CONNECTION POINT:

God is glorified when we live with Christ-centered purpose.

THE BIBLE MEETS

LIFE: Everything we do—no matter how small or seemingly insignificant it may seem to us—is to be for God’s glory. When we live in obedience to Him, serving and living in the purpose He has given us, we will bring glory to Him.

LIVE IT OUT: Your student has been encouraged to take practical steps to live out his or her faith.

PRESCHOOL

Scripture: Exodus 3:1–4:17

Live It Out: Review the Bible story. Say that God loved the people and heard their prayers to Him. Remind your child that God loves him and cares about what happens to him.

Moses was caring for his father-in-law’s sheep. He was in the wilderness by a mountain.

Moses saw a bush on fire, but the bush did not burn up! Moses moved closer so he could see the bush better. God spoke to Moses from the bush. “Moses, take off your sandals because this is a special place.” Moses hid his face because he was afraid to look at God.

God told Moses about His plans to save the Israelite people from their slavery in Egypt.

God said, “Moses, I am sending you to talk to Pharaoh. You can lead the people out of Egypt.” Moses did not think he could lead the people. God said, “Tell the people that I am the God of their family—the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. I will be with them.”

God sent Aaron, Moses’ brother to help him. Moses trusted God and obeyed. God was with them and helped them lead the people.

KIDS

Scripture: Exodus 3:1–4:17

Live It Out: Review the Bible story. Say that God did what He said, and we can trust God’s promises. Find references of God’s promises in the Bible.

As Moses tended his father-in-law’s sheep, he saw a burning bush, not being consumed.

God called out to Moses, “Moses, do not come any closer. Remove your sandals, the place where you are standing is holy ground. I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.” Moses hid his face because he was afraid to look at God.

God told Moses to go to the king of Egypt and lead God’s people out of Egypt. Moses argued and gave excuses. God promised Moses that He would be with him.

God instructed Moses to tell the elders what He planned and that Moses was sent by God.

Moses was still worried about approaching the king. He asked God to send someone else, but God told Moses he was the one to lead the people. God sent Moses’ brother, Aaron, with him. God promised Moses that He would help them both know what to do.

STUDENTS

Scripture: Philippians 1:1-11

- How is it possible to choose joy, even during difficult circumstances?
- How can we build close, healthy friendships with people who encourage us in our faith?
- If we are made righteous only in Christ, why is righteous living so important?

Live It Out: God’s purpose for people is that we would be like Jesus. From an earthly perspective, this is impossible, because we all have weaknesses. However, from an eternal perspective, we can know that the Holy Spirit and the Word of God are at work in our lives to shape us more and more into the image of Jesus. May we choose every day to put ourselves in the position that God would be at work in us.

As a family, look up and read Philippians 1:6. Discuss how this passage encourages believers in their walk with Christ, knowing that God won’t stop the work He started in us. Make it a goal to memorize this verse together.
