DEVELOPING A STRATEGY FOR FAMILY MINISTRY

- Partnering with parents in the church or energizing your family's spiritual life
- All studies show that the most powerful force in a young person's life is their family
- Three phrases on my desk in my office:
 - When you reach the family, you reach the world...
 - One of the purposes of the church is to mentor parents, parents mentor their children and the legacy of faith continues to the next generation...
 - *“Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me does not just welcome me but the one who sent me.”*
Mark 9:37

IT'S NOT A PROGRAM...IT'S A MINDSET

The Shema: Deuteronomy 6:4-9

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.

These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children.

Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates."

- Faithfulness and fidelity to God (loyalty to God)
- How we transmit faith and love (through the family)
- How we keep a constant mindfulness of the teachings and presence of God

The Jewish leaders were testing Jesus: Matthew 22:35-40

"An expert in the law, tested him (Jesus) with this question: 'Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?'

Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.'"

Jesus Creed: Love the Lord your God with all your heart...and love your neighbor as yourself.


- It means more work... already too busy




