

What Happens After You Die Part 4: Welcome to Hell

Revelation 20:7-15, Romans 3:23-25, John 3:16-18

- 1. What was most memorable, challenging, or encouraging from the message this week?
- 2. Discuss the questions Tim reviewed in the message. What surprised you? What confirmed what you already suspected or knew?
- 3. C.S. Lewis wrote that, "The doors of hell are locked from the inside." What do you think of the idea that hell is your decision to live without God, not God's decision to live without you?
- 4. To what extent have you seen God appear to honor (i.e. not intervene with) poor decisions you've made here on earth, and bad decisions others have made here on earth?
- 5. Revelation 20:7-15 and Romans 3:23-26 both speak of the final judgment. According to those passages, how has Jesus provided a way out of eternal separation from Him? Why does that matter?
- 6. The vast majority of Christians never share their faith. If you're a Christian, how are you sharing your faith with other people to help them reconcile with God?
- 7. All of us can live without God in varying degrees. Identify some aspects of your life in which you could draw closer to God. What will you do about them?

MOVING FORWARD

This week, spend some time praying for friends who are on the verge of rejecting Christ, or who have rejected Christ. Ask God to help you share Christ's love with them, and to maybe even invite them to church or a conversation with you.
