Try and find a quiet place such as the school chapel and, after watching the video, capture your thoughts on the following questions:

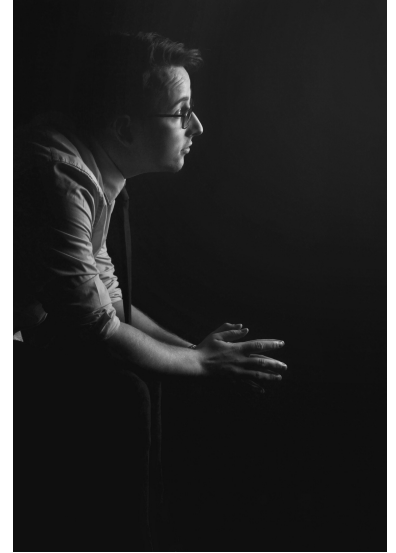
Q# 1
