How may God be present in this situation with a difficult student? Despite the challenges is there an invitation to something as well?

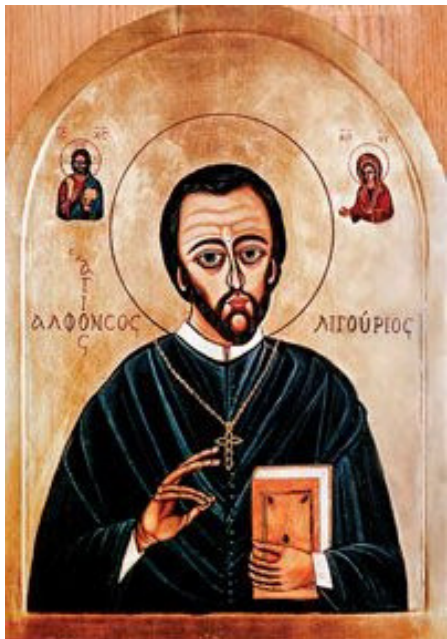
