PART 1

Scripture Reflection

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

Slowly read aloud this passage from The Gospel of John Chapter 19 26 - 27

"When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home."

Questions For Group Discussion:

How present is the Marian charism in your school community at the moment? In what ways, if any, does the presence of Mary appear?

What might be the potential benefits of a greater Marian presence be for your school community? What practical things could you attempt to make her more visible and known? How might her presence deepen a communal sense of family and of home?
