-hour activity is only \$20 (including the \$10 food bag). That's \$8000 for 400 teenagers! I will follow up afterward with photos and videos posted online. With help from our staff and my wife, Nolin, we will upload some live shots and videos so you can share their excitement in real-time.

with their leader, Ricky Torres, and his wife. They have visited us many times and have a tremendous testimony infused with evangelistic zeal. This will be a great week as they help me host the local teens – if we can raise the necessary funds. Please help me.














Help for the Devadasis

Late last year, we released a video to bring awareness to the Devadasis. These were true testimonies of real Devadasi women living in India who have come out of a life of prostitution and are seeking refuge in Christ. Along with the video, we put out a call to raise \$15,000 to help support these women. So far \$11,255 has come in for this project, and we wanted to share with you the results thus far! Please read a report from our regional director on the impact your funds have had so far.

Impact

The moms are able to feed their kids without depending on money lenders or landlords. Their children are going to school instead of going to work as child laborers. Your support has saved them from the clutches of moneylenders.

In case **Final Frontiers Foundation** continues to offer such grants, we intend to assist unwed mothers who were once eeking a miserable living as Temple prostitutes/sex workers. They are now exercising freedom in Christ Jesus. Due to their fragile health and no longer being able to attract customers, they are now living under the shackles of moneylenders and landlords barely earning \$2 a day. It is surely a matter of life and death for them.

Formal employment opportunities are few, thereby your financial grant is a recourse to these humble Christians.




The Preachers County County The Preachers from Nandi County - Kenya

He grew up in Iowa, then began missionary work, pioneering into closed countries, and documenting expeditions to unreached jungle tribes.



Motorcycle Month

Introducing Phillip Daniel Frei

Pour years ago, I began mentoring an Austrian missionary, Philip Daniel Frei, online. He heard me interviewed on a mission blog and ordered my book, The Great Omission. Reading it, he became convinced that as a missionary, he should be doing more than pastoring a single church. He began winning adults to Christ, started three more house churches, and is training nine men for ministry, scattered across Europe.

In February, four from Germany and one from France came with Philip to America for a short visit. I drove to Alabama to have an afternoon with them.

Several churches invited Philip to return in October/November. He has two weeks open. We often hear that Europe is a difficult mission field, but somehow, he is getting the job done! Find out how.

He hopes to raise \$3,000 monthly support, which is about 40% of foreign missionaries' requirements. This support will help him cover his team's travel and lodging expenses across Europe as he plants more churches, leaving the people's tithes to support their pastors and evangelistic efforts.

Also, working with Final Frontiers, he will encourage established European churches to help support our Great Commission Fund, Touch a Life, and Smugglers.

On February 6, Dennis Ellis passed on to Glory to be reunited with his Lord, family members, and those he brought to Christ throughout his life. Dennis was the bus pastor for Dr. Adrain Rogers before moving to Russia as a missionary—long before the wall came down. At one time, he was the only American missionary there, and when others came years later, he was the only one to be a legal resident of Russia. A little-known KGB officer named Vladimir Putin approved his residency application at the time.

After building a successful ministry and helping us support several church planters there, Dennis and his Ukranian wife, Katya, felt the Lord leading them to return to America and help us raise support for national church planters. He has worked to get more than four hundred sponsorships in the last several decades. At first, he went anywhere we needed him. In recent years, due to health problems, he limited his service to within driving distance of his home, south of Knoxville.


Dennis and Katya lived on Social Security, giving their love offerings to support the national preachers he loved so much. If someone gave him a car, he would sell it and give the money to missions. He once sold a car

multiple times. When people learned of his plan, they would give him the price of the car and tell him to sell it to someone else.

He would also collect cans, encouraging his friends to do the same and give those funds to missions. At his death, he had collected his last bundle of cans for the Great Commission Fund, and Katya mailed us the check for \$42.14.





Feeding Centers Reach Severely

C olli Marian Zuniga Velasquez was born on October 6, 2020. Her Ocousin, Belin Elizabeth Zuniga Velasquez, was born on October 26, 2021. They live together in a one-room house with an outdoor kitchen and latrine with their grandmother, Marcellina. They are humble people who share a home that they do not own. A neighbor has pity on them and allows them to live free of charge, yet they can be evicted at any time and forced to live on the streets. The photos will give you an idea of their poverty.

Belin's father was murdered during her first year. Not long after that, her mother, Jasmin, abandoned her, leaving Belin with her grandmother and great-grandmother.

These ladies spend time daily looking for food and kindling for the stove. Unfortunately, the grandmother has limited mental capacity, and the great-grandmother is very elderly and unable to function well. They need help.

Solli still has parents: her mother, Rixzy Maria, and stepfather. She also has a little brother, Elan. Her stepfather works in the fields, earning about \$2 a day. During harvest season, he tries to take care of all seven. When the harvest is over, the struggle begins in earnest.

Now that Touch a Life has begun shifting from individual child sponsorship to supporting all the children in the neighborhood around a feeding center, we are having more and more children attend who are living in absolute poverty. The individual sponsorship method continues for those who, in years past, selected a specific child to help. Compared to the masses, those fortunate few have experienced a dramatic change in their lives over the years. They are taller, healthier, better educated, and happier than their neighbors who were never selected.

Our new method feeds any hungry child who enters one of our feeding centers. When we made this change, our feeding center director in Cantarranas, Juana, informed us of this family she has known for many years and asked my wife Nolin to go with her to visit them. Nolin has visited their house often to chat with the older ladies and bring them clothes, shoes, and food because she is concerned for the elderly who have been forgotten or abandoned by their families. This past summer, Nolin invited some of the ladies visiting us on a Visionary Trip to go with her and was surprised to see these two little



girls. Everyone's hearts were touched.

When she approached the house, she saw the girls on the street looking for discarded fruits that were not yet fit to eat or far past their freshness. Seeing these American ladies approaching their little house, the girls followed them. That is when and how we found the girls-or they found us. By the week's end, Nolin visited them several times, bringing more food and clothes. She saw that the girls had very few clothes and no shoes. Having never worn shoes until she was fifteen, Nolin sympathized with them and, with her sister Maxie, bought shoes and dresses for both little girls.

Now that we are raising funds at any amount from anyone willing to give, we have found that we can feed many more children, including Solli and Belin. Though I miss the "personal touch" of "one child-one sponsor," I must remember that my goal was never to see how much we could help a few children but how efficiently we could help masses of hungry kids. This change has allowed churches to come on board to help by adopting a feeding center. (Some are for feeding five days a week, and others are for Sunday meals while at church.) For example, the Bible Baptist Church in Fairfield, OH, after visiting last summer, gave an offering to build a new feeding center attached to our church in the village of Zurzular. Tabernacle Baptist in Orlando provided the original building, and Bible Baptist in Fairfield provided the new feeding area and the budget to feed all the children in the village for at

In Honduras, food prices have increased by 35% over the past two years, making it increasingly difficult to feed hungry children. Still, the help from churches like these and families who share the burden of feeding the hungry continues to make our ministry possible.

Thank you all – now, let's do more.

HONDURAS New Feeding Patio

A new feeding area was recently built at the church in Zurzular. The congregation has its founding pastor back, and attendance is booming. They are having around 80 adults and 80 children each Sunday. The good people of Bible Baptist Church in Fairfield, Ohio, visited last summer. Afterward, Pastor Wally Miller led his church to take a Christmas

offering that built the feeding patio and funds to help feed all 80+ children every Sunday or more for about a year. On top of that, they are giving \$50 monthly support for the pastor. All that for about \$15,000. It's incredible how far your money can go in developing countries. Thank you.


