## From Pastor Chris



This is the second year that First Presbyterian Church of the Covenant has participated in "Erie Gives," the Erie Community Foundation's non-profit fundraising day held on Tuesday, August 14th. The amount received compared to 2017 tripled to \$38,042 and fifty percent more people participated. The response from the church and our friends is very encouraging.

As exciting as Erie Gives day is, it is important to remember what our true hope is, Jesus Christ. I am reminded of a reflection written by Victoria Stafford entitled "Hope."

"Our mission is to plant ourselves at the gates of hope - not the prudent gates of Optimism, which are somewhat narrower; not the stalwart, boring gates of Common Sense; not the strident gates of Self-Righteousness, which creek of shrill and angry hinges (people cannot hear us there; they cannot pass through); nor the cheerful, flimsy gate of "Everything Is Gonna Be All Right." But a different, sometimes lonely place, of truth-telling about your own soul first of all and its condition, the place of resistance and defiance, from which you see the world both as it is and as it could be, as it will be; the place from which you glimpse not only struggle but joy in the struggle. And we stand there, beckoning and calling, telling people what we are seeing, asking them what they see."

## ~ Adult Faith Formation on Sunday 9:30-10:30 a.m. ~

"*Future Faith*" ~ (Room 116) Join Rob Baker's faith formation class, (still looked at as the book discussion class). Last years book was thick and written by a university professor and information dense. This year's book "Future Faith" is much lighter reading and written by a pastor and administrative leader in the reformed church of America. He focuses on current and upcoming challenges facing the US church in light of recent global changes in demographics of the world wide church. Rob expects this book to present much more discussion opportunities and there is an author provided discussion guide already included in the book. There will be a notebook provided for class with supplemental materials and an ongoing connection to recent religious news through the Pew foundation's religion news updates some of which will show up as handouts for class.

**Pastor's Class** ~ (Fidelis Room) Pastor Chris will be teaching on the parables in his Faith Formation Class this Fall. During Advent we will switch to a series called "The Advent Conspiracy." This class is not about how much or how little you know, but about asking questions and growing in faith. All are welcome!

## **Children & Youth Protection Policy**



We are a congregation that is dedicated and motivated to make this space a safe place **PROTECT** for all people to feel welcome to have a life-changing encounter with our living Lord Jesus Christ. In order to make this space a safe place for all, the P.C. (USA) requires all churches and faith communities to implement a Child and Youth Protection Policy. Here is a reminder of our Child and Youth Protection Policy:

- 1. All faith formation classes for children and youth must have two adult teachers including the nursery. All teachers and leaders working with Children and Youth under the age of 18 will be required to complete all Child Abuse, State Police, and FBI clearances as well as complete Mandated and Permissive Reporter Training.
- 2. Parents will be required to sign-in and out when dropping off and picking up their child who is in 5th grade or younger.
- 3. Parents will be required to pick up their child within 10 minutes of any activity, faith formation, or worship service ending. If they are not picked up by then, teachers will bring the child to the front office and parents will be contacted. (Only applies to children in 5th grade and younger)
- 4. All classes and activities for children and youth must take place in rooms with observation window or door open.
- 5. All classrooms and rooms in the church not in use will be locked. After the Faith Formation hour, all doors on the second and third floor will be locked.

### Erie County CROP Hunger Walk



On Sunday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, First Covenant will once again participate in the CROP/Hunger Walk at Presque Isle. The walk's main purpose is to alleviate hunger locally and throughout the world as 842 million people still find themselves coping with daily hunger and malnutrition.

Locally, 25% of our donations are returned to Erie County to be distributed to agencies that combat hunger. Globally, CROP/Hunger Walk donations enable Church World Services to continue to invest in the right nu-

trition for children so they can grow strong and healthy. Communities are also empowered with skills and tools they need to make lasting changes that will feed them forever.

So why walk? In many developing nations, women walk an average of six miles each day to carry a five gallon jug of water on their head that weighs 42 pounds. Their family needs this water for drinking, cooking bathing or watering the garden or livestock. We walk because they walk. Please consider joining Team FPCC in walking this year. This congregation has reached out in combating hunger through Sunday Suppers. Let's continue to show our concern and support for the hungry by walking and supporting walkers in the CROP/Hunger Walk. If you can't walk five and a half miles, a one mile walk is available. The walk is for everyone; young and old. If you cannot walk on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, you can walk at another time. Walker's forms are available in the Welcome Center.

First Covenant has a rich history of being a leader, thanks to the late Gordon Osborn, in supporting the CROP/Hunger Walk. ## 411 on The Kirk House



With the beginning of the school year right around the corner & students moving back into the neighborhood I thought it would be a good time to answer some frequently asked questions about our ministry with college students through the Kirk House.

Believe in the possibilities.

#### \* <u>What is the Kirk House</u>?

The Kirk House is an intentional discipleship house for Gannon students. This means that we are a community dedicated to living life according to the gospel. The students will be challenged to show their housemates & guests what it looks like to follow Jesus in every area of life. From studying for their exams to the way they wash dishes, we believe that God can be glorified in all that we do. The Kirk House is the perfect place for students to build relationships with other students, our neighbors, and our church!

#### \* <u>Where is it</u>?

The Kirk House is located right behind the church, on the corner of 7<sup>th</sup> and Myrtle. We share the yard with the playground! Hopefully you had a chance to come visit us on Friday, August 24<sup>th</sup> for our annual Kirk House Cookout!

#### \* How many people can live there?

We have enough room for 13 people to live in the Kirk House. This year we have a total of 11 students in our community!

#### \* Do you have to be a Christian to live there?

No! We accept all students from different faith backgrounds and different walks of life. The structure of the Kirk House is based in scripture, but if they are willing to participate and be open to conversations about spirituality and faith then we would love to have them in our community!

#### \* How do students get to live there?

Students fill out an application detailing their commitments on campus, their faith experience and why they want to live in intentional community! The director of the house reviews their application, asks them to meet for an interview & tour the house. Then if the director thinks that they will be a good addition to the community, they will extend an invitation to live in the Kirk House.

#### \* What are the responsibilities of the Kirk House?

We ask that the Kirk House residents participate in 10 hours of house duties a week. This includes being a part of a local church, house cleaning, house meeting, weekly prayer/bible study, one on ones with the director, and house meals.

#### \* <u>Can boys and girls live there</u>?

The Kirk House is co-ed! We have a women's hall and a men's hall. This year we have four male students and six female students in our community!

If you have more questions that aren't answered here, feel free to talk to myself or any of the students living in the Kirk House this year! We would love to talk to you about how God is using the Kirk House to bring His kingdom come in Erie!
