## STAFF DISCUSSION JOURNAL Going Deeper

#### PART 1

#### **Scripture Reflection**

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

Slowly read aloud this passage from 1 John 4

My dear friends, don't believe everything you hear. Carefully weigh and examine what people tell you. Not everyone who talks about God comes from God. There are a lot of lying preachers loose in the world.

2-3 Here's how you test for the genuine Spirit of God. Everyone who confesses openly his faith in Jesus Christ—the Son of God, who came as an actual flesh-and-blood person—comes from God and belongs to God. And everyone who refuses to confess faith in Jesus has nothing in common with God.

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#### PART 2

Take a moment to read aloud the following quote from The Religious Dimension of Education In a Catholic School n.48

The light of Christian faith stimulates a desire to know the universe as God's creation. It enkindles a love for the truth that will not be satisfied with superficiality in knowledge or judgment. It awakens a critical sense which examines statements rather than accepting them blindly. It impels the mind to learn with careful order and precise methods, and to work with a sense of responsibility.

What could you attempt in your school to help your students learn to 'love the truth'? How can you help them filter and critique some of the messages and beliefs that impact them?

## STAFF PRAYER


Dear Jesus,
