CONNECTION POINT:

Faith acts with confidence in God.

THE BIBLE MEETS

LIFE: We face challenges and roadblocks, sometimes daily. Some adverse situations are easily overcome, and others lead us to choose a different path. But what do we do when the roadblock seems insurmountable and it's blocking the path we need to walk? We trust God. No roadblock or giant is too much for God, and when we trust Him, He works on our behalf.

LIVE IT OUT: Your student has been encouraged to take practical steps to live out his or her faith.

PRESCHOOL

Scripture: Acts 18:1-4,18-28

Live It Out: Ask your child's teacher to share a picture of your child working in her class. Show the picture to your child at home. Thank your child for working with others at church.

Paul was a missionary who traveled to different towns and told many people about Jesus. While Paul was in the city of Corinth, he met Aquila and Priscilla. Paul told them about Jesus.

Aquila and Priscilla made tents. Paul was a tentmaker, too, so he stayed with Aquila and Priscilla and helped them make tents.

Paul, Aquila, and Priscilla became good friends. When Paul left Corinth, Aquila and Priscilla went with him. They sailed on a boat to a place called Ephesus.

Aquila and Priscilla met a man who loved Jesus. His name was Apollos. They told Apollos things about Jesus that he did not know. They helped Apollos understand more about Jesus.

Apollos was very glad to learn more about Jesus. Apollos traveled to other cities and told people all he had learned about Jesus.

KIDS

Scripture: Acts 18:1-4,18-28

Live It Out: Read John 17:3 with your child. Discuss why this verse is important for helping others know Jesus. Say that she can have an influence by the way she lives her life.

Paul traveled to the city of Corinth, where he met a Aquila and Priscilla. Aquila and Priscilla were tentmakers like Paul. He worked with Aquila and Priscilla. Every Sabbath day, Paul went to the synagogue and tell about Jesus.

Later, Paul sailed to Ephesus with Aquila and Priscilla. Paul left Aquila and Priscilla there. Paul had to leave Ephesus. Paul sad, "I'll come back to you again, if God wills."

Paul left Ephesus and went to Jerusalem. Paul spent time with the believers in the church of Jerusalem, Antioch, Galatia, and Phrygia.

A Jewish man, Apollos, came to Ephesus. Apollos was teaching about Jesus, but he did not know everything about Jesus. Aquila and Priscilla taught Apollos about Jesus' ministry.

Apollos helped those in Achaia by using the Scriptures to show that Jesus is the Messiah.

STUDENTS

Scripture: 1 Samuel 17:3-8,32-37,45-47

- When have you faced a challenge that revealed a weakness in your life?
- Why is it so important to remember how God has worked in the past?
- Why is it appropriate to see Goliath, and not David, as the underdog?

Live It Out: When we face adversity, we might not naturally be confident about how things will turn out. However, because God is all powerful and because He has promised to take care of us, we can live boldly and with confidence, even in the face of adversity.

David faced adversity when he challenged Goliath. He said that through his victory over Goliath, though, the nations would learn of Israel's God and the people would know that victory comes from God and not by human strength. We have the opportunity every day to help people around us see these same truths. As a family, commit to following God and living boldly for Him, even in the face of adversity or "giants." Discuss what "giants" your family may be facing and how God may be calling you to act boldly.
