Beads and other products needed for one earrings:

- 1 gram Size 11 Matte Opaque Cherry Round Japanese Seed Beads by Toho 45AF (SB1923)
- 1 gram Size 11 Opaque White Round Japanese Seed Bead (SB1379)
- 1 gram Size 11 Matte Opaque Cornflower Round Japanese Seed Beads by Toho 43DF (SB5830)
- 1 gram Size 11 Metallic Silver Round Japanese Seed Bead (SB2076)
- 2 Base Metal Round Open Jump Ring Silver 20 gauge 4mm (BM2747)
- 18 Base Metal Head Pin with 2mm Ball Silver 22 gauge 2 inch (BM2508)
- 2 Base Metal Eye Pin Silver 22 gauge 2 inch (BM2663)
- 1 6.5mm Sterling Silver Star Post Earring (SS5138)
- 1 Sterling Silver Bell Clutch Earring Back 5mm (SS4779)
- 2 Base Metal 2mm Flat Oval Link Cable Chain Silver (CN3200)



Tools needed to complete the earrings:

Round nose pliers Chain nose pliers Wire cutters

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Beading Techniques needed to complete the earrings:

Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Simple Loop Cutting Chain Efficiently

Instructions to complete "Firework Fringe" earrings:

Step 1

String the following beads onto one head pin:


- 7 cherry seed beads
- 1 silver seed bead
- 3 white seed beads
- 1 silver seed bead
- 5 cornflower seed beads



Step 2Using round nose pliers, turn a loop at the end of the head pin (see Simple Loop Technique).



Step 3 Repeat Steps 1 - 28 times, making a total of 9 bead units.



Step 4

Using wire cutters, cut the cable chain into the following lengths (see Cutting Chain Efficiently Technique):


- 2 2-link lengths 2 4-link lengths
- 2 6-link lengths
- 2 8-link lengths
- 1 10-link length
- 1 21-link length



Step 5

Line your chain lengths up in the following sequence for one earring:


- 1 2-link lengths
- 1 4-link lengths
- 1 6-link lengths
- 1 8-link lengths
- 1 10-link length
- 1 8-link lengths
- 1 6-link lengths
- 1 4-link lengths
- 1 2-link lengths



Step 6

String the following onto 1 eye pin:


- 1 2-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 4-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 6-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 8-link lengths
- 1 10-link length
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 8-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 6-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 4-link lengths
- 1 silver seed bead
- 1 2-link lengths



Step 7Using round nose pliers, turn a loop at the end of the eye pin (see Simple Loop Technique).



Step 8Open the loop on one bead unit made in Step 1, and attach it to the end link of the 2-link chain length. Close the loop.



Step 9Repeat step 8 for each of the chain lengths from step 6.



Step 10Open one end loop of the eye pin from Step 6, and attach one end of the 21-link length of chain. Close the loop.



Step 11Open the second end loop of the eye pin from Step 6, and attach the other end of the 21-link length of chain. Close the loop.



Step 12 Find the middle point of the 21-link length of chain (11 links from the end). Attach a jump ring through that link



Step 13Attach the loop of the earring post to the jump ring from step 12. Close the jump ring.



Step 14 Repeat Steps 1 – 13 for the second earring.
