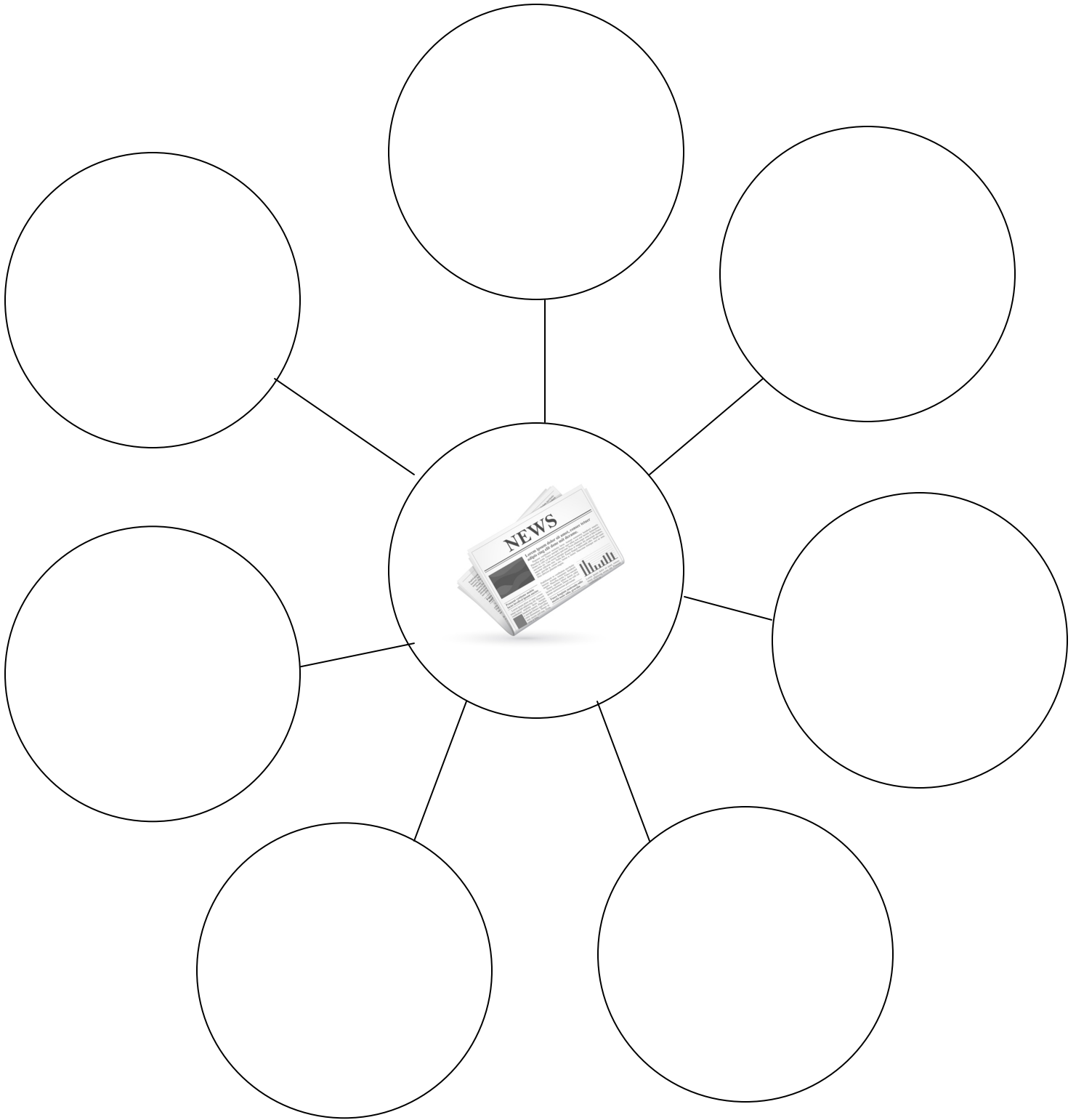

Writing a News Report is as easy as 1-2-3!

Step 1: Start planning

- ✓ Look at the picture – What is happening in this picture?
- ✓ How can you connect the picture to the headline?
- ✓ In your rough notes, answer some or all of the following questions:
 - ✓ Who?
 - ✓ When?
 - ✓ What?
 - ✓ Why?
 - ✓ Where?
 - ✓ How?
- ✓ Then add:
 - ✓ Quotes
 - ✓ More information
- ✓ Think of a catchy lead paragraph

Step 2: Create a story!

- ✓ Write a byline
- ✓ Create a placeline
- ✓ Create a catchy lead paragraph
- ✓ Write in the 3rd person
- ✓ Write the body (1-3 paragraphs)
- ✓ Be ensure to include a quotation
- ✓ Print neatly and legibly
