### Scripture Reflection

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

Slowly read aloud this passage from The Gospel of John Chapter 14 23 - 24

23 Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. 24 Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

In this Gospel verse we see the link between obeying and following Jesus and how this leads to the Father and the Son making a 'home' within a person. What implications do you see here for the way a 'home' environment might come into existence in your Catholic school?
