- 4. Read Ecclesiastes 3:1-8. Why do you think God allows us to go through hard times? Why do you think God allows us to go through good times?
- 5. What questions do you tend to ask—of God and yourself—when things are challenging and it doesn't make sense?
- 6. Read Ecclesiastes 3:11. Have you ever experienced God making something beautiful that didn't seem like it could be?
- 7. How do you need to move from boredom into awe? What steps will you take this week to focus on the beauty of Jesus?
