## Scripture Reflection

STEP ONE

As a staff, take a few moments to sit in total silence. Silence is a rare commodity and central to how God speaks with us.

STEP TWO

After some time in silence, have one person read the following scripture aloud:

### A Reading from The Gospel of Luke Chapter 6 v27 - 31

"But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, 28 bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. 29 If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them. 30 Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. 31 Do to others as you would have them do to you.

Now, take a few moments in silence and then read it one more time.

#### QUESTION ONE

How does the idea of doing unto others as you would have them do unto you relate to helping students develop an authentic Catholic social conscience?

#### QUESTION TWO

How authentically is the concept of 'doing unto others' lived out in your school community? What systems, beliefs, rituals or processes embed this way of living in your daily interactions within the school?
