CONNECTION POINT:

There is only one God and only His name deserves glory.

THE BIBLE MEETS

LIFE: People love to debate who is the G.O.A.T.—the Greatest of All Time—in this field or that field. Usually, opinions will vary, but there is One who stands above all others regardless of the field. God Himself is the greatest. Period. We might give applause and accolades to others for their endeavors, but there is only one God and He alone is truly glorious and praiseworthy.

LIVE IT OUT: Your student has been encouraged to take practical steps to live out his or her faith.

PRESCHOOL

Scripture: Exodus 1:22–2:10; Numbers 26:59

Live It Out: Print the verse *God can do all things. Job 42:2* on a sheet of paper. Read and repeat the verse with your child. Provide crayons to outline the letters of the words.

Pharaoh did not want the Israelite baby boys to live. A family hid their baby for 3 months. She could not hide him any longer. She made a basket and covered the outside reeds near the river. The baby's sister, Miriam, stayed near the river to watch her brother.

When Pharaoh's daughter went to the river, she saw the basket. When one of her helpers brought it, she saw the baby boy. He was crying. She felt sorry for him.

Miriam asked her, "Do you want me to get someone to take care of the baby?" "Yes," Pharaoh's daughter said.

Miriam brought her mother. "Take this baby and care for him," Pharaoh's daughter said.

When the child was old enough, he became the son of Pharaoh's daughter. She named him Moses.

KIDS

Scripture: Exodus 1:22–2:10; Numbers 26:59

Live It Out: Review the Bible story. Ask how God showed He is all-knowing and is in control of all things. Explain that God had a plan for Moses, and God's plans cannot change.

Pharaoh ordered all Israelite baby boys be killed. An Israelite couple had a baby boy. They hid him for three months. After that time, she covered a basket with tar and placed her child in the basket. She set it among the reeds near the Nile River. Miriam, his sister, watched nearby.

When Pharaoh's daughter came to the river and noticed the basket. She told her servant to bring the basket to her. Pharaoh's daughter saw the baby crying.

Miriam asked Pharaoh's daughter. "Should I find someone to help care for this boy?"

Pharaoh's daughter told her to go. Miriam brought her mother. The mother cared for the baby until he was old enough to live with Pharaoh's daughter. Pharaoh's daughter named the baby Moses because the name means "drawn out of the water."

STUDENTS

Scripture: Isaiah 42:1-12

- What is the significance of Jesus being the Son of David and the Son of Man?
- Why did Isaiah list the Lord's credentials in this prophecy?
- How does it impact you to know that God is sovereign and will accomplish His purposes?

Live It Out: Philippians 2 teaches that Jesus, though fully God, didn't cling tightly to His position in heaven with all its privileges and power. Instead, He lowered Himself by taking on humanity and going to the cross so that we could be saved. In response to Jesus's humility, God exalted Him to the highest place, giving Jesus the name above all names.

It's important that we remember God's faithfulness to us. Remembering plays an important role in the life of God's people, as we're called continually to remember Jesus and His sacrifice for us. This week, take time to pray together as a family and thank God for His faithfulness. Be specific in the ways He's been faithful to you and your family.
