Scripture Reflection

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

Slowly read aloud this passage from 2 Peter 1

His divine power has bestowed on us everything that makes for life and devotion, through the knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and power. Through these, he has bestowed on us the precious and very great promises, so that through them you may come to share in the divine nature, after escaping from the corruption that is in the world because of evil desire.

For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, virtue with knowledge, knowledge with self-control, self-control with endurance, endurance with devotion, devotion with mutual affection, mutual affection with love. If these are yours and increase in abundance, they will keep you from being idle or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.



Now, take a few moments in silence and the read it one more time.

Today's scripture refers to how faith, virtue and knowledge are all vitally interrelated. Is any one of these three elements missing from the way that you educate your students? How can all three be incorporated?

Which of the qualities above is most present and real in your Catholic school community at the current time? Which ones do you feel need more openness to God's grace?

Thank you for making us in your image and for giving us everything that we need for this life.


Help us to perceive you through the eyes of faith and reason. Help us to see the world as it is, created by a wonderful and omnipotent Creator.
