### CONNECTION POINT:

All people need Jesus as their Savior.

### THE BIBLE MEETS

**LIFE:** In Acts 2, the Holy Spirit filled the believers at Pentecost and Peter stood up to speak to the huge crowd. Peter told them that Jesus died and rose again and that this good news was for everyone. The Holy Spirit didn't just help Peter—He also helps us, too. Jesus came for all people, and we each get the chance to share that. Even if it feels a little scary, God can use us in big ways if we're willing.

**LIVE IT OUT:** Your student has been encouraged to take practical steps to live out his or her faith.

## PRESCHOOL

**Scripture:** Acts 2:1-15,22-24,36-41

**Live It Out:** Help your child say today's Bible verse: "Jesus is the Son of God. John 20:31." Play a game by alternately saying each word with your child.

Peter and the other disciples of Jesus were together in a room. They heard a sound like a strong wind. The disciples began to speak in different languages.

People gathered outside after hearing the sound. They were surprised that the disciples could speak in many languages and they could understand them.

Peter stood up and talked to all the people. "Listen to me," Peter said. "God did this. God sent His Son, Jesus. Jesus did many miracles. He died but now is alive."

Many people listened to the message that Peter spoke that day. "What should we do?" the people asked.

Peter told them to start making right choices and to learn more about God's Son, Jesus. Three thousand people believed what Peter said and were baptized.

## KIDS

**Scripture:** Acts 2:1-15,22-24,36-41

**Live It Out:** The church began and helped spread the good news of Jesus throughout the world. Talk about ways your child can help spread the good news about Jesus.

On Pentecost, Jesus' followers were together in a house. Suddenly, a sound like wind came from heaven and filled the house. The Holy Spirit came to the believers like fiery flames. The disciples were able to speak in different languages. Travelers from all over were in the city for Pentecost. The people each heard the disciples speaking in his own language.

Peter stood up and began to preach the good news of Jesus. He told them about Jesus' sacrifice on the cross for the sins of all people.

The people asked, "What should we do?" Peter said, "Confess your sins, repent, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. You will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Those who believed Jesus was the Savior and were baptized. That day about three thousand people were added to the believers and formed the first church.

## STUDENTS

**Scripture:** Acts 2:1-12,22-24,36-41

- Have you ever felt like God was nudging you to speak up or do something, but you hesitated? What happened?
- How does surrendering to Jesus look different than simply believing in Him?
- Why do you think feeling convicted can be such a big part of changing how someone lives?

### Live It Out:

With your student, discuss what surrender to Jesus looks like in his or her life. We live in a world where our belief and surrender need to be followed by our actions. Remind your student that all people—no matter their background, social status, or what people think of them—need Jesus and His love.
