#### PART 1

### Scripture Reflection

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

Slowly read aloud this passage from The Gospel of Matthew Chapter 13

He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. 32 Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches."

33 He told them still another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds[b] of flour until it worked all through the dough."



## Questions For Group Discussion:

Now, take a few moments in silence and the read it one more time.

This parable expresses how the seed of the Gospel can work it's way throughout a whole culture or society. How effective do you think your school is at present with regard to helping the Gospel impact the wider world?

What is your sense of the relationship between the Gospel and culture or faith and reason? How do your students see things? As staff, what are some ways you might be able to deepen your own understanding of how the Gospel can impact the culture that surrounds you?
